

12% each. And depraved
sex attacks on innocent
children climbs similarly.
'These figures' he adds
'will become known only

to police. Untold numbers of victims will remain silent through fear of personal embarrassment. So to a large degree, this shocking picture is an indictment of a careless and unwitting citizenry. for example, a vacationing family, otherwise cautious, are apt to minimize the inherent danger in the signalling thumb of a hitchhiker. Such a hasty benevolent act could place them in the clutches of a

vicious killer.
