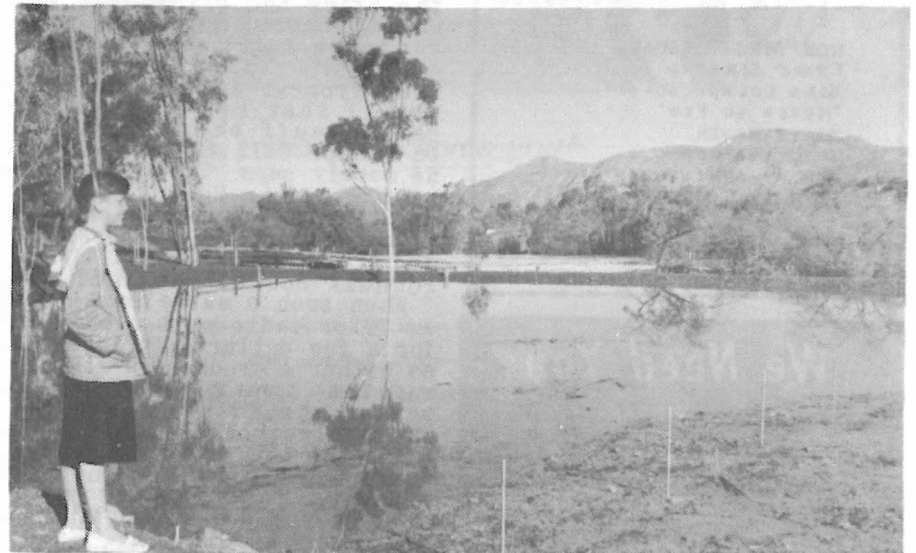

When such a marvelous medium as TV or radio puts a hand out for a few dollars, it is acting as either a crook or a flunkey, and that type of executive or worker should be eliminated. These electronic machines can give the world inspiration, beauty, spiritual values and all the good things we so urgently need to make it a better world. -CI

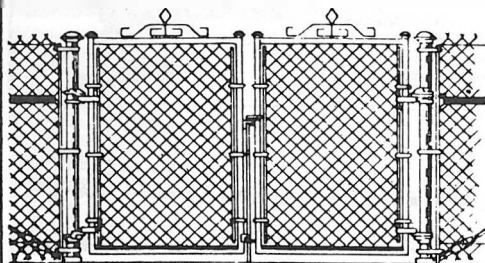
DIMES DANCE SATURDAY
