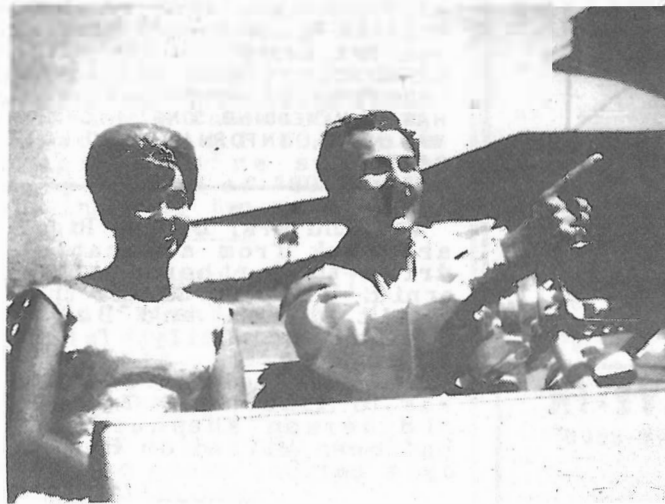
FAIR DONE SUNDAY

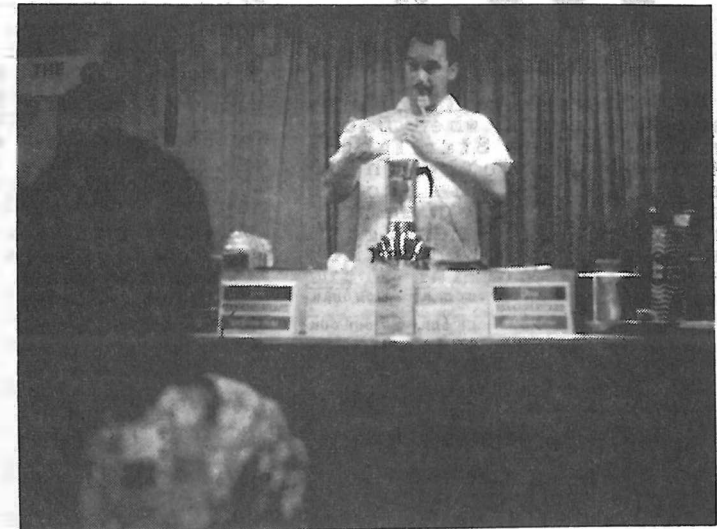

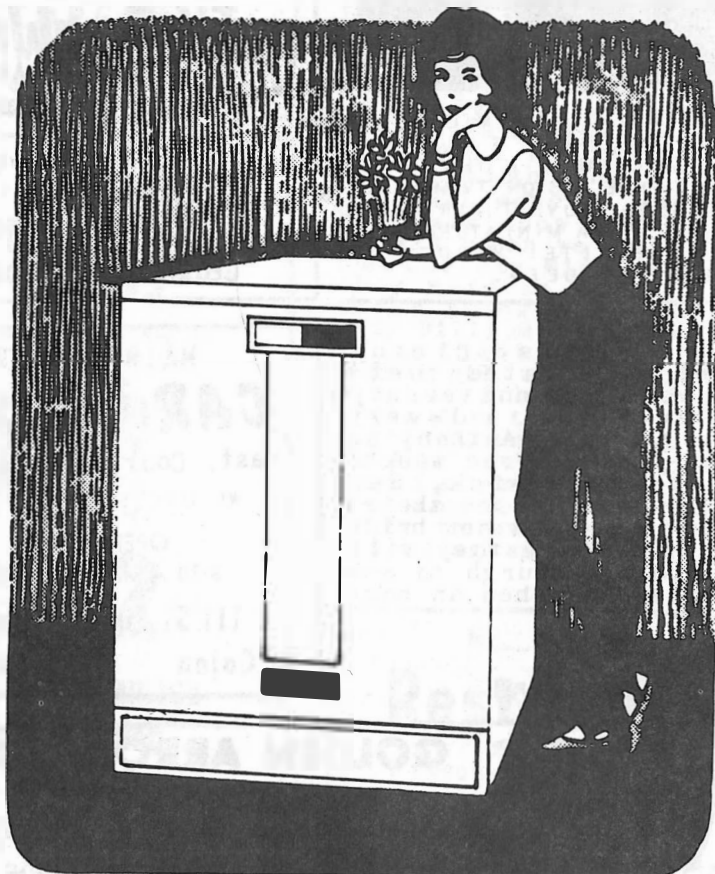

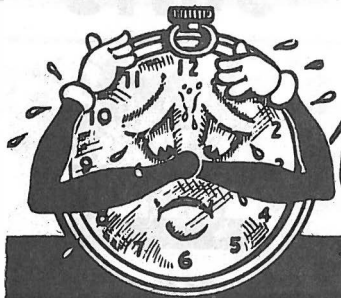
