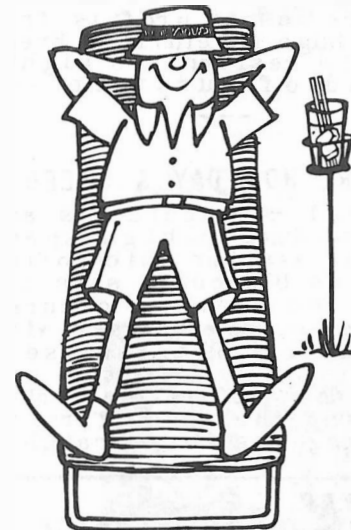

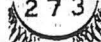

For an undisclosed price, the northeast corner of Hwy 80 and W. Victoria Drive, with 158' on 80 and 200' on Victoria, comprising .95 acre, has just been sold to Dr. and Mrs. Anton Yuskis of SD. He is a prominent heart specialist, bought for an investment, plans to improve, later erect a building on the lot next to the present Alpine Store. Seller was Mrs. Dorothy Hilton Scott, Visalia, whose parents ran the store for many years before they sold to Gordon Wilson.

A general store business was on that corner for nearly a century, having burned three times, but for awhile it was on the south side. The postoffice has, till the present one was built, been integral, like many rural offices.

The noted Dr. Hymen Lischner owned it in 1919. He built the sanitarium (now Dinosaurland), which burned after WW1. It was used mainly for gassed

veterans, the site having been selected, it is said, by a group of army doctors seeking an ideal place for bronchial troubles, and this is how the original chamber of commerce got its slogan on "best climate".

The new owner thinks Alpine has a great future. He will also refurbish the rental house in the rear, and the Jack Wilsons, operators of the store, will continue to reside in the flat above it.

Dr. Yuskis was represented by Anthony V.V. Misuraca, SD realtor who has a week-end home here, and Henry McKie, local realtor, handled the sale for Mrs. Scott.

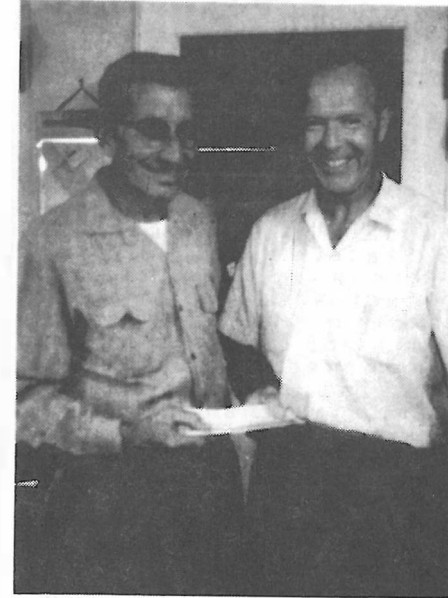
Valerie Spartley and her family moved to Johnstown but she still comes up to Alpine to take her piano lessons from Miss Burdett.

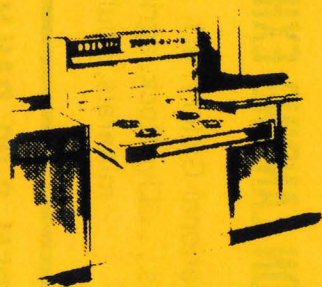

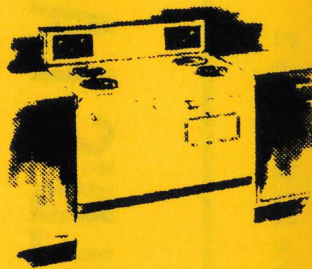

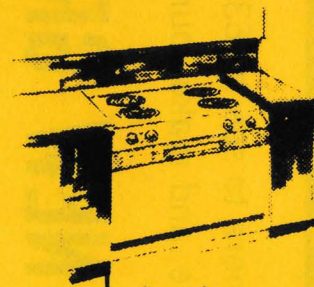

Such species are Chinese weeping elm, acacias, pepper, carob and others. Now that Alpine has water, the time has come to beautify!-CI

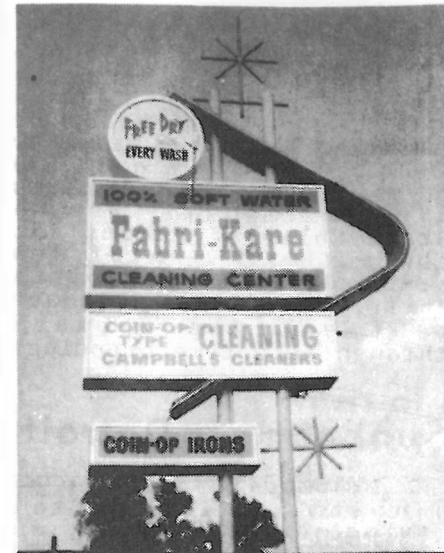
