Election Night Showed Vitalizing Effects of Water.

AS soon as it was known that water had been voted for Alpine, an immediate optimism could be felt, and in the days following, a vitalizing effect was noted, not only here, but in SD and EC.

At long last Alpine is to become a living community with water for ample domestic use,

for agriculture, and for beautifying a drab countryside, drab as far as landscaping goes. The reason most have not planted trees, shrubs, flowers, hedges and so on is that old bugaboo of water scarcity.

Also noted is the price of land, some parcels having been taken off the market, and several talked of raising listings since water will be here probably in less than two years.

That happened in every Southland community when it was voted to bring in water. Every area that got water, at once spurted in every way; bloomed; grew; flourished. For years Poway, Ramona, and other districts languished for want of moisture. When water came in, activity started, prices rose and everyone was happy.

The same thing is happening in Alpine and neighboring areas that voted for water. Now let's see how fast we can get it here-.CI

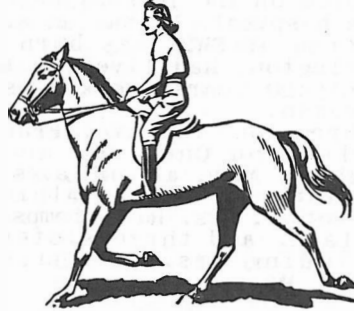
Kids Engineer Two Horseshows

Mail Breaks Record

Like banking, building and population growth, the U.S. Postoffice system has set a new all-time high in mail volume during fiscal year 1960, reports Postmaster Philip G. Hall, in a news release today. Its record even exceeds that of population!

The year's total is 63.3 billion pieces of mail, of which one billion is parcelpost, reflecting a jump of nearly 25% in the past seven years since the 1953 volume was 50.9 billion. In this period postal revenue gained from \$2,091,714,000 to \$3,276,800,000.

In Alpine, the take leaped from \$8,976.41 in 1953 to \$13,683.80 last year. This, and the entire postal service increase, has kept the depart-

ment busy devising ways to do the job more efficiently and more economically, says one official.

"As I recall" he says, "way back in 1953 that was the way President Eisenhower outlined the principal objectives of the service when Postmaster General Arthur E. Summerfield was being sworn in, and that's the way we have been operating ever since".

Recent accomplishments of the service, mirroring the future of speed and efficiency, are these:

Established the first large-scale program of automatic mail handling on a nation wide basis.

Developed the "airlift" program which speeds up the delivery of approximately one letter out of every 17 on a "space available" basis.

Continued development of faster machines for letter and parcelpost sorting, and for mail culling, facing and cancelling.

Continued with plans for a new automatic "postal sub-station" which will vend stamps, envelopes, postcards and writing paper, and which will have money changers for both coins and bills.

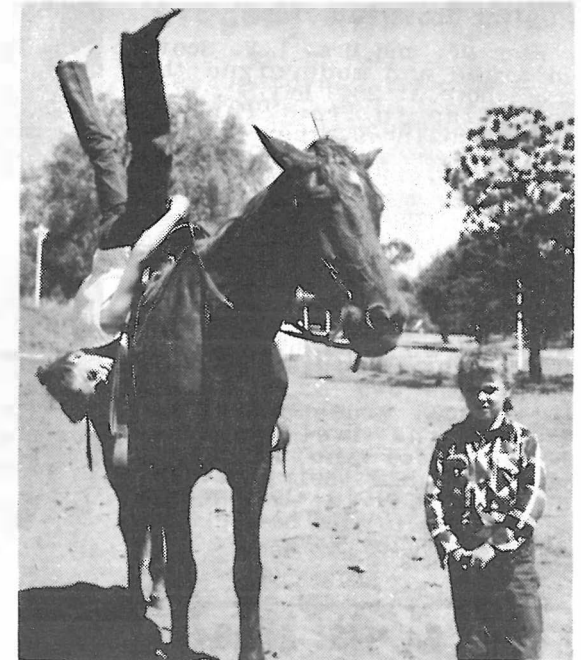

There is no doubt about it, Alpine voters want water and they voted for it Tuesday at the Rio SD MWD annexation election by a score of 797 to 93.

