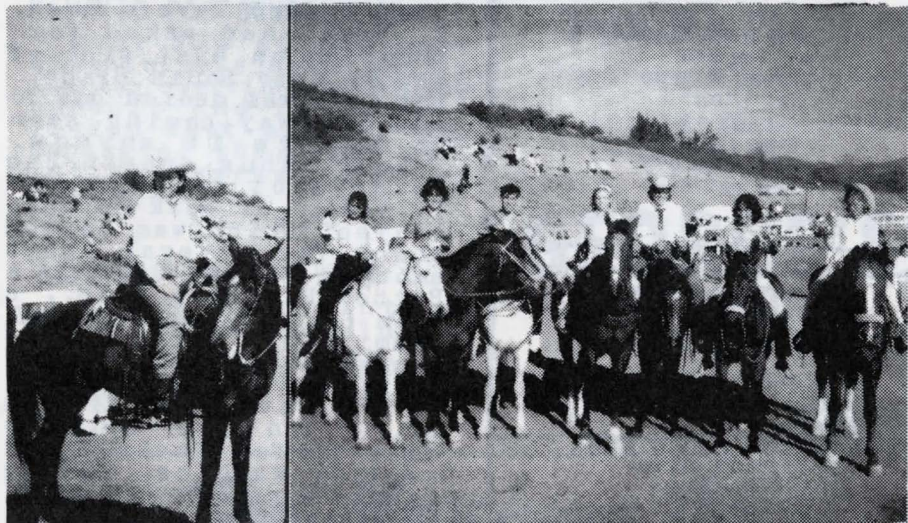

Mrs. R. Oeser had appeared against the move to make it A-4 instead of A-2, which it now remains, so operations may enlarge only 50%. Mrs. Manley said 52 had signed a petition against A-4.

Mrs. Phillip Kuhl was also denied a C-2 zoning that would have allowed the Kuhls to expand their woodworking and toy shop, 925 Hwy 80. The same applied to Clarke Irvine's request for his trailer park, 2255 Tavern Road, although it is flanked by a poultry shed, dog kennels and a commercial garage, with only acres of sagebrush at the rear.

A small parcel owned by Barney Ratliffe on Arnold Way near the new bank, will be allowed from R-3 to C-2, so that business may expand toward Tavern Road. C. Broni had asked for rezoning on east side of Hwy 80 near South Grade, but that was denied due to the freeway coming soon to change it anyhow.

Note—Thus endeth the efforts by the Sun for 11 years' of work on this project which was tossed about for several years among a former C of C, a Better Business Assn., a Town Council, and several committees. Files of the Sun show increasing progress from the time in Feb. 1957, when Dr. Willis Miller and Roger Courtney came up for their first meeting with us. Zoning is one more orderly step in Alpine progress. —CI.

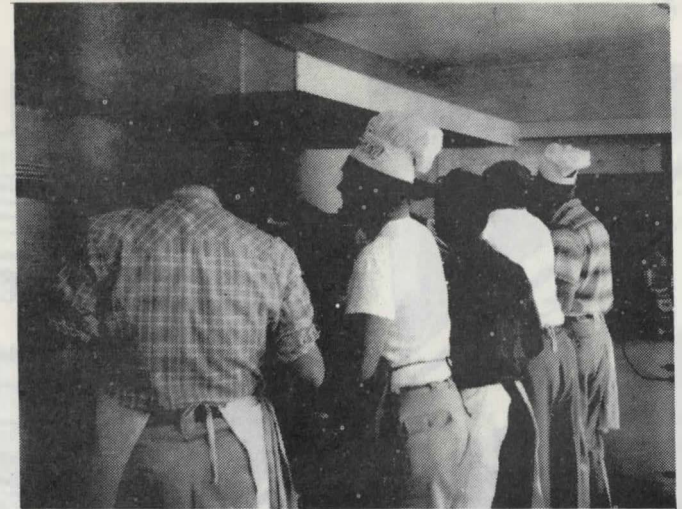
**NELLIE KELLER UP IN AIR**

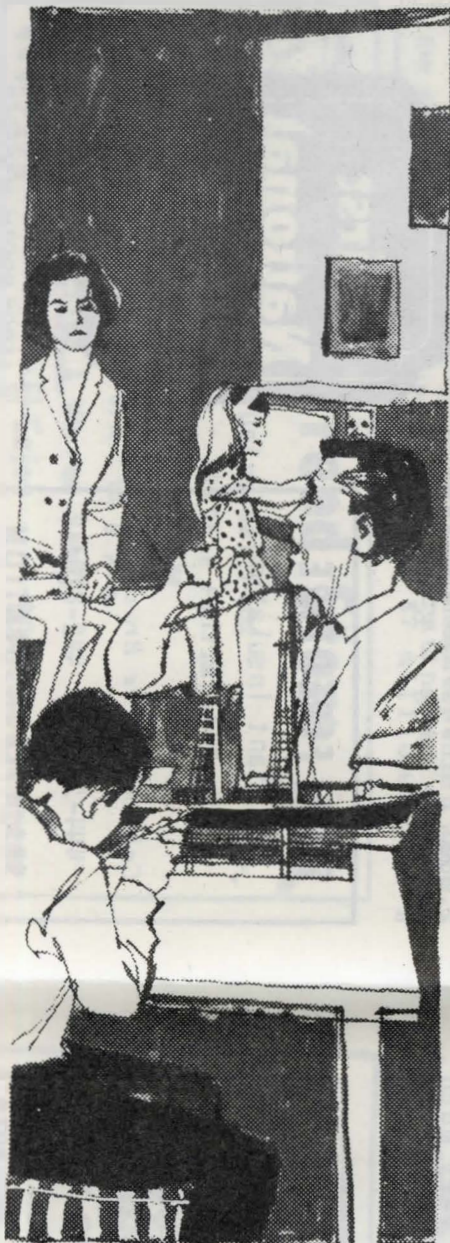

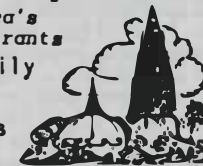
