county, city, is racking its brains to find more ways to tax the people. Even if the tax income were to be doubled, they would spend it all and yell for more!

Today in California every boatowner is having to cough up \$5. to the motor vehicle office or pay penalties. There are 13,500 such owners who will pay \$67,500. just for the privilege of using the water! Motor car taxes go for roads which all use, but most boats use only docks for which they pay well. If he brings his boat home, he pays tax on the trailer. To own a boat or car you must pay sales tax, then gas tax for operation on top of perhaps a hundred hidden taxes along the line manufacture, sales, repair and so on.

Many tax monies are returned to the source country as motor car and such. Liquor license taxes, for example, from March 1, last year to Aug. 31, returned \$166,130. to SD County and the unincorporated areas were allowed \$24,951. But, Alpine being county territory, gets ~~how~~ much nobody knows.

If this community were incorporated, and we believe that it will be at least 10 years before it is ready in size and citizenship, it would get a share of this money. It would then also receive many other portions of returnable tax funds such as sales tax and others which all pay in Alpine, but now get nothing for it.

But the crux of the tax bite is just ahead and you may rest assured that no part of government will have a part in tax reduction! Mark this, taxes will keep on rising

## Young Newsmen Enjoy Annual 'Day in Navy'

When on such a grand trip as the Navy gave us Friday I wish we had more space than we have in this tiniest newspaper!

The day had a threefold thrill for me-- ex-navy, being a pilot, and the company of a bunch of live young journalists, on top of that the splendid hospitality of officers and men of the Benn, as they call her.

We spent the night at Naval training center, with dinner, movies, talks, slides and a quizz

period which all enjoyed. Up at 5:30 and breakfast with the sailors, then on a motor launch out to the flattop.

My group had Edw. Wilson, pipefitter 3c as guide and he gave us a fine tour, including snacks, java, lunch and all. I got to go into the tower, saw Cdr. W.R. McClendon, air officer, a cordial Texan from Dallas, direct helicopters do a man overboard rescue-- thrilling, too-- and other things. Their term for a chopper is angel, but on radiophone it's loose-foot! Benn is Big Boy Tower!

We had a press conference in the wardroom, opened by the skipper, French Wampler, jr., Captain, USN, a Tennessee who exudes real Southern hospitality with all running a military craft. He is a much-decorated pilot, did terrific work in WW2.

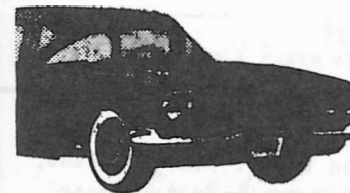

**Recall Old Cemetery**

Most Alpiners do not know that there are two burial places here, but the original one has recently been overhauled and a nice white fence put around it. It was on land owned in the '90's by Louise Willett, great aunt of Mrs. Lena A. Williams, of Foss Road, herself a pioneer.

"There was no cemetery in Alpine" she recalls, in telling the Sun, "so my aunt allowed that plot to be used. A Mrs. Pontius was the first one buried there somewhere about 1895. They had markers, but a fire went through and all were destroyed".

It was called Mt. Pisgah Cemetery, named by the owner who used to climb the hill and look over the landscape and down on the fogs, she explains. Mt. Pisgah, the Bible tells, is the summit from where Moses viewed the Promised Land.

The new fence (see photo) was recently built by E.L. Freeland, manager, Alpine Heights MWD, who bought land adjacent and back of his Willow Glen Farm where he raises blooded dogs. There are presently 14 mounds, but Mrs. Williams says there were more, including several for infants.