Alpine's vote was 461-66; Mountain Top, 101-1; Dehesa-Harbrison Canyon, 217-24 and San Vicente Heights, 18-2. It carried by 89.5% when only 51% was required. Total area is 26,300 acres.

This puts Alpine into the SD County Water Authority and the Metropolitan MWD of LA, for its allotment of Colorado River Water, relates C.C. Price, president of Rio SD. In a letter to the campaign committee, he congratulated them "for the excellent job you did in putting over the election. I am sure your efforts will pay off many times over and results will be to the advantage of all in your district".

Southlanders know water is needed, proved last week when voters of Olivenhain MWD scored 85-6 approving \$4,370,000 in bonds for water in their area which now depends, like Alpine, solely on wells.

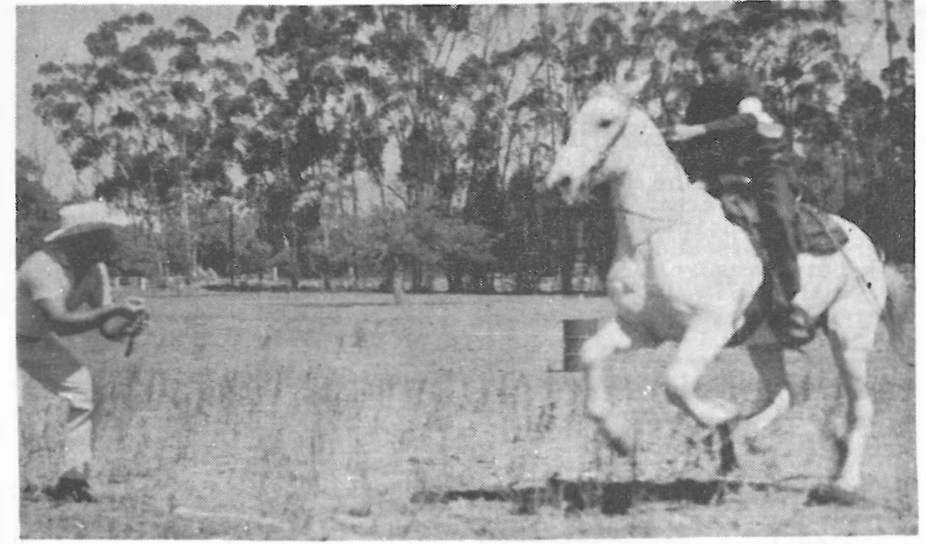
"This will give us more time to think this matter over" reports supt. Clyde T. Gilley. He mentioned that the well at the new canyon school is not in danger.

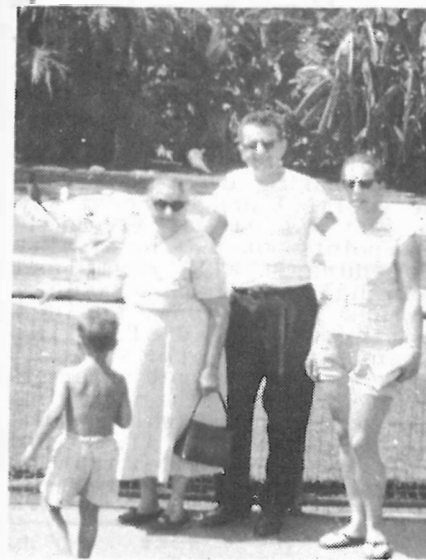
Ramona to Host Airmen

was, did Alpine want Rio to build them? The directors voted yes, so preliminary plans and estimates of cost will be ready in the very near future.

"All we have to do" says Freeland, "is ask property-owners, and if agreed, proceed to build when Flinn Springs and Blossom Valley are built. In two or three weeks we can have a hearing and this will be the earliest and cheapest way to get water to Alpine.

He points out that by a joint procedure it will cost less than half! And also made a savings if done now, besides getting way ahead of an independent schedule.

"We will try to get water in by June 1961" was the thrilling news he conveyed, "which would put it right into Alpine by December. He concluded that it should be known within 30 to 60 days.
