# EDITORIAL

## Cancer Men Eye Small Smoker

The first survey of its kind in the US is starting in SD County. It will attempt to discover what teachers know of their pupils' attitudes on smoking. The story was told by Charles Davis, education writer in the SD Union last Sunday.

It is a surprise to folks who do not realize how cigarette sellers have invaded the feminine and juvenile world, for the startling fact is that some smokers have been observed among SD third graders, revealed Donald E. Windsor, director of education for the county branch, American Cancer Society.

He says the study will bear on a correlation with lung cancer victims. A British survey showed one who started smoking at 10,

died of cancer at 21. It was pointed out that a strong relationship has been found between the attitude of children and the smoking habits of their parents. It is hoped this survey will show the number of 5th and 6th graders who smoke. It will test a theory that from 9 through 11 is when youngsters actually make up their minds to smoke, even though the habit may not begin till junior or senior high.

How well I remember a man who induced me to smoke when I was only 12. My father smoked cigars, but always said not to smoke till I was 21. Somehow I forgot, got started, used tobacco till I was 38. I lived in Honolulu, did long distance swimming, discovered that smoking definitely cut my wind. So I stopped forever! I believe this is one area where advertising should censor itself-- no cigarette ads. That of course would hurt tobacco sales and cut newspaper revenue, but it would benefit America!

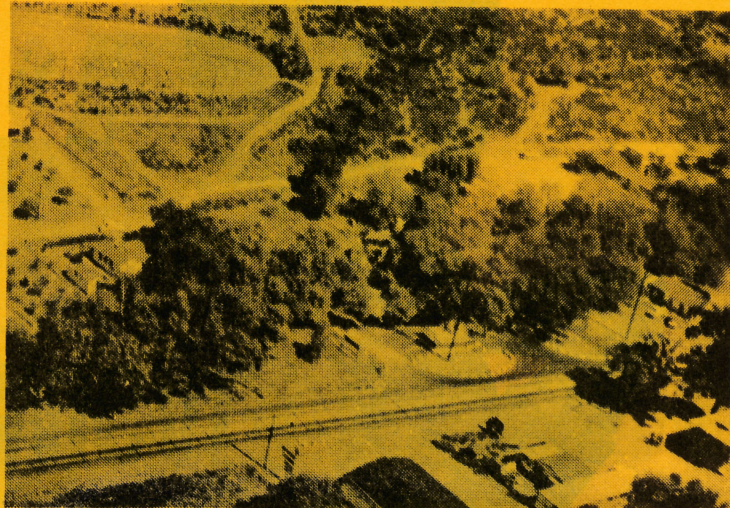
