confusion, disagreement and petty arguments.

Jos. L. Stacey, chairman of the Committee on Public Safety opened the probe by interviews with supporters of both sides, civic leaders, and Clarke Irvine, editor-publisher of the Sun.

The investigation was started upon complaints of citizens, Stacy told the Sun. 'We don't take sides, but investigate to find out details to protect property owners. It doesn't look like the facts and figures of costs, assessments and so on have been properly aired'.

On Tuesday, Nov. 17, Alpine will go to the polls and say yes or no to the annexation of all the community 8000 acres, to the Alpine Heights MWD.

If the vote is yes, it means that a blank check has been given to the heights group, for the ballot reads: 'subject to the terms and conditions fixed by the board of directors of said Alpine Heights' MWD.

If it fails, then taxpayer-voters in greater Alpine, will not have more added to their already top-heavy tax rate of \$6.62, more if in the sewer district.

The best line of thinking seems to be to block annexation, then revamp the original East County MWD into a tight dis-

trict for the community, with home rule and no second-hand pipes or unrevealed costs. The Heights engineers have disclosed no costs. And water will not be brought to your front door.

Several mailing pieces have been sent out by proponents of annexation, also from others.

The latest, in the mail Wednesday, briefly recounts how the Heights district was formed and that 'Meanwhile a group in the heights area decided that they wanted no part of a water district. In an effort to cooperate the East County group excluded them. Legal maneuvering ensued. The heights group emerged with the identity of a legal water district and the avowed intention of trying to obtain Colorado River water. Their only chance was through Rio San Diego MWD and then only provided they could annex all of Alpine.'

'A group in charge of a water district can become very powerful over the area within its boundaries, and can obligate its property owners, without their specific consent, to the spending of enormous sums in the interest of obtaining water, without ever delivering a drop of water to the area paying the cost.

'We believe that if Alpine is ready to go into debt to the extent that our taxes could be doubled, the voters of Alpine should do three things:

'1. Go to the polls on Nov. 17th and defeat the attempt on the part of a few heights residents to control our water destiny, and plunge us at their will into commitments and debts.

'2. Take an immediate interest in organizing a town council, a board of governors, or other responsible group representative of all Alpine for the purpose of setting up necessary safeguards and making adequate studies of all the problems incidental to bringing water to our homes and properties.

These signed the paper, Clarence Stearns, Grady Watton, John Jones, Louis Landt, Malcolm Huey, Mrs. Paul Black, Frank O'Neill, Fred Rushing, John Reynolds, Al Hinkle, Jack Holstad, Fred Rohr, and A.J. Cesario.

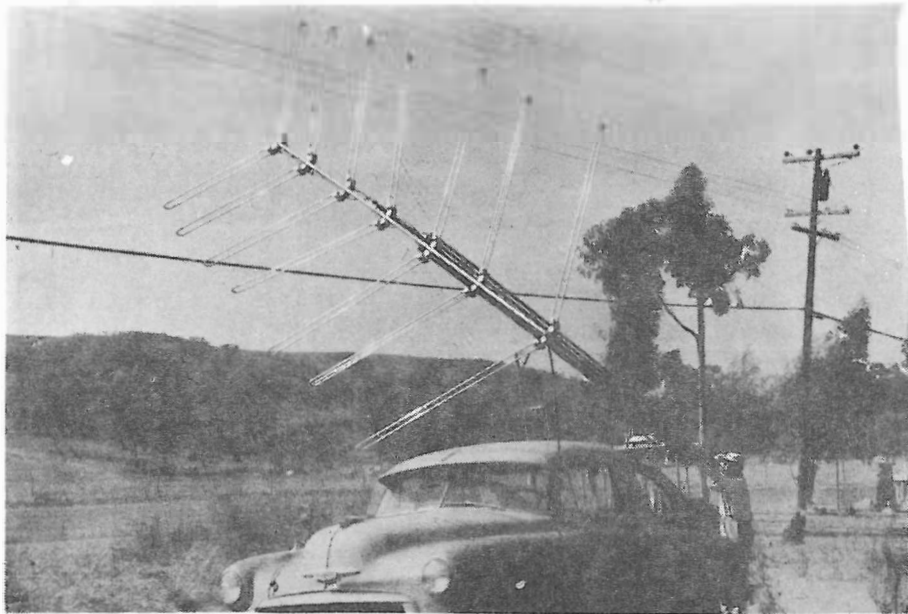

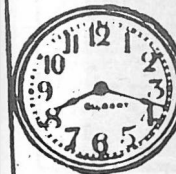
