of Lawrence Jarrett, will make its first public bow with 30 pieces, all enthused young players who have been diligently working at home and after school.

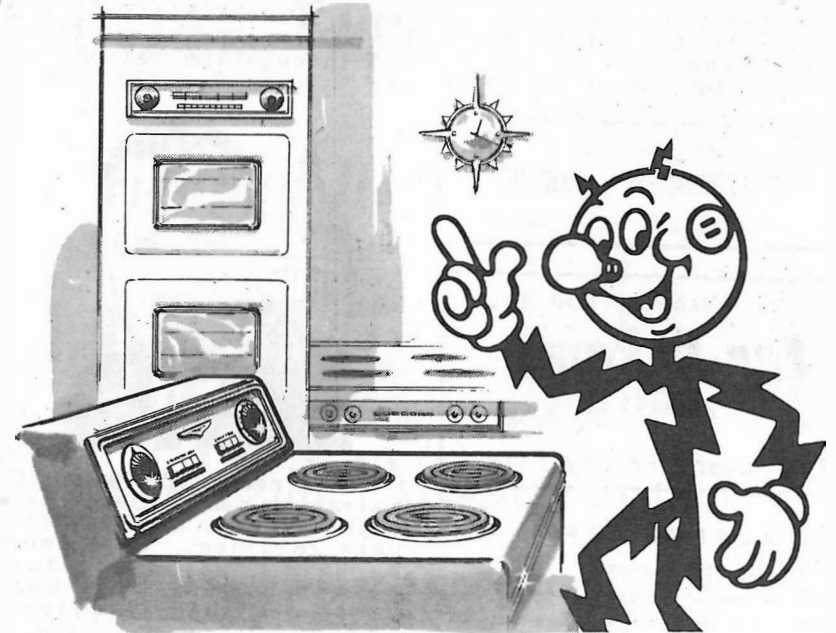
Second feature is the Elementary School Chorus under direction of Mrs. Hazel Hohanshelt, early local teacher and noted for her fine work with the choir.



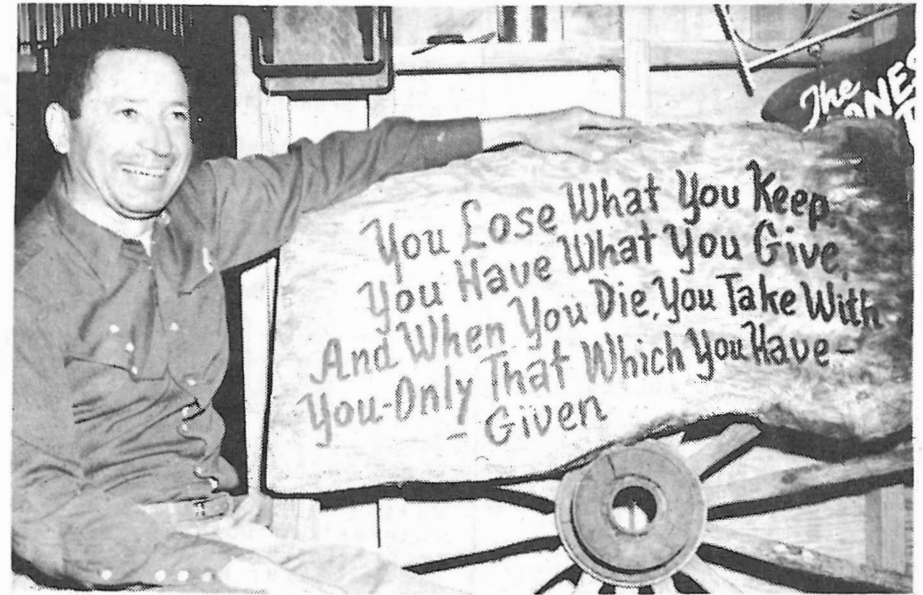

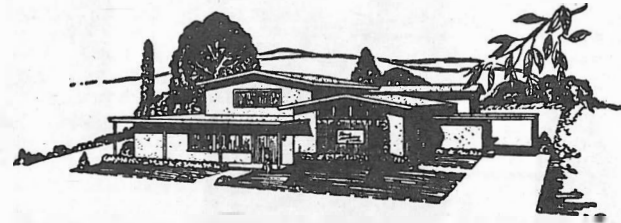

Al Hinkle, who had surgery some weeks ago with a relapse and trouble with his feet, is now just about recovered and is on the job at his lumberyard.

