Trial date was set for Aug. 26, or Oct. 18, with bail at \$262. for John G. Lowe, 2165 Tavern Road, who pleaded inmocent in EC Municipal Court last week on a charge of possessing fighting cocks. He asked for a jury trial.

July 25 the case started with a complaint by a neighbor who told the sheriff she was being kept awake by roosters crowing in Lowe's back yard, and she thought he was raising game cocks. Deputy B. DePriest reported that he saw 15 birds with clipped combs, in single cages, but Mrs. Lowe said they were being raised for show.

Sunday deputies returned, found some birds with clipped combs and spurs trimmed. A warrant was obtained, when they picked up two roosters, brought them in for delivery to the humane office. On their way in, only cardboard separating them, the birds fought, arriving in EC covered with blood, having pecked around the board.

Later officers returned to collect the rest in sacks, Lowe's wife claimed they had flown the coop, so the deputies returned with no further evidence.

Tuesday Lowe voluntarily appeared in court after his wife was notified of the warrant for his arrest, deputies said.



self beyond farther horizons than he knows.

But in the meantime other men are probing the mystery of inner space, the inside of man's mind and soul. Thus it is believed that the body's electromagnetic signals may hold clues to telepathy -mental radio.
