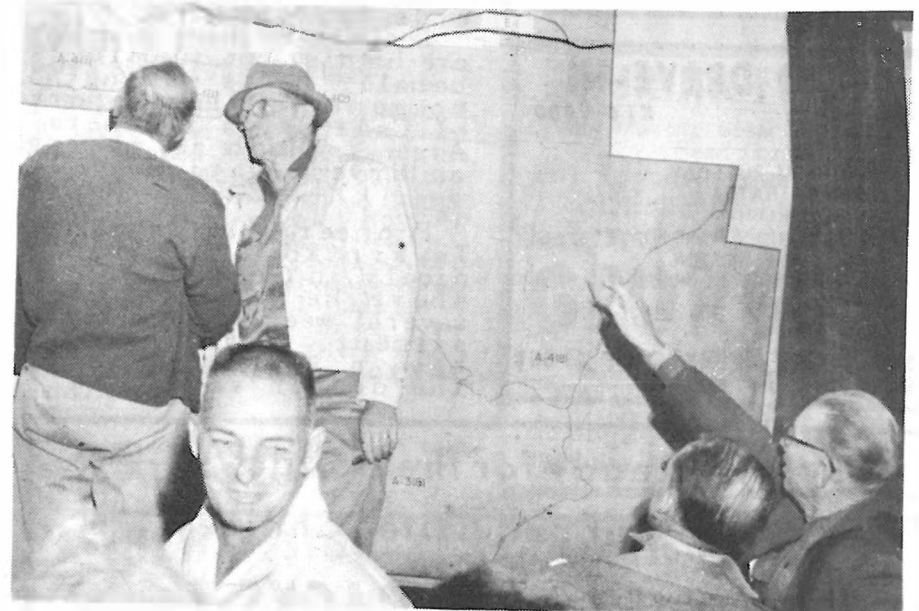

Check Recall Names

Signing of the school recall petitions is over and they are now in the hands of the registrar of voters for checking. He has 10 working days for it with election date 35 to 40 days after petitions are termed ample. The committee went overboard with about 80 names, so there should be no delay there. That would throw election to mid-January to vote in three new trustees, if voting ousts Messers Reynolds, Kildgore and Wilcox.

No candidates have been suggested yet, and they must file not less than 30 days prior to election. The three voted to let Supt. Gilley's contract lapse when it ends next summer.

Members Rushing and Day are holding out in Gilley's behalf. He is making no comment pending report of California Teachers' Assn., which is making an investigation.

Sabin Sundays Again

On the next two Sundays some 90 Sabin oral vaccine clinics will be open county wide when thousands will be served a sip of Type 2 says J. A. Bishop, MD, chairman of the program. It is not necessary that the types be taken in order, so you may get Type 2 now, get Type 1 later from your doctor.

'We can wipe out polio from our county,' he adds, 'if everyone cooperates in the program to immunize 80% of adult and child population.'

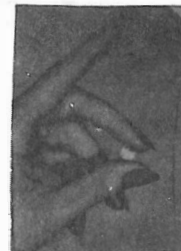

One Way to End Rising Taxes and Spending

If the present increase of spending at all levels of government is now slowed, soon we will be entirely free of paying taxes!

Quite simple! Today millions are employed working for governments. The more we spend, the more workers it takes to 'process' everything. This year Uncle Sam blew the largest amount in his life, \$115 billion, during a peacetime year.

Our public debt is \$302 billion, well past the absolute red danger point. It is the largest in history, of any nation, at any time, and it is going up faster. (And the deficit went up!)

As our gold leaves Ft. Knox, so departs the value of our once solid dollar, till it is now worth less

than half and living costs are way over normal.

Figuring it all out from government payrolls, it is reported that about one of every six workers is on some government payroll, leaving five of us to do the work of the country to pay his wage.

So when the day comes that we all get on the government payroll, there will be no taxes to collect, nobody left to pay our wages, so we won't have to pay taxes!

Sen. Barry Goldwater recently said that history shows government has proved to be the chief cause of thwarting man's liberty. Centralized power in the hands of a few is our undoing today; it is sliding us into the pure welfare state.

The tax gobblers are working like termites from the federal right down to the county and even the school boards. In Alpine, in Ramona, and every unincorporated community we hear walls about rising taxes. The record shows it, and our spending ability shows it.

We must get away from the tax-and-spend license, to the less-spend-less-tax idea, or else, and that is no idle thought. -CI.

