Schrade for Water

In a personal letter to the Sun, Jack Schrader of the 80th District, urges everyone to get behind the big water act that will insure a supply for the Southland.

The recent ruling of the courts puts California's use of Colorado water in jeopardy, because we are using well over 90% of this water for our needs today. I am taking this means to point out the serious position in which southern California, and particularly San Diego County, finds itself.

Having been your State Assemblyman for the past six years taught me that we must be prepared to meet the economic growth of our state. My 18 years experience in water problems proves to me that we should all work for, and encourage our neighbors to support the 1-3/4 Billion Dollar Bond Issue that will appear on the November ballot.

Note- Please see editorial, Page 4. We cannot too strongly urge every voter to work for this proposition. Alpine will vote September 27 for annexation to Rio, to get pipelines and a supply of water, but the big problem is-- where will water come from in future years? We not only must have more water, but we must learn to save it more than we do today. -CI

At a press preview in the Fox Loma Theatre we had the opportunity of enjoying one



of the most entertaining biblical pictures we have ever seen, "The Story of Ruth", that beautiful tale of faith and love so well known to every student of the Bible. It opens at the Fox Theatre in SD this Sunday.

As a whole the film lacks nothing. It is from 20th Century Fox Studios, product of Samuel G. Engel, who made "A Man Called Peter", was directed by Henry Kostér who did "The Robe". Its scenic and dramatic grandeur is extended by Cinemascope and of course given living color by De Luxe. The photography is superb, with gorgeous lighting and effects, but not sufficient to detract from the intense drama.

EDITORIAL

Getting, Saving Water is State's Most Urgent Need!

Southern California's most pressing problem is water. If you missed Joe Brooks' feature in the SD Union on it, you are not up on this urgent question.

Gov. Brown has said "We simply cannot let water run out to sea. The economy of our state will suffer a profound loss if it can't get water to meet its needs".

Instead of building costly channels so our rainfall can escape to the ocean, why not build hundreds of small reservoirs, with a network of sluices, pipes, canals, to collect and save more of this precious rainfall?

Brooks pictured an economic

death sentence on SD and the Southland by 1970 or 1980 if we do not develop the huge Feather River project with a \$1 1/2 billion bond issue in November. That will take 10 years to complete. By 1970 the county is slated to have about 1 1/2 million living here!

With no new water, everything could come to a standstill! No new homes, buildings, industry, shipping, agriculture and so forth. The land has suffered a long dry spell, but even with ample rains, this problem still exists.

Places with no water supply rely on rainfall. I have lived in Hawaii, Hong Kong, Australia, and we here could use some of the same means of catching and saving water as they do that comes without cost of pipes and pumping! We need a strong campaign to teach people to conserve the water we have. Daily everyone wastes thousands of gallons that could be saved and used.

If every acre of land were ditched, a settling reservoir built, and the water pumped up to a tank, a season's rainfall would mean thousands of gallons of usable soft water available. I'd like to see the state or federal government institute some experiments along this line. -CI

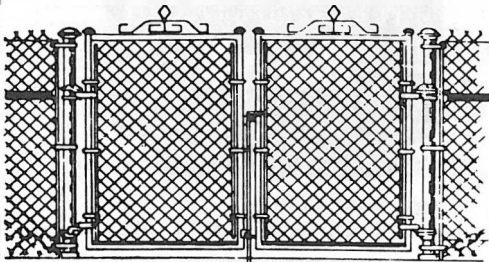

Sandy and Brenda Landers went to Disneyland this week. It was the first time they have ever been there. Their cousins came down and they all went together.

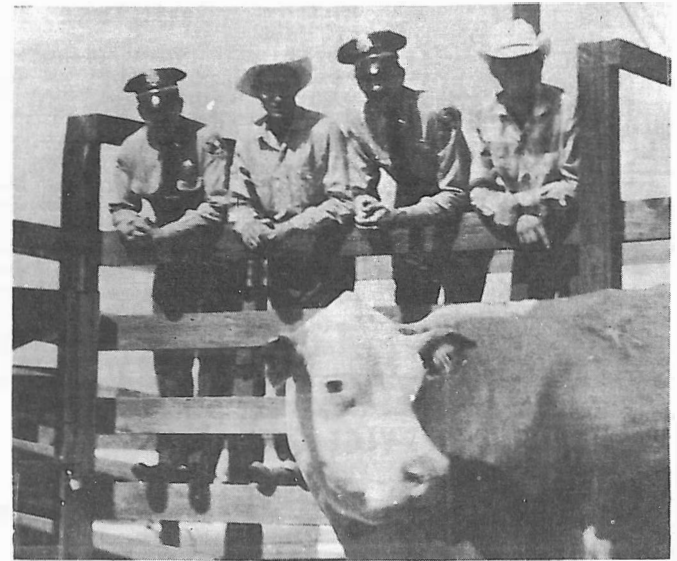

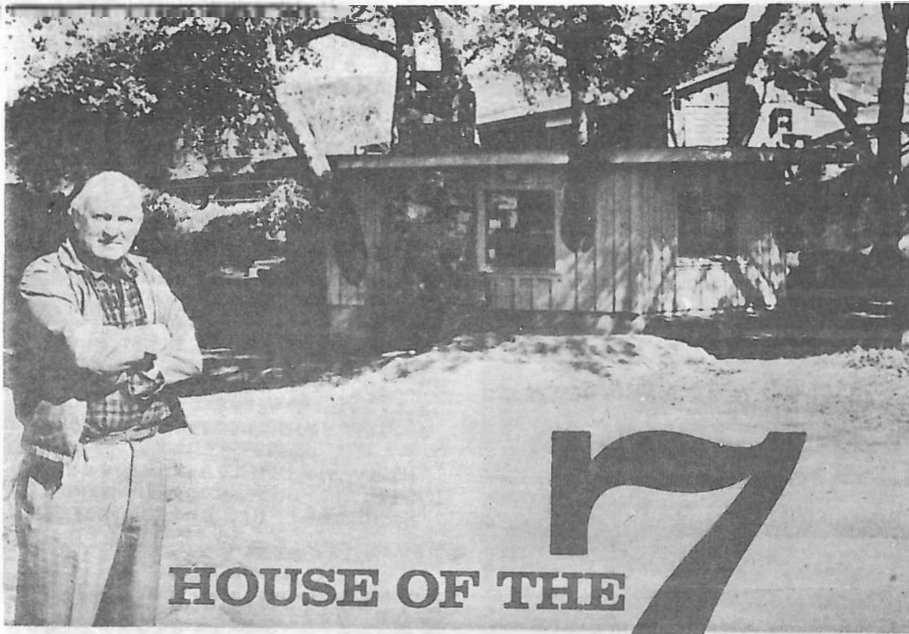
