



Nice Summer this Winter!

While the East and some proverbial sunny South areas have battled King Winter with zero-minus way below all records, Alpine has enjoyed a lovely summer this winter! Monthly mean stands at 50.2 for the 17-year record keeping.

For drouth, this season so far, is seems to be a record breaker for over 100 years in the SD bureau, as Alpine has no record prior to 1935. We had a big snow of over 5 inches in Jan. 1949 but the official records were kept only between 1935-45 and 1952-


