There's No Percentage in this for You!

For years I have had a motto: 'Rent and interest are gone money'.

For years business has figured interest at yearly rates as 4% per annum, like Southland Savings, advertises in the Sun, 4.6% compounded quarterly.

When you buy a range, or a car, or get a loan, are you aware of the amount you are paying in interest? Most don't know, and that's why Sen. Paul Douglas whose SB 1740 would have required interest rates on consumer credit be stated as an annual rate-- easy for all to see.

There are numerous methods of computing charges and interest. This spring consumers owed \$56.65 billion, \$43.285 being installment credit, the balance merely short-term credit.

It may shock you to learn that the average cost of non-mortgage debt (3/4 of the total), runs as high as 15% yearly rate, and the consumer is shelling out about \$8.25 billion a year in carrying charges.

But it is a heavy payload on the poor buyer. It is just a bit less than the yearly cost of making

our national debt payments! Revolving credit sounds very fine, but when you figure it out, you pay high yearly interest, buy all you want, thus keeping yourself in hock all year around. A quoted 6% rate may easily develop into a 12% true annual rate, for if you borrow only \$120 for a year, your payments of \$10 a month make it dwindle so that you pay interest on the last installment of only \$10. at the full \$120 rate- Get the gimmick?

But when you get a bank loan, or a mortgage loan, you pay only the real, true-- honest-- annual rate of 5 or 6%, or whatever the rate may be. Caveat emptor.

This is just another vivid proof that the poor little consumer is the least and worst represented in congress when it comes down to brass tacks.

It is just like the powerful, rich, AMA, opposing the Medicare Bill, thus upholding the holdup prices for doctoring, hospitals and drugs. Also the braurocratic rolings-- not legislation-- of the Food & Drug Administration which would scuttle health food store sales of vitamins, into the drugstores.

There are no limitations to what you can do except the limitations of your own mind as to what you cannot do. Don't think you cannot. Think you can.

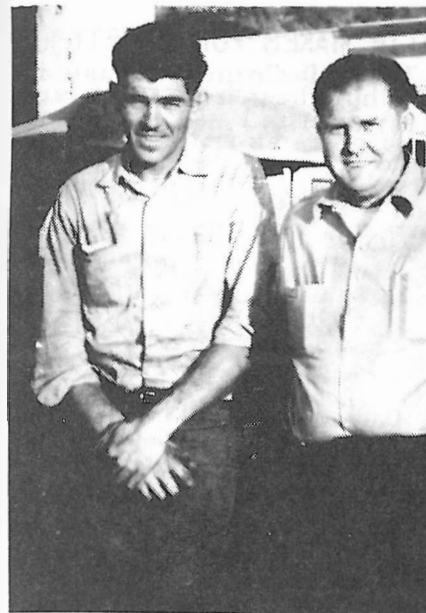
