



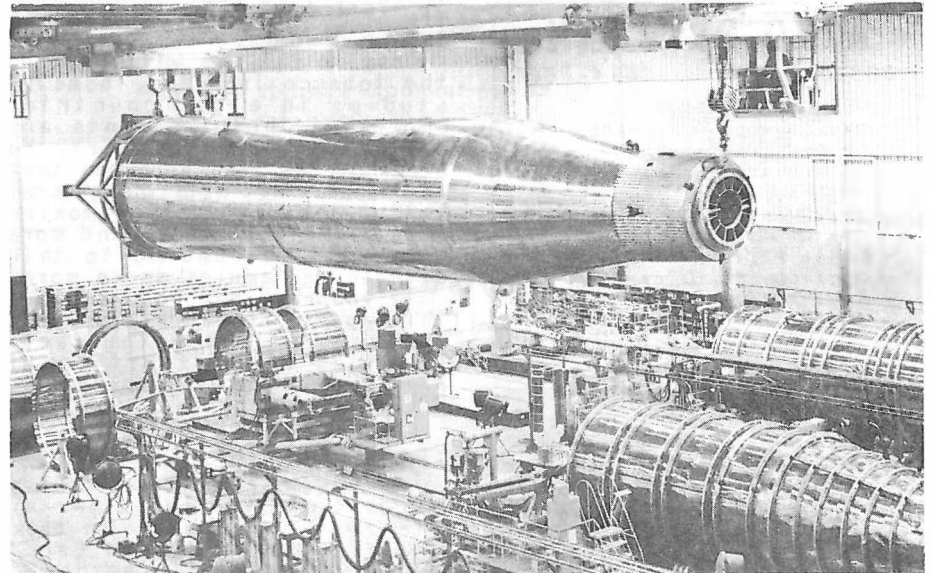

While considerable criticism has been directed toward Secretary Fleming of the US Department of Health, Education and Welfare, we are heartily in favor of his courageous action in protecting the American public against the use of harmful additives and preservatives in our foods.

Perhaps it might be well for health protection to get in a bit of legislation against a leading cause of cancer mortality in men-- cigarette smoking. The yearly number of deaths for men is six times more than 20 years ago, the most rapid rise ever shown for a noninfectious disease. This year 36,000 will die of lung cancer; 31,000 men and 5000 women.

Despite all the whitewash by the tobacco industry, some 23 studies in eight countries show that these patients are mostly cigarette smokers. No evidence has been produced that is inconsistent with the general belief that excessive smoking is a principal cause. And more women are succumbing to this disease as females smoke more.

If you have any doubts about this appalling deathrate, just get some enlightening facts from the nearest office of American Cancer Society.-

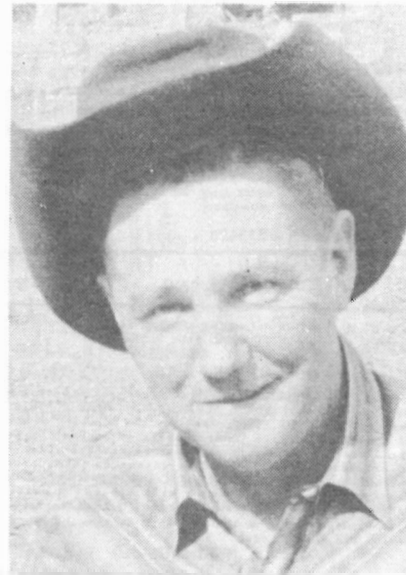

Dr. Rhine Talks on ESP

While the world is avidly learning of outer space, some men are trying to ascertain something about man's inner space-- the mind and soul.

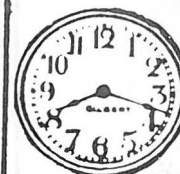
