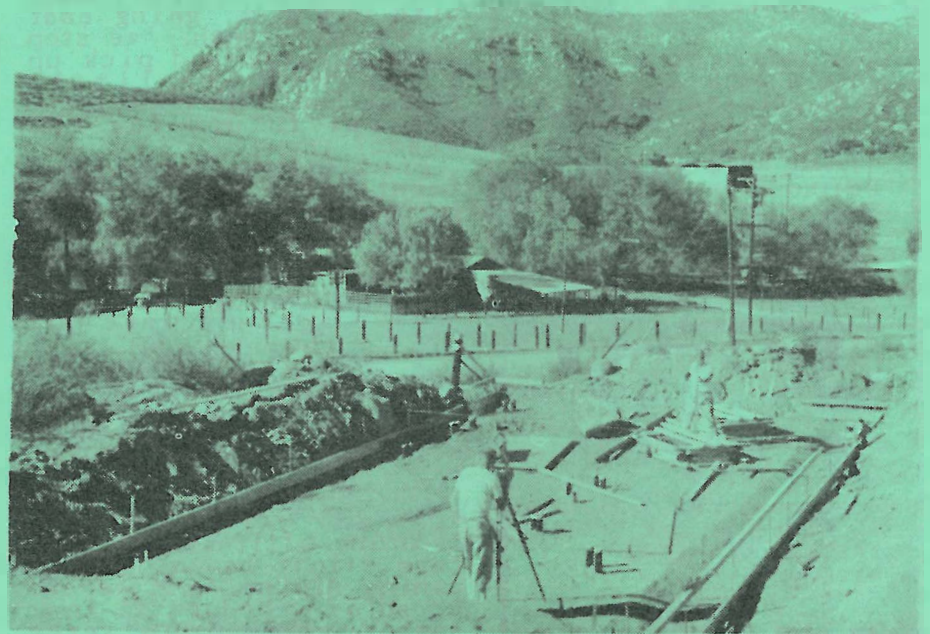

EDITORIAL

World Better get Together on Bomb Tests!

If all the efforts for survival were poured into one project; peace, perhaps the nations might forget evacuation routes, fallout shelters and armaments.

Anyhow, if we don't get busy and stop bomb testing, there may be no world left to discuss peace, survival or living! That is the highlight of a report by a University of Hartford biologist who says increase of deformed births

and cancer in children in the past 15 years may be due to atom bomb tests.

The chairman of the biology department, Dr. Elisabeth R. Swain, cited experimental evidence that fallout from testing, halted in 1958, has shown itself in human tissues, chiefly in growing bones and teeth of children.

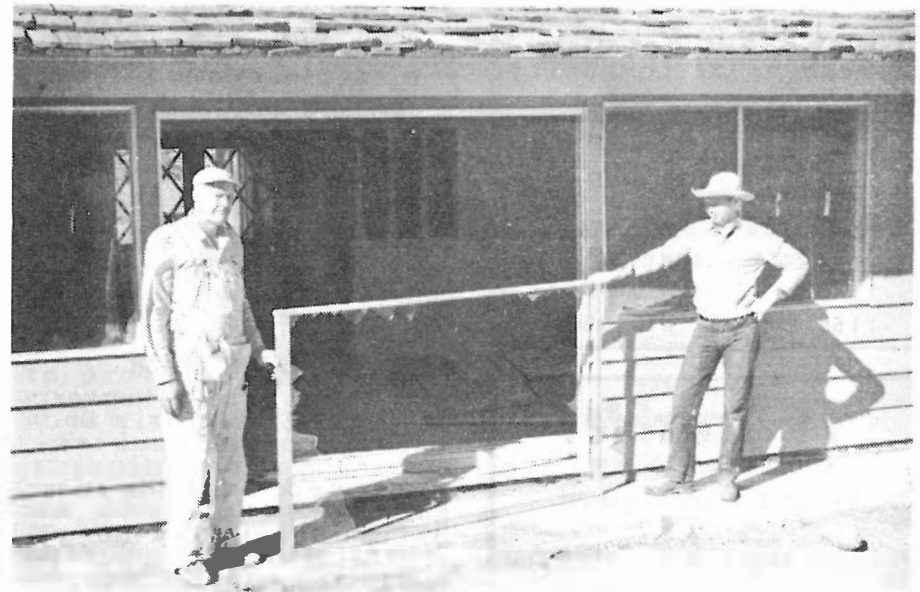
As a member of the Connecticut Committee for a sane Nuclear Policy, she said they advocate a complete halt of testing, and total disarmament. Traces of deadly strontium 90 were found in the first baby teeth which a group of scientists in St. Louis have been collecting. If S. 90 is in teeth of infants, it surely is in the bones, she declared. A sufficient quantity of S-90 does cause cancer of the blood, leukemia, she says, and "there is no limit below which radiation does not have some effect on living cells and tissues, and this is always bad". The new slogan for survival is "Dig, don't run", but there just might be a better one, seeing that this nation is supposed to be operating "Under God", and that might well be "Pray and fear not". - CI

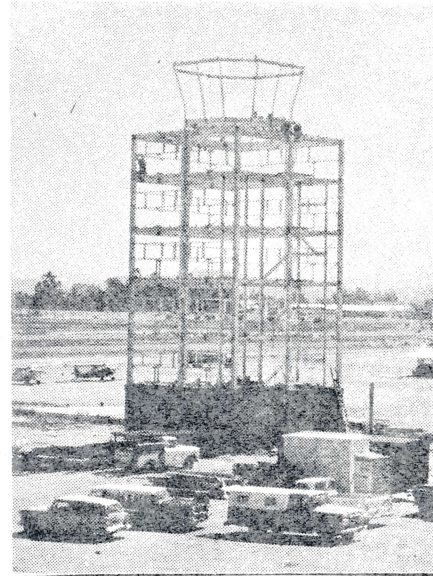

enough to complete pipelines,' he said, 'with exception of Midway Dr., and Tavern Road, and it looks as if the needed ones will be in by our meeting Tuesday night'.

Several non-resident owners of land here have sent in payments on their connection fees, which has helped, especially on Tavern Road. Much of the work has been done by Orville C. Palmer of Victoria Drive for that area and Dallas Lore in Tavern Road section.

'The urgency for getting fees in' by Tuesday's meeting,' says Price, 'is that if we do not include these lines in contracts to be let now, delay will mean higher costs in addition to not getting water when transmission lines and reservoirs are put in use about April 1.'
