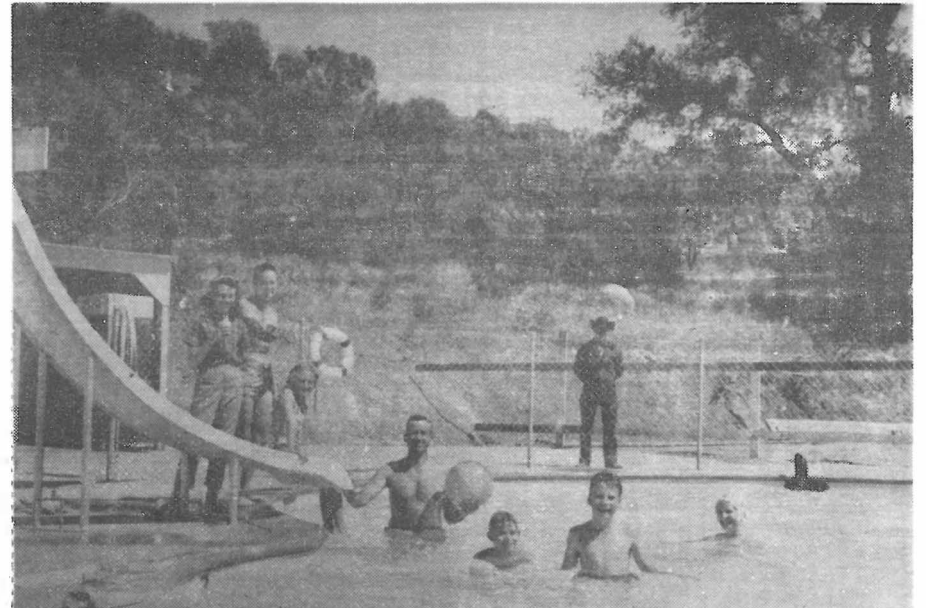

# EDITORIAL

## How Many Gary Coopers Must We Lose till We Learn?

Everyone that witnessed Jimmy Stewart's dramatic ad libbing in presenting an Oscar to Gary Cooper who was ill at home, was later shocked to learn that one of our greatest actors was stricken with dreaded cancer.

How many Coopers, and others, must we lose to this and other awful diseases before we learn the truth of right living and then practice it? We have been told that America is the best fed nation. We raise millions for polio, cancer, arthritis and other research projects, yet those in charge refuse to recognize the simple truths about the cause of these, even tooth decay.

It is a sad commentary on the integrity of big business when, as Secretary Arthur Flemming of US Health

Education & Welfare, on Nov. 9, 1959, announced publicly that a cancer-causing chemical, amino-triazole, was present in some cranberries, demanded his removal from office!

But the public and many doctors applauded his heroic decision to warn consumers of this danger of cancer-producing drugs being in the berries. Now they are trying to have the Delaney Amendment thrown out of the Pure Food & Drug code. It rules out the use of any chemical which physical tests show induces cancer in animals.

Moreover, this drug must be reaching consumers, for in Mass. only 2.5% of it is used by cranberry growers. So how many other products may be carrying carcinogens to the eaters?

Today we are beset with thousands of drug villains even simple dishwashing detergent can, if not thoroughly rinsed off, affect many with a nasty, almost incurable skin ailment. One recently banned food additive is carbon black, used to color jellybeans. How many more are being used in your daily food?

Sad it is indeed that we donate billions for research, when we could spend that money for simple, organically growing of food products that should not need to be cheaper, or have their shelf life extended. When will we wake up? -CI

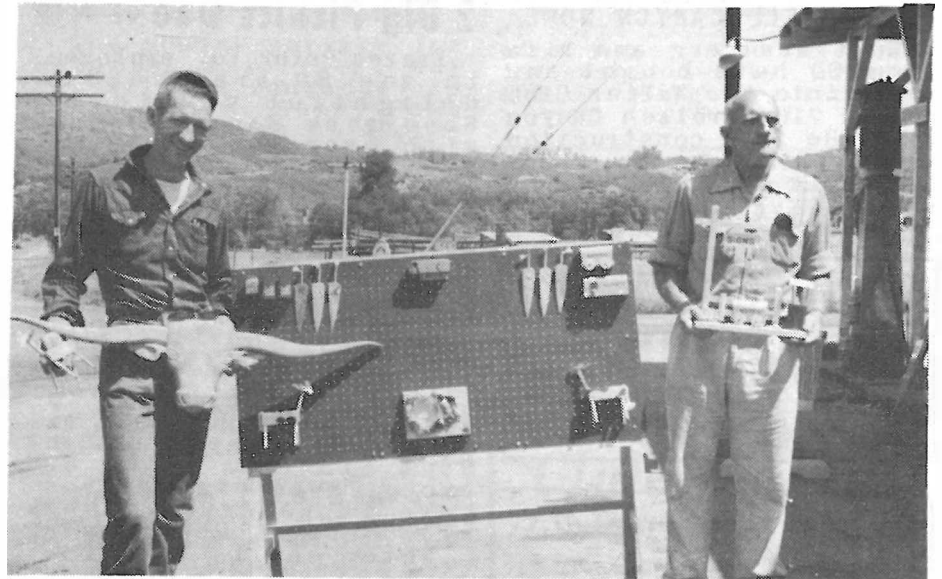

housing, set the fee at \$15. per unit, Chairman C.C. Price told the Sun.

In Alpine the fee is \$465. for a dwelling plus one cottage. Added houses, apartments, courts, duplexes, motels, rooming houses, rest homes and traildr pzkrs will be \$15. for each unit. If volume required is more than for the 5/8 inch meter, a larger one will be installed: \$50. added for a 1-inch, \$160. for a 1 1/2 inch; more for larger ones, as for schools or other heavy users.

All other areas will pay the same added fees to their basic connection charges, under 2000, but

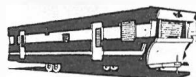

If a user has a large tank and has several units that might require a larger meter, by keeping his tank full through the smaller meter and float valve switch, he will not have to pay for a bigger meter.

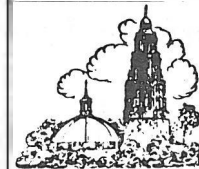
