Build Nursing Home

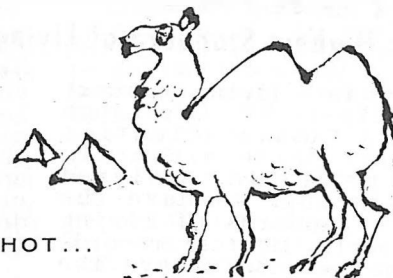
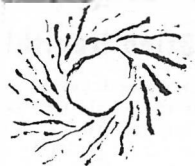

America is a living paradox! Recently in NY, Dr. Linus Pauling, famous scientist and Nobel Prize winner in chemistry (1954), declared that, although we have the highest standards of living in the world, medical records show that we don't have the best health.

He told this to a graduating class at Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Yeshiva University, that Americans could add 10 years to their lives if they lived right, stopped smoking and had better care.

He could well have added drinking, drugging and eating wrong foods. Also overeating and living at a high tension.

Other things that are slowly and insidiously undermining health is the growing use of all manner of preserved, chemically treated, refined and emasculated foods. Also chlorinated and fluoridated drinking water-- forced medication.

For example, good old shredded wheat used to be a real food, but today manufacturers of that and many other items, including sliced meats and so on, use dangerous chemicals. While the US demands that makers put on the label what a product contains, nothing is mentioned of their deleterious effects.

Added vitamins and minerals, although often synthetic, are not as bad as such chemicals for instance, as the label on Nabisco Juniors, a whole wheat product reveals "to which butylated hydroxyanisole and citric acid in propylene glycol (chemical preservatives) have been added to help maintain freshness".

Recently in LA a cancer society report showed that one of every three high school students in America is a regular cigarette smoker. The number among teenagers increases from 21% at freshman level to 44% for seniors, when 4320 students were queried. An influence factor shown was habits of parents, which were reflected in the offspring's smoking habits. All this makes something for young Americans to think about.-CI

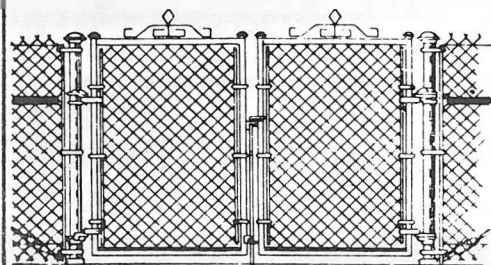

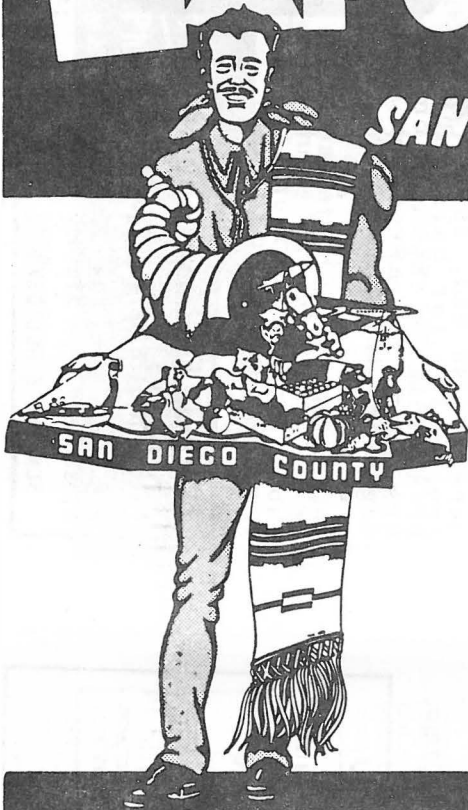

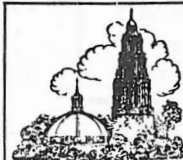

"On Aug. 9, they will set a figure for back taxes to be paid" he says, "Then on the 11th, SD County Water Authority sets their figure for back taxes, and on the 23rd, Rio will hold a hearing. Then the election will be on Sept. 27".

On Oct. 11 ballots will be canvassed, and if absentee votes are in by election day, it will be completed earlier. Then the secretary of state certifies the election so the county group can act before the Nov. 1 deadline.

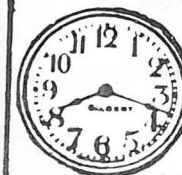
