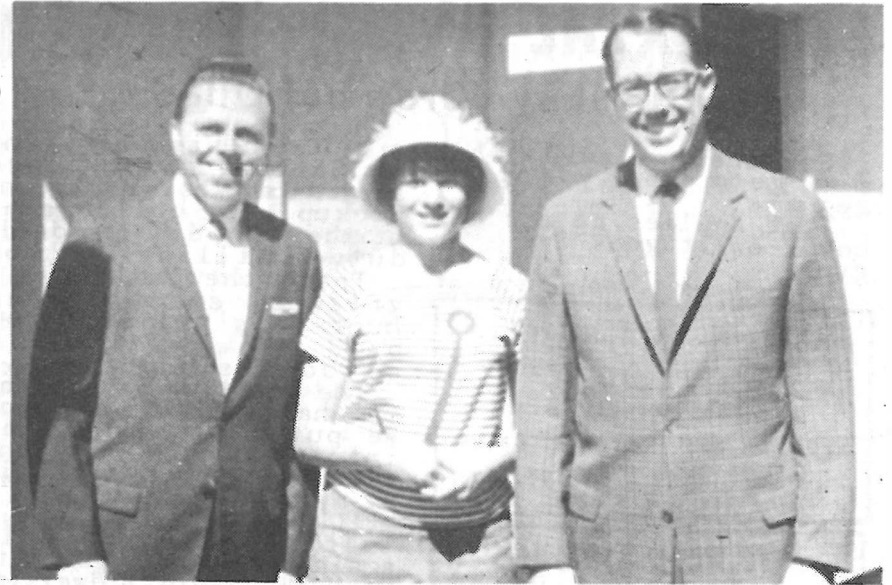

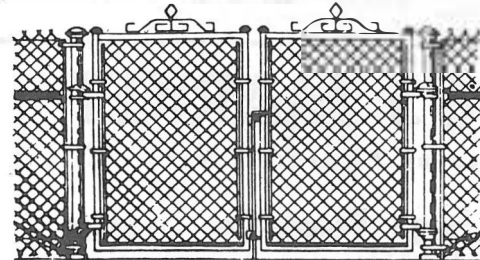

Rio Tax Rate Down

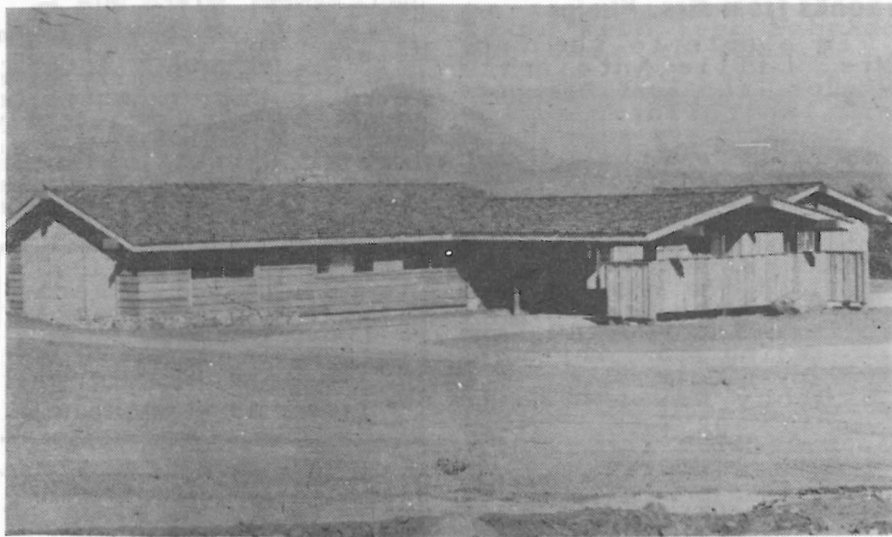

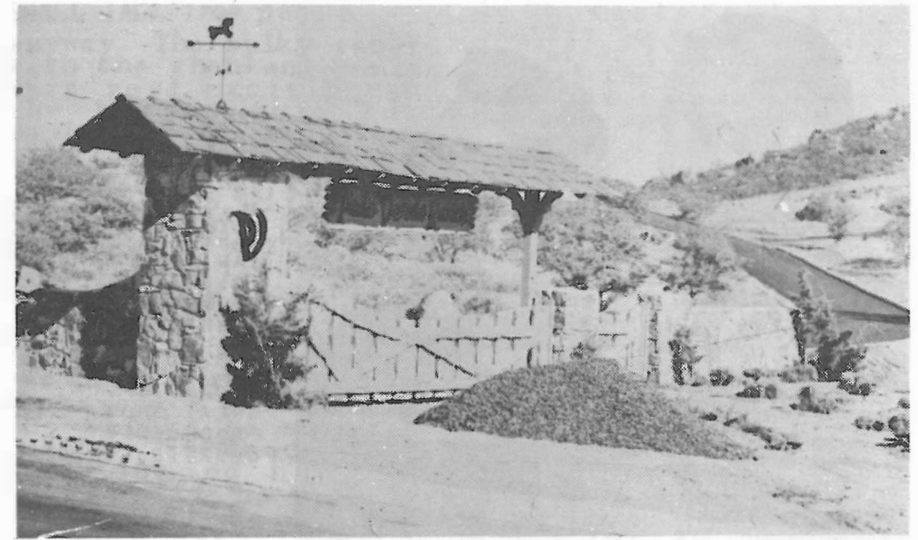

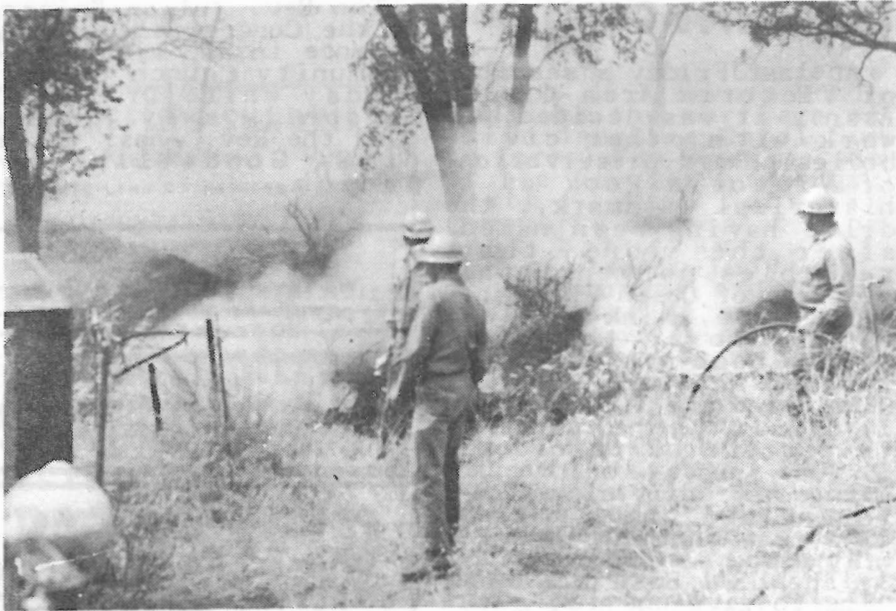
