Business Week recently ran a pithy editorial that well applies to any community and its youngsters. It opened: "If your high school or prep teenager wants to work this summer, give him your strong support."

"The job market for his age group will be tight. But if he can latch on, benefits may far outweigh summer camp or even foreign travel experience," say some top psychologists."

Interior Secretary Stewart L. 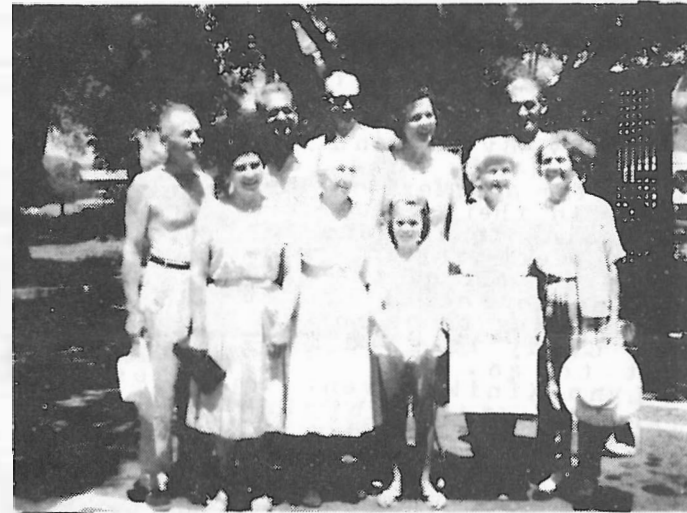

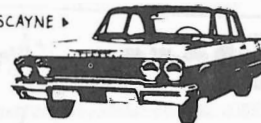

Water Hits Pains

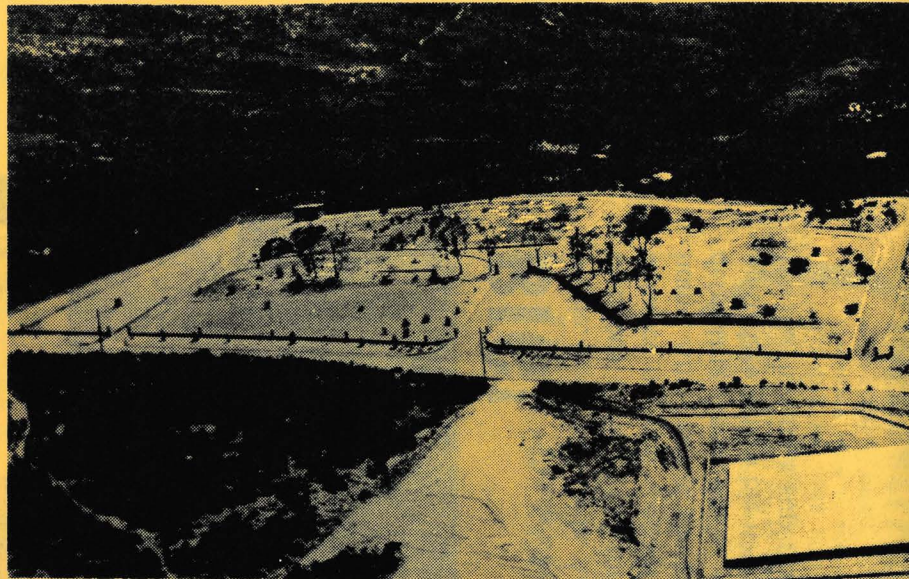

Drug Impairs Sight

Arthritis patients given corticosteroids for over a year showed signs of cataracts. Some asthmatics also so treated got small ones but vision was not affected.

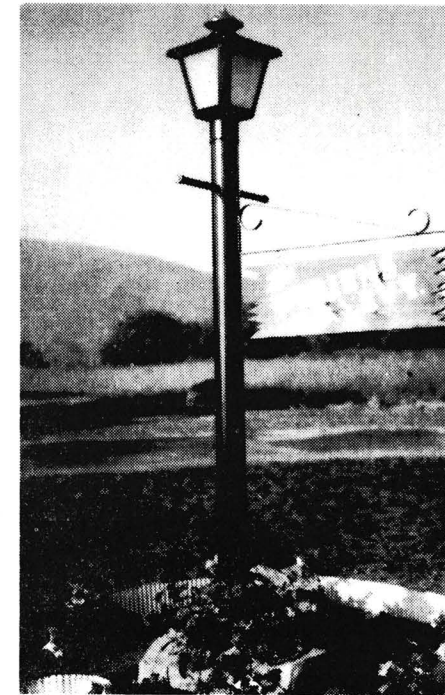

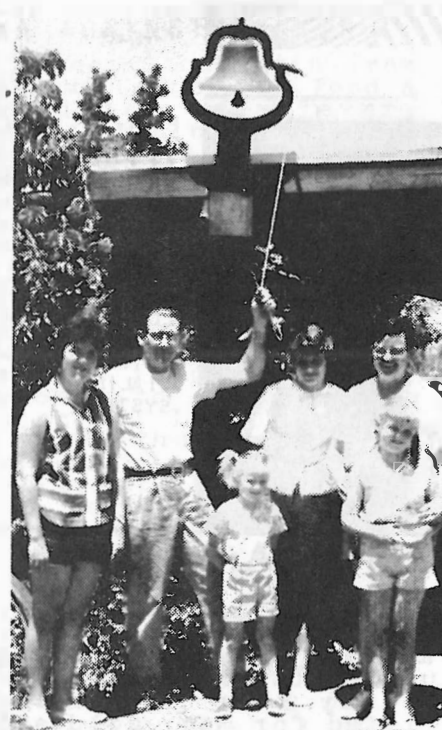

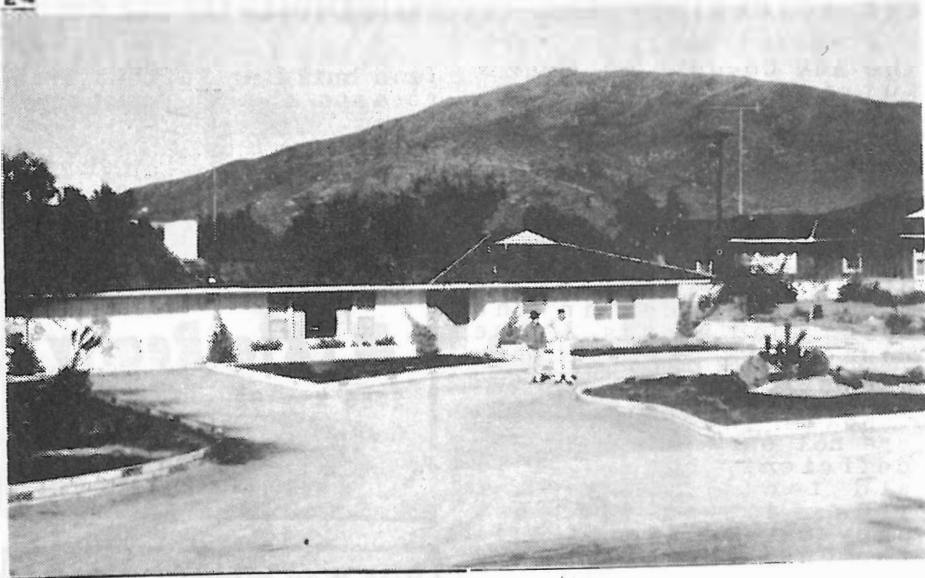