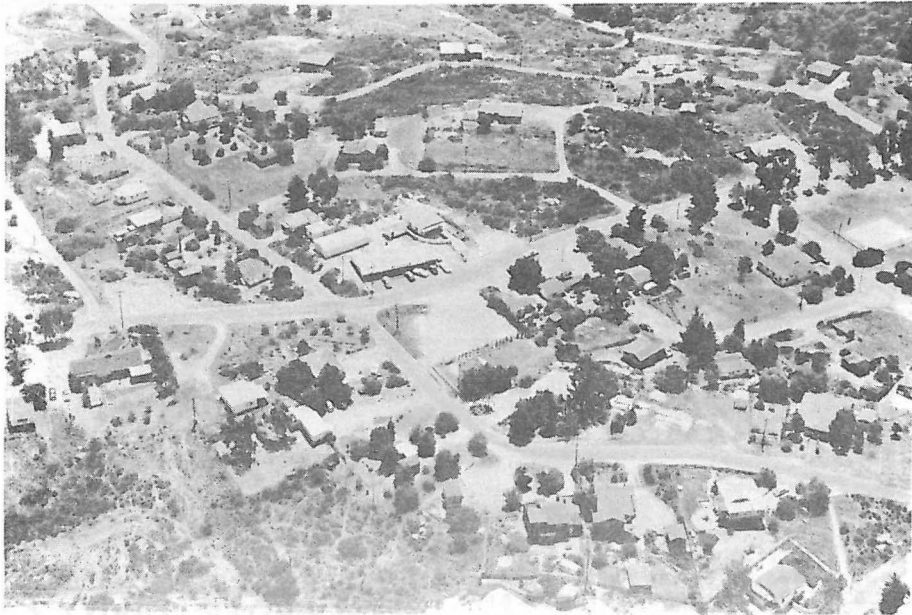

**Why Underfed Children?**

A shocking situation exists in this county where nearly 1600 children are undernourished and should receive free school lunches, the Community Welfare Council reveals.

"With each passing day", says the Rev. Wm. MacInness, chairman, council's School Lunch Committee, "the situation grows more serious because of increasing unemployment".

A survey shows that 343 youngsters, whose parents are eligible and receiving assistance from the welfare office, are given necessary lunches, leaving 1239 still hungry. Estimated cost is \$40,000, too much for any one body to pay for.

Note- During the war folks raised vegetables, eating plain cheap wheat berries-- far more nourishing than blown up cereals, and in previous times it has been proved that man can survive without meat and other costlier foods. Perhaps it might help children to get out and make a garden. One the size of a breakfast nook will supply a family with many vegetables rich in much needed vitamins and minerals.

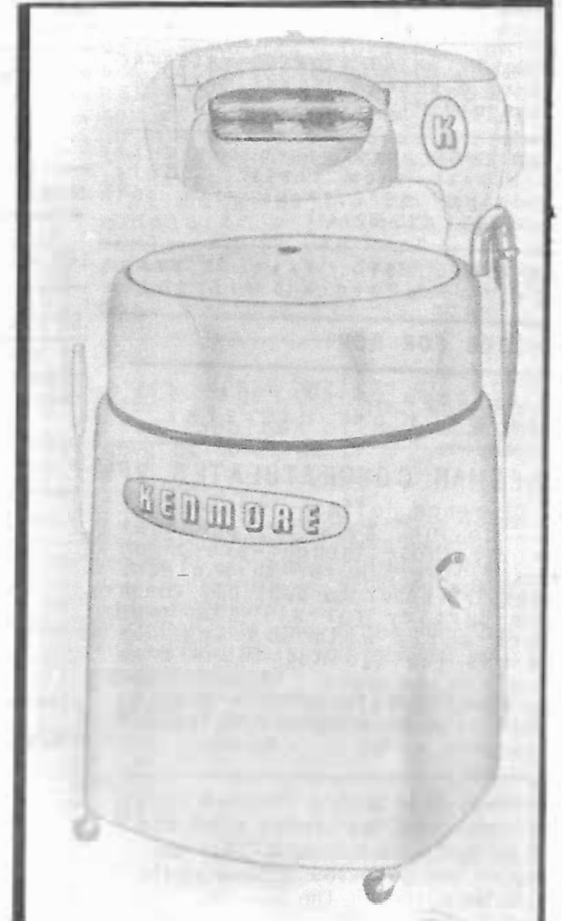