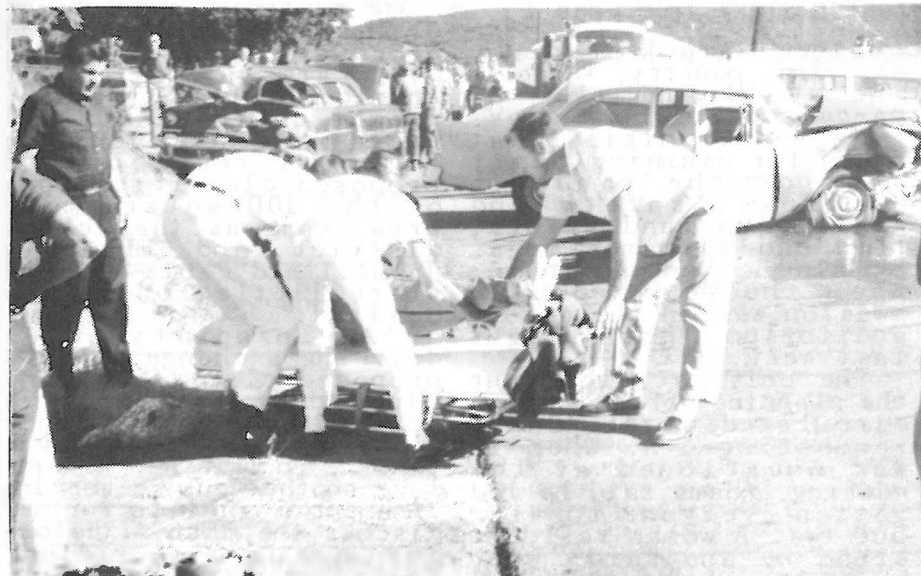

culture, stock feeding, dairying, poultry, kennels, and small animals, on parcels over four acres. Most communities that asked for planning to get them on the road to progress, safety and keeping up land values, have had warm meetings. So Alpine had a hot one when the first public session was in the school auditorium Tuesday night last week.

The only petition sent the planning office was one circulated by Al Adams, requesting 4-A. When it was questioned at the meeting, Adams said he had gotten everyone to sign but two. A woman resident stood up and said 'Well here are three that did not sign'. A Mr. Carlson, owner of 100 acres, also said he had not known of it, nor was he approached, definitely did not want to see this choice land spoiled by 4-A.

When asked, Dr. Miller said that a later petition to change from 4-A could cancel the Adams petition, just as a later dated will cancel an earlier one.

At presstime it was learned that quite a number had signed the new petition to cancel the 4-A request, and it will be presented to Miller's office next week.

From the floor one man complained that planning is 15 years too early, while another stated 'We are 15 years too late-- I would have built a nice new home but my neighbor went into the chicken business which put me on the fishy side of the wind.'

The meeting was in charge of Dr. Willis Miller, head of county planning, with O.C. Palmer, chairman of the local advisory group, in the chair. About 100 were present, voicing numerous reactions to proposed classifications of the 100-square mile area, same as the school district, and embracing Japatul and Peutz Valleys where little zoning was desired.

'Any property-owner desiring a change in this proposed classification' advised Dr. Miller, 'is invited to notify County Planning Commission, Civic Center, in writing. We will have another public meeting in about a month to further discuss the matter, before any hearings are slated. It is our desire to give residents of Alpine what they want. We are not trying to dictate.'

One man complained that he did not learn of the meeting till that afternoon, from a neighbor. We told him that we had printed stories nearly every issue, ran maps in the current one-- so why did he not read his local paper?

Note- We think it would be folly to allow beautiful Alpine Heights to be down-zoned. It has many fine, scenic homes, quiet retirees, artists, also some dog, horse and turkey breeders, which would not be put out, only stopped from expanding over 50%. If Alpine is to become a highclass suburban community of SD, then it should be preserved as such.-CI

They say that money doesn't bring happiness, but it's nice to be able to find out for yourself.

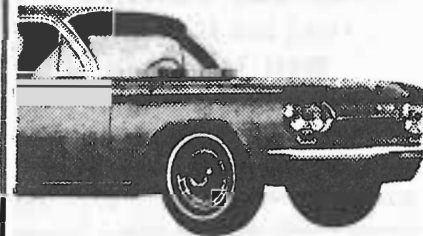
