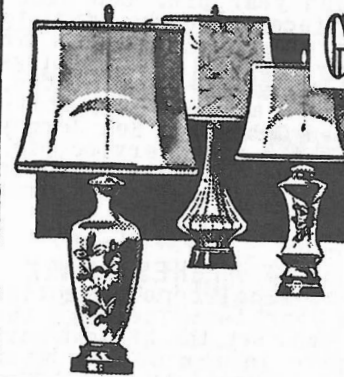

DOINGS OF CUB SCOUTS

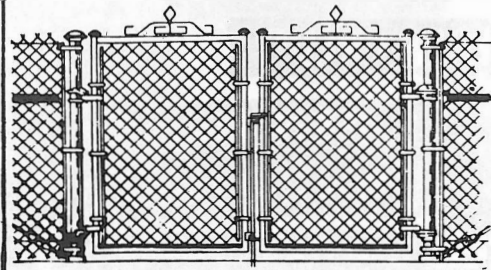

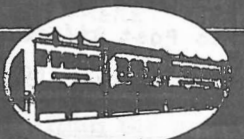

NO FARM CENSUS HERE

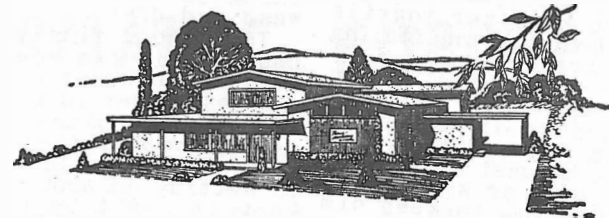

LAND BRINGS TOP PRICE

Raw land sales in and around Alpine during the last few weeks have sparked prices to an all time top, and the end is not in sight.

The high price of \$1,402,500., indicated by revenue stamps, was paid Peter and Betty Marston of Marston Cattle Co., Blossom Valley, for 1130 acres in the area recently voting for Colorado water. Buyers were W.W. Mast and Harold Berns, Beverly Hills developers. It is believed this site will be made a subdivision in the future.

The new owners developed the Fanita Ranch, Santee, several years ago, paying \$1 million. Today it is the famous growing Carlton Hills Estates, where 3000 homes are being erected.

In EC over 11 acres on Johnson Ave between Oak and Magnolia were sold for \$144,000 for industry in this fast growing area where the freeway will soon deliver traffic across the valley.

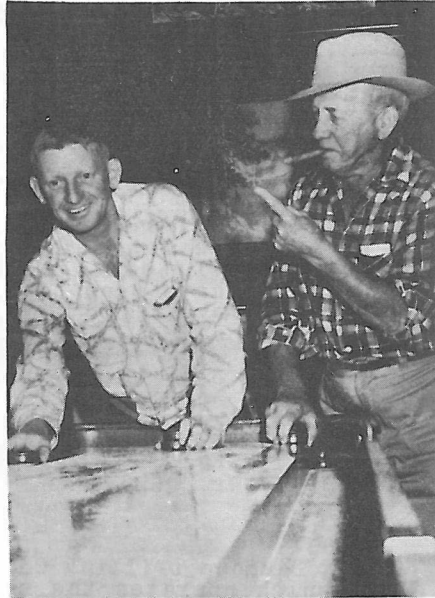

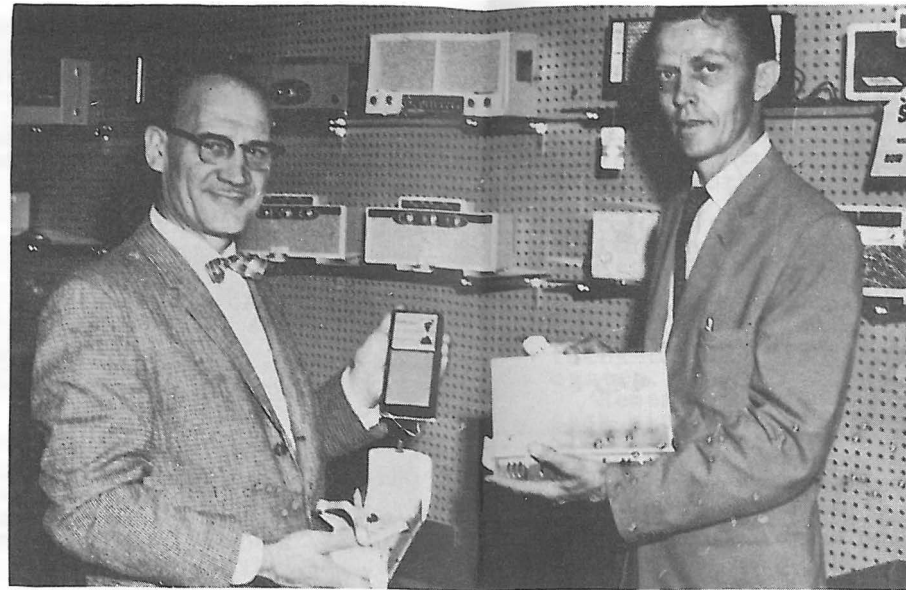

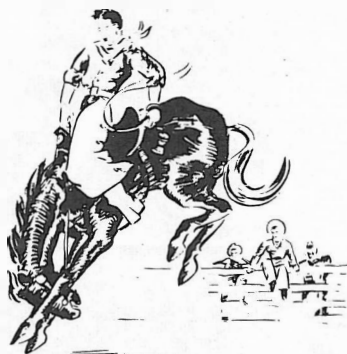

DAIRYMEN GIVE PRESS PARTY

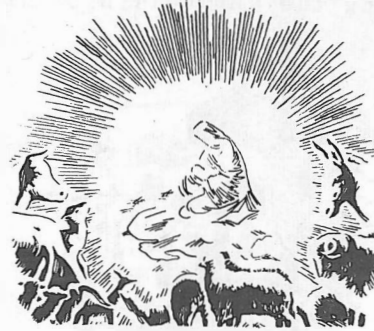
