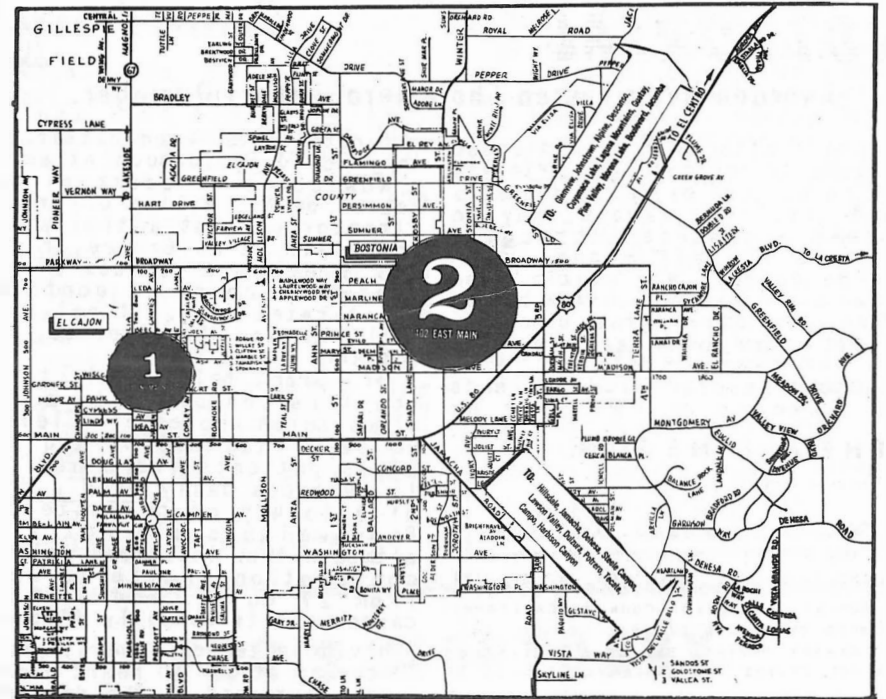
Judging has also been set, McClure adds:

# EDITORIAL

## Avocado Helps Lessen Cholesterol, Heart Damager.

Heart attacks due to disease caused by the coronary artery's being clogged by fatty deposits and resulting damage, may be greatly lessened through a simple dietary means!

The danger is a sticky substance cholesterol in the blood. When it exists in great quantity, likelihood of heart seizure is increased. For some years doctors have advised patients to take no animal fats or

saturated fats, even butter, if they would avoid such attacks.

Now comes report on research by Dr. Wilson C. Grant, director of that activity, VA Hospital, Coral Gables, Fla., who reveals the virtues of the avocado because it contains unsaturated fats. It not only fails to clog the arteries, but actually clears them.

Dr. Grant believes that the fruit is conducive to a low blood serum cholesterol level. He says that 50% of a group of 16 patients fed a half to 1½ avocados daily had a drop of 8 to 42% of cholesterol. Body weights did not rise although they increased calorie consumption! Patients were from 27 to 73, and in some cases weights actually dropped.

Having attended several press luncheons of our SD heart group, I was impressed by the doctors' admonition to eat no butter, no meat fats, and so on. For many years I have eschewed these fats, and last September I passed my pilot's physical examination without a flutter.

Quite a few years ago when avocados were new and not appreciated as a real food, I walked from San Diego to LA eating only this fruit, making the 122 miles in six days just to prove for the association that avocados are not a luxury but a highly very energizing food. After the six days I never felt better. -Cl.

