


HIRE SCHOOL BOSS TONIGHT

Ed Farrin, of Rock Terrace, is in the hospital in critical condition. He has suffered ill health for several years.


BANK BUILDING IS GLAZED

DENMARK SETS EXAMPLE FOR CUTTING TOOTH DECAY

Parents of Aarhus, Denmark have set the pace in the war against the appal-



ling rise in dental caries by giving the door to candy in schools. Following a vote of 95.6% for a proposed ban on sweets in the school, 600 pupils will go without.

Officials felt they could not put on such a drastic campaign for good teeth without backing of parents, but the solid support is great encouragement, say officials.

An inspector said that the effects of eating too many candies can be seen all too often in the Aarhus dental clinic. He added that breaches of the ban will bring a stiff talk by a teacher.

What America needs is more of this kind of progress, regardless of whose financial toes are trod upon. Morals and ethics demand that our health and that of our children comes before profits.-CI








ALDER GETS BUS SERVICE






LETTERS FROM READERS




