EDITORIAL



If Detergents Kill Fish, What About You?

In the last few months, and chiefly since Rachel Carson's best-seller, 'Silent Spring', aroused apprehension over insecticides, sprays and other chemicals used so much today, a lot of new dangers have been cited that makes one think.

Synthetic detergents and their effects on marine life was a subject of much concern at a recent annual session of the American Fisheries Society. You no doubt read of the loss of fish in streams near Sacramento last year, found to be caused by sink chemicals.

Ronald Eisler, US Fish &

Wildlife Service, says a number of popular detergents contribute greatly to fish kills. He mentioned Tide, one product that remains toxic even after five weeks in solution.

Soap and detergent makers say there is supposed to be an industry-wide agreement to convert to 'soft' detergents by Dec. 31, 1965. But why wait so long? The danger is here, facing us now.

About 75% of all detergents contain alkyl benzene sulfonate (ABS), an element highly resistant to decomposition by natural processes. It is very toxic. Housewives use this with little knowledge or care for its dangerous qualities. Children enjoy bubble baths in such detergents. Serious damage can be done to the delicate human organism; might even prove fatal!

Perhaps we should return to the good old soap and hot water early days. Before you buy your next detergent, note if it contains ABS, and if it does, steer clear for health's sake. - CI

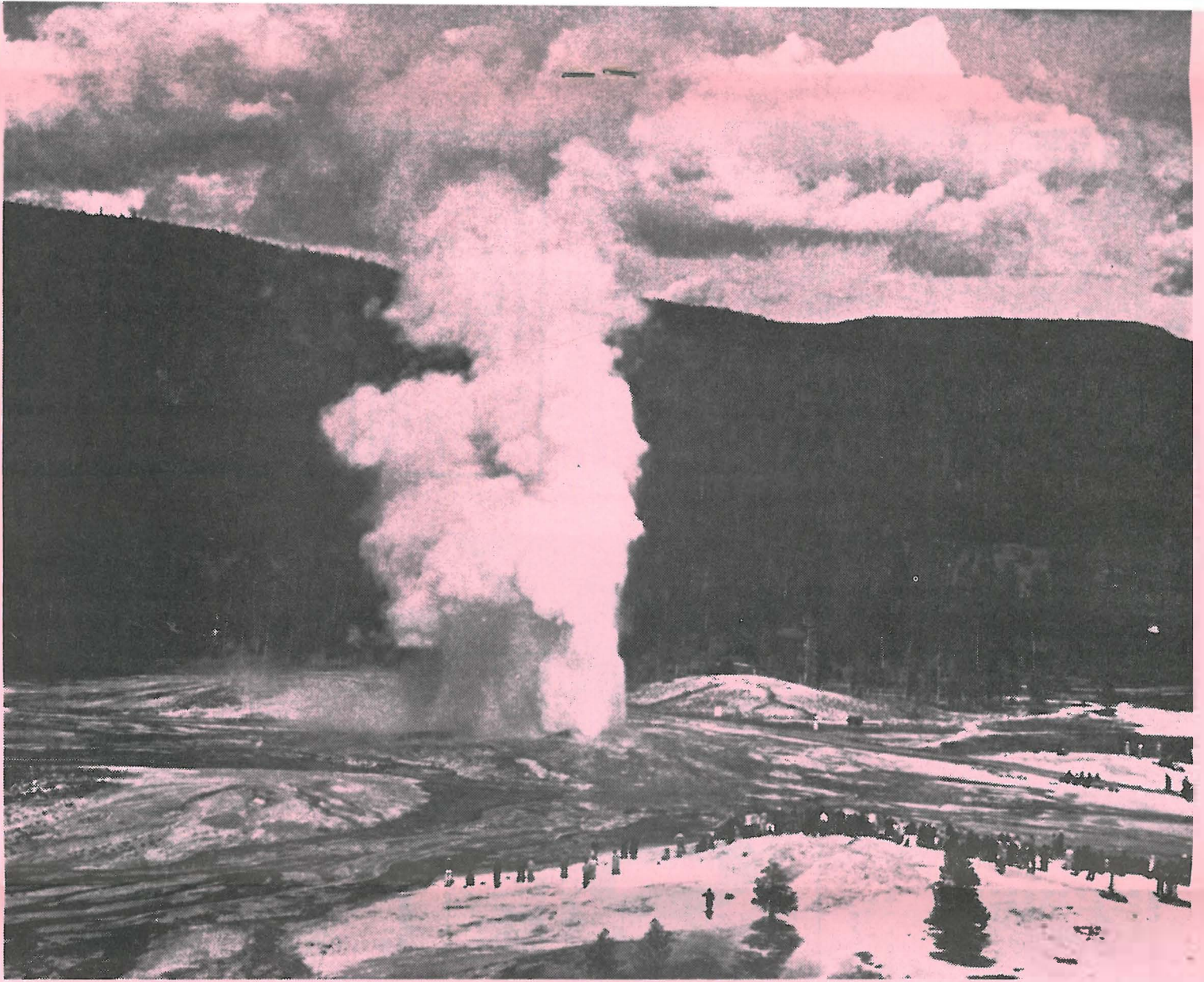

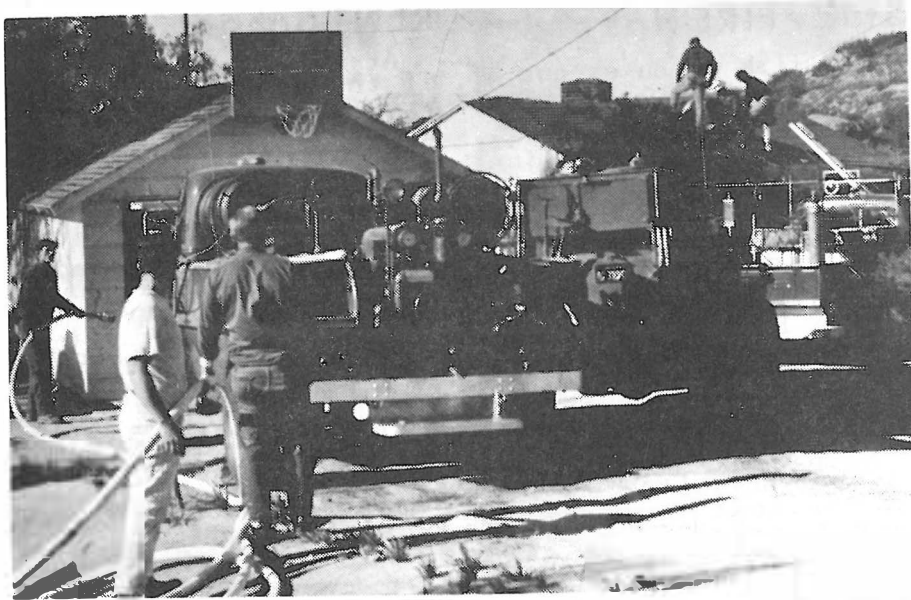

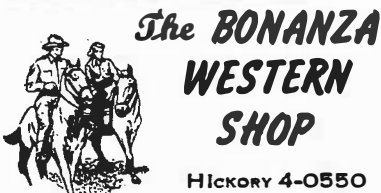
