Political observers are watching to see just what appeal a woman politician will have on the national picture. We are likewise intrigued by the idea of

a feminine boss in the White House.

Polls show a voter prejudice against a woman candidate for the nation's highest office, so she could be hindered, or helped in her running. However because she is a woman, there is no doubt that Mrs. Smith could pull a dynamic army of feminine supporters.

It was a woman federal judge who swore in President Johnson in the airplane when he returned to Washington after the Kennedy assassination. | 1 large onion, chopped | 1/8 teaspoon garlic powder |
| 1/4 cup salad oil | 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce |
| 1 1/2 pounds veal round, cubed | 1 can (4 oz.) tomato paste |
| 2 tablespoons paprika | 3 tablespoons flour |
| 1 teaspoon salt | 1 tall can evaporated milk (1 2/3 cups) |

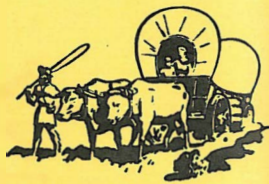
Saute onion in oil until transparent. Add veal, paprika, salt, garlic powder, Worcestershire sauce and tomato paste. Stir to blend well. Cover and simmer 45 minutes or until veal is tender. Remove from heat. Sprinkle flour over meat cubes, a little at a time, blending well after each addition. Stir in the evaporated milk. Return to low heat and cook and stir until thickened. Serve over hot cooked noodles. Makes 6 servings.

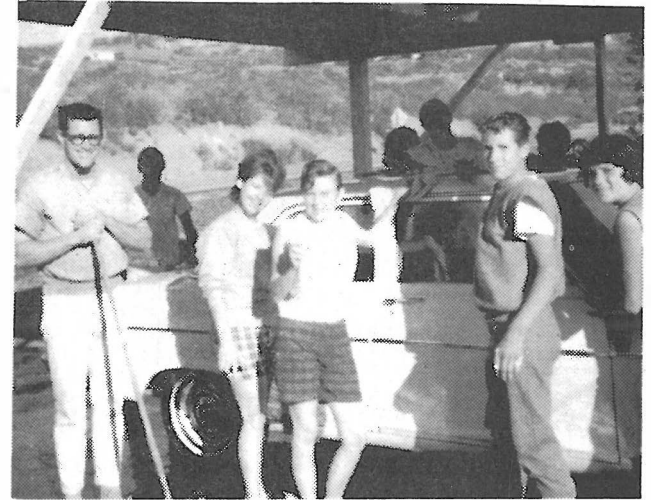

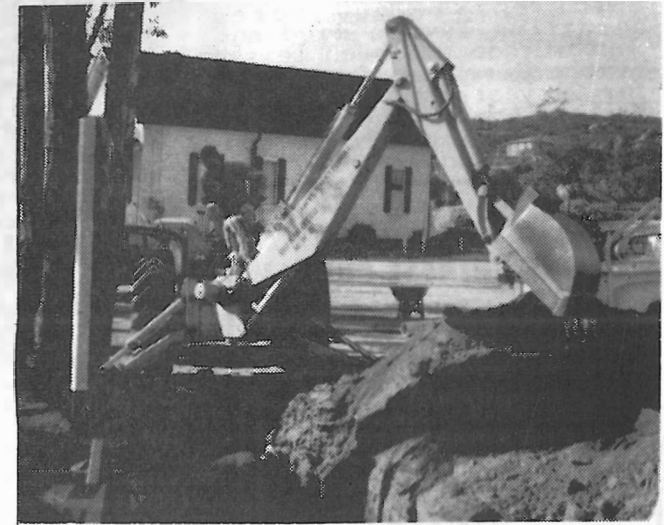
