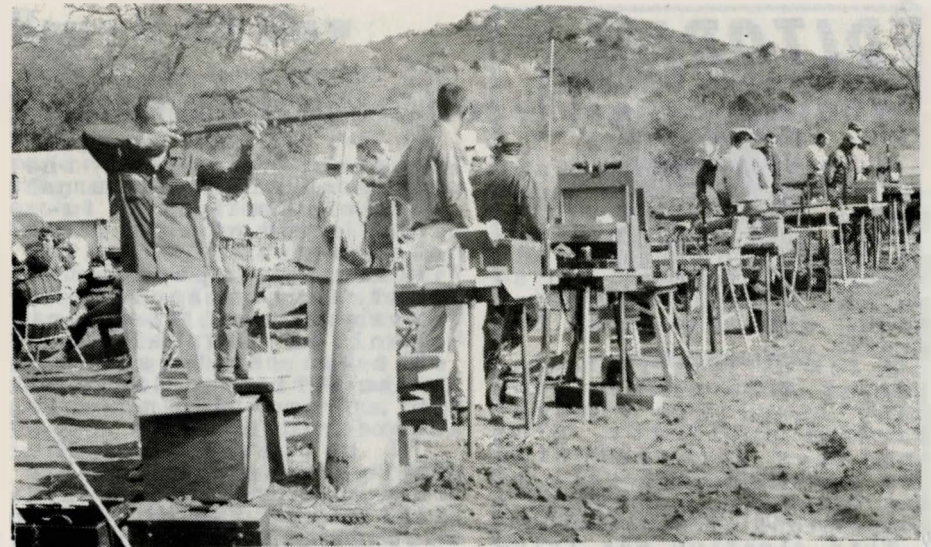

## What did School Recall Prove if Anything?

Well, the unpleasant election is all over but-- paying the bill!

And the incidentals-- printing, postage, advertising, letters and so on. This and the election \$650. all went down the drain.

A lot of letters--to--the editor were printed and many headlines brought harmful publicity, plus enmities and confusion for many. But overall it has damaged our children's impressions of their elders.

This election was triggered not by the fact that trustees decided not to renew Supt. Gilley's contract, but by the manner of the action. The Sun did not take sides, merely reported the facts, as it has striven to do for its

11 years; to report the news as an American journal

We believe in the immortal creed of that great newsman-teacher, Walter Williams who sparked the first such school, the University of Missouri School of Journalism.

The Sun ran this creed in the Christmas issue of 1961, from which this is an excerpt:

"I believe that the public journal is a public trust; that all connected with it are, to the full measure of their responsibility, trustees for the public; that acceptance of a lesser service than the public service is betrayal of this trust."

He also said "I believe that the journalism which succeeds best and best deserves success-- fears God and honors man..."

It is regrettable that so many signed that petition to call the election, for the ballots proved that the majority did not want to interfere with the workings of this small segment of democracy! -CI

## Horse in Art Show

One of the most unique art exhibits opens at Balboa Park Fine Arts Gallery next Friday 7:30 pm and runs thru Feb. 24, reports Martin Petersen, program director. Then daily except Monday from 10 to 5 but Sunday it opens at 12:30.

It is "The Horse in Art", an attempt to show outstanding interpretations of a single theme by artists and craftsmen around the globe in various times. When the Sun asked him for details he said "We understand that your area has the largest number of horse-lovers in the country".

He was assured that there is an ever-growing population of fine horses in the back country and that no doubt a large number of folks would enjoy the coming exhibit.

It will show sculptures, paintings and graphics borrowed from collectors and major galleries nation-wide, including the works of simple craftsmen as well as famed artists as Russell, Remington and others. One outstanding example of sculpture is a bronze by Pietro Tacca, 16th century artist who solved the problem of doing a rearing horse without the usual supporting pillar. It comes from the Frederick collection, Seattle.
