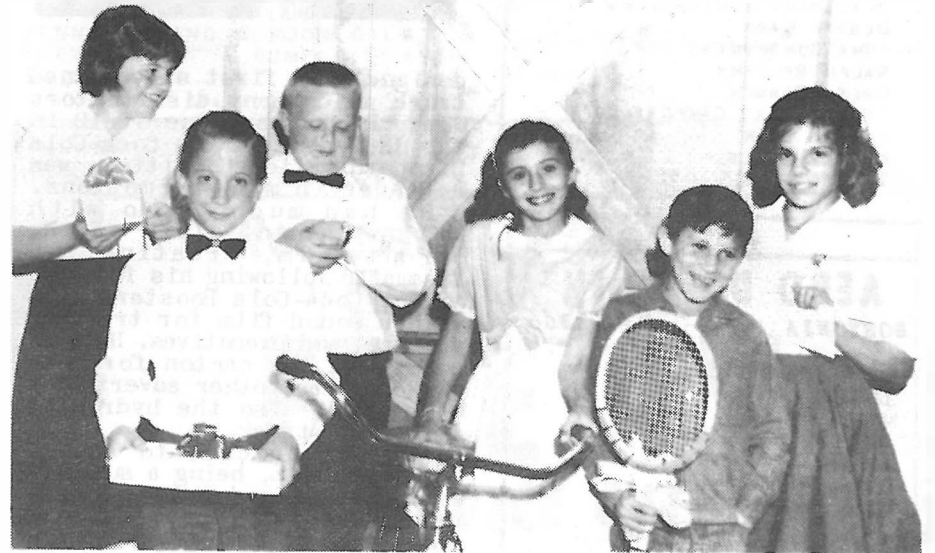

designed the first streamlined truck which many distributors used thereafter. One of 12 in the US he was on the Coca-Cola Standardization Committee, was a leader in many promotions.

He had much to do with the upturn in volume of the parent firm, creating the Visomatic following his founding of the Coca-Cola Boosters Club with a sound film for training salesmen and executives. He also conceived the carton for bottles and many other advertising novelties, also the hydraulic tail-gate truck.

In 1936 he came to Alpine for his health, being a sufferer from asthma and a heart condition. At that time doctors said he had only five years to live, but he beat them by 20 years and was lively and creative up to the last.

Seen Lowest
In 30 Years

SACRAMENTO (AP) — The odds are 25-1 that California will have the worst summer water shortage in 30 years, says State Water Resources Director William E. Warne. The runoff in the San Joaquin Valley, he said in a report issued Saturday, will be comparable to 1924, the driest year on record. Warne noted this is the third consecutive dry year, and the driest of the three. Total rainfall in 1959-61 will challenge 1929-31 as the driest three-year period in this century, he said.

at Metropolitan State Hospital, Norwalk, where she was resident physician since 1959 after selling out and leaving Alpine. She suffered a sudden heart attack.

Dr. Hubbert was a native of Portland, Ore., born on March 10, 1900. She went to pre-med school at Reed College, Portland, also in St. Louis, received her MD from the College of Medical Evangelists, Loma Linda.

She is credited with building the LM Community Hospital, then moved to Alpine in 1947, marrying Elsner M. Hamann, a musician and builder, now of Spring Valley, with whom she built a motel, sold out in 1952 and now known as Smiley's. Her adobe home, where she practiced here for several years, was also sold.

She was a specialist in obstetrics and hundreds of younger people in the county were delivered by her. She was a great philanthropist, worked ceaselessly for the health of the young generation, spent many hours for the Youth Center here with other civic-minded folk. Her former husband, Al Hamann, was president of the YC in 1951.

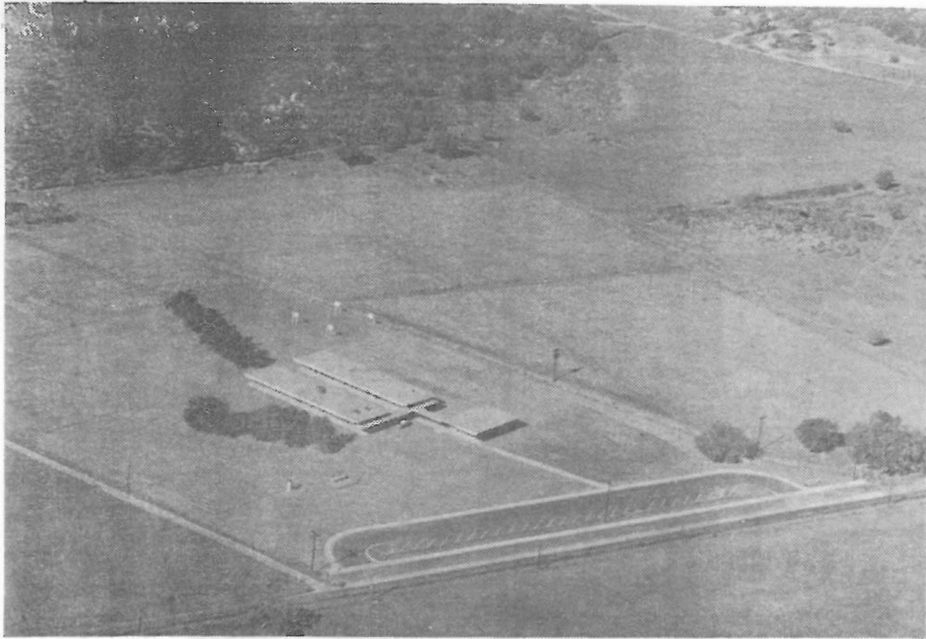

Three suggestions to solve this difficulty include deepening the existing well or drilling a new one; contacting the Youth Center to temporarily use their well or waiting until water comes. The only definite thing reached was to inquire about a bid on deepening the well in case an emergency should arise.

The Tia Juana trip, in which Alpine teachers will have the opportunity of observing the Mexican school system was discussed. Date for the trip is Monday. Busses will leave the school at 7:30 a.m.

A financial report was made on the band concert. Although receipts total \$304.75 to date as compared with \$360.19 last year, Supt. Clyde Gilley estimated that this year's earnings will surpass 1960.

Next meeting of the board will be April 10. Everyone is invited to attend and become informed about school interests. JG

Lewinson, have reported favorably, so it looks as if the bonds will pass."

"However, we urge everyone to vote, the higher the percentage, the lower will be the interest charges", he adds. In no spot has there been any visible opposition, so it is believed, inasmuch as the people voted annexations, getting entitlement to Colorado water, none should fail to vote yes on Tuesday.

"If any person is lacking transportation to the polls in any area" says Lewinson, "each has committees that are prepared to send a car for voters and return them home without obligation.