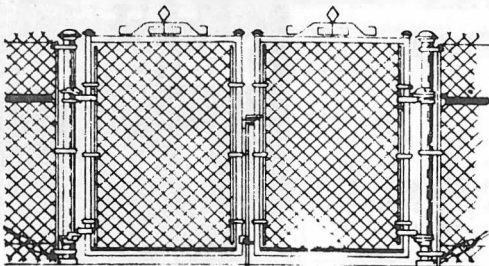

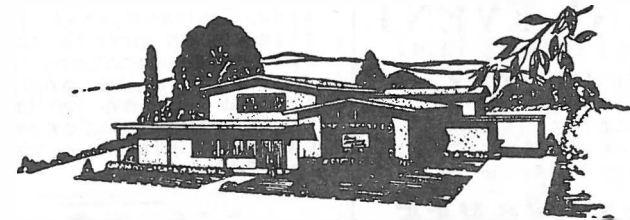

## Scout Fair June 4

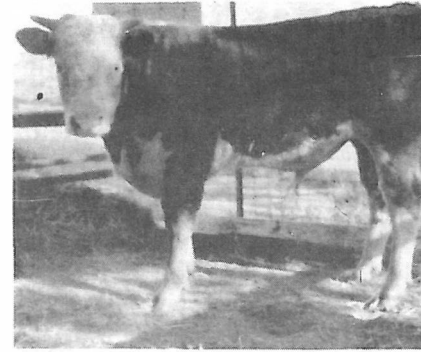
Scouting's biggest event in the county is slated for Saturday, June 4, probably at Aztec Bowl. SD State, says

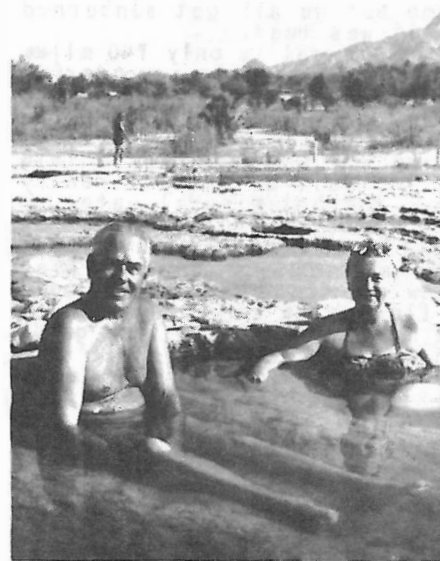

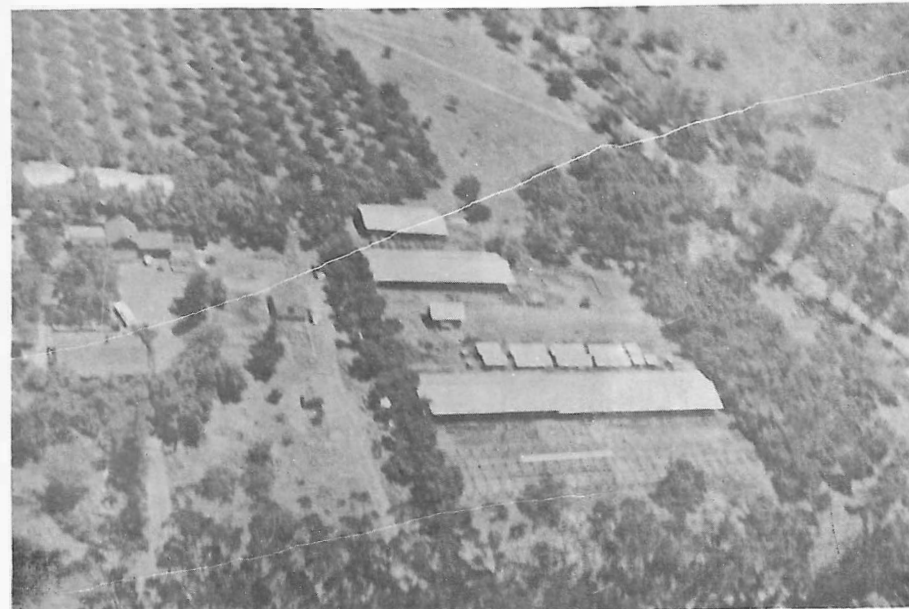

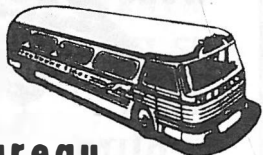
