

Old Bell Tolls Yet

When you heard those when you heard those bells ringing on July Fourth, you perhaps did not know that one mellow tone was from the original old Alpine bell, now in Community Church, where Dr. Roger Larson plays the corrillar the carillon.

The ancient steel alloy bell served over 60 years, since 1898, when it was set in the cupola of Alpine Town Hall, corner Hwy 80 and W. Victoria Dr. Today that old structure is the

Woman's Club.
C.S. Bell Co., Hills-boro, Ohio, made the 284-pound bell which is on a 450-pound mount, and it cost only \$50. Today it would be several hundred. In those early days it was used as signal of warning, summons, and so on including religious and political meetings, elections, even wedding and funeral bells, for fires it summoned the

the bucket brigade!
Then the club acquired the property, it was given to the church, just built opposite on Victoria in 1932 where it rang for church till 1953 when the new edifice was built and the old sanctuary moved back to Marshall Road. The old bell's present home is in the new 40 foot tower along with the carillon and amplifiers, which make the sound heard around the community.