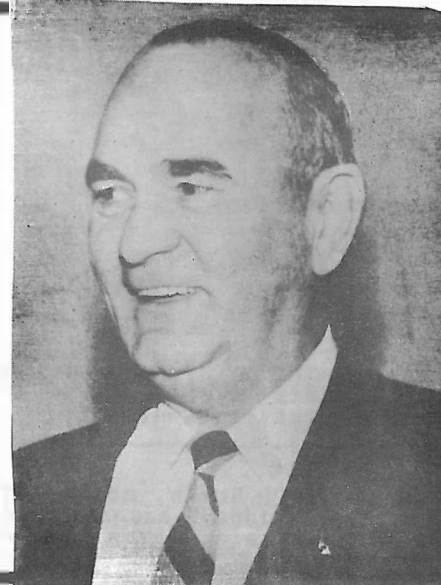
START AIR MAPPING SOON

Is for Night Court

So citizens would not lose time from their work and be certain of a speedy trial, T.T. Crittenden, candidate for judge of EC Municipal Court, urges voters to cast their ballot Tuesday as election of all nonpartisan officers is determined by votes cast at the primary.

"I advocate establishment of a night court to handle traffic and minor matters" he declares, "thus people would save time and trouble". 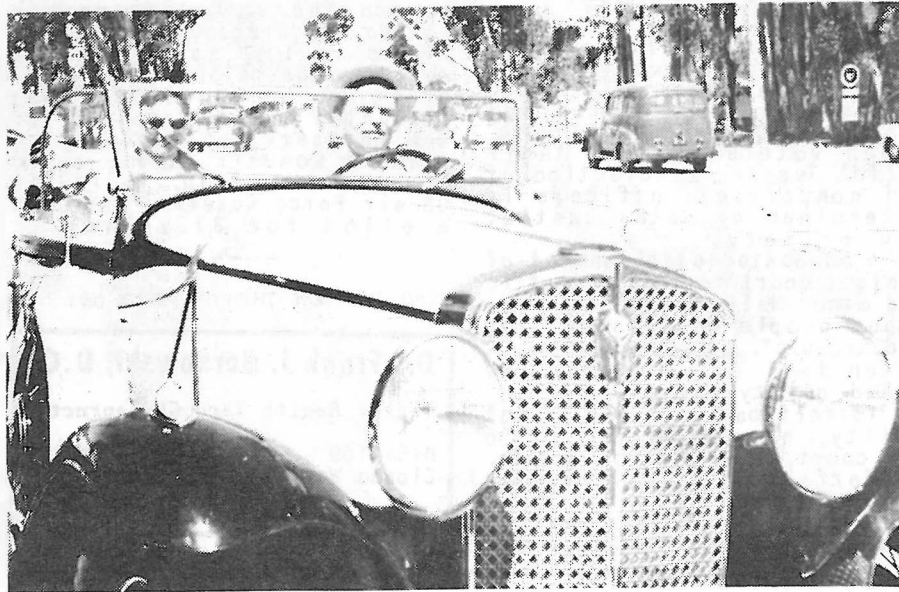

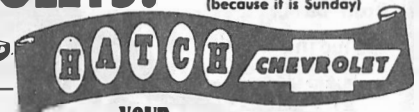

man, Irving C. Veal, former deputy assessor who with three staffers, agreed to do it for a maximum of \$6,000, saving \$19,000.

Details on this was told in a letter of May 23, to the three areas; Alpine, Mt. Top and Harbison Canyon. "The board and constituents have been very unhappy over this delay" he avers. He adds that Assessor McQuilken is co-operating by not microfilming these districts as Veal can work faster from paper records.

After Veal files the certificate, the SD & Metro people will figure costs then report back, publish notices of hearings, and if no majority objects, date will be set for an election, which must be before Nov. 1, or there will be no entitlement to Colorado water.

"Today's big question" says Price "is getting entitlement, using East County MWD's boundaries, figures and plans at a reasonable cost." He said that Byrl Phelps' data could be obtained for a reasonable price and it would save time.

He explained that in drawing plans for the Flinn Springs area "our engineers have laid out transmission lines and reservoir to the 2000' level so that water could be brought to the 2000' level in Alpine. We will be responsible for lines to your areas, but distribution pipes must be decided by your people".

When pinned down to a date when Alpine might get water, Price said "We are pushing this as rapidly as possible, but I just can't make a wild guess". He added that it is "reasonable to suppose, as history shows, that transmission lines could be in within 18 months after bonds are voted. I feel confident that the three areas will pass the bonds".

These areas have advanced \$2000. and the Fletcher people \$600. to pay for preliminaries, he concluded.

Note- While a few seem to resent present status of this water district, we believe the majority are united to get water into Alpine. We do have a legal, organized, financed district working for water, and it should be pushed through with unity. Perhaps if the district dropped the Heights part, making it Alpine MWD, it would help to unify people. Price agreed with this observation. -Cl.

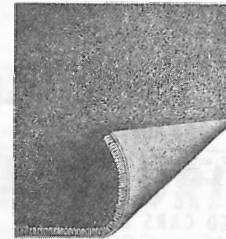

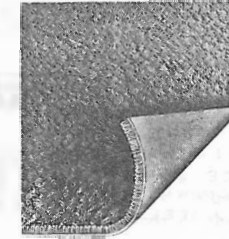

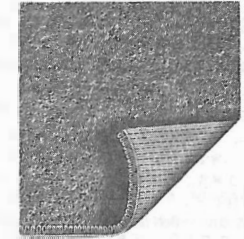
