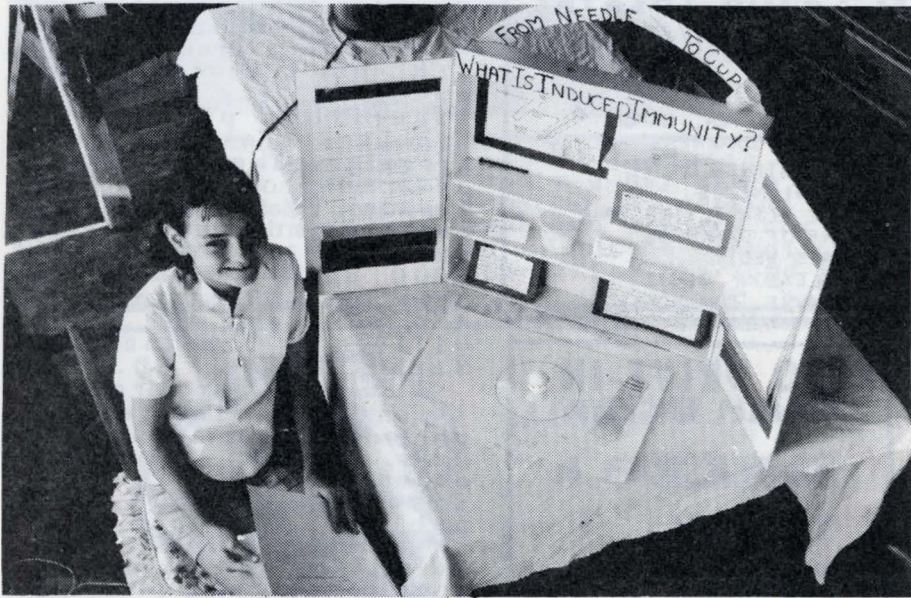

67, who died at 5 p.m., Wednesday in Grossmont Hospital where she had been rushed at noon from her store, Florence's Market, 2262 Hwy 80. She had suffered recurring heart attacks. Dr. C.O. Tanner of SD, former Alpiner, had attended her.

She and her husband Harry, built the store, opening on Sept. 1, 1948. Five years later Aug. 25, 1953, he died following two operations at age 58. He, like Florence, was a genial, progressive merchant, helped many local people although none knew much of their generosity.

Eyes School Problem

Attempts to save the job of Supt. Clyde Gilley were impasse this week pending outcome of a CTA survey Jan. 24, to determine if CTA's Ethics Commission should conduct a study of the district. This was the lead in a Classroom Teacher Page 1 story.

It said Gilley did not seem hopeful and voters failed to unseat three anti-Gilley members in the recall. Gilley told the paper that the situation was "unbelievable... more injustice just wouldn't be possible... the dignity of the profession dictates that you don't fight back".

Henry Schaeffer, president, Alpine Teachers Ass'n, said CTA wouldn't commit itself on the investigation, but expected to know soon. (See election story elsewhere).
