Aspirin Warning

Ulcers and stomach dis-orders, bleeding and even low-grade anemia may be due to excessive aspirin use, says Dr. Jas. A.L. Roth, professor at Pennsylvania Graduate School of Medicine. He says it is a potentially dangerous drug, can erode delicate mucous membranes of the mouth and digestive tract.

Note- Aspirin and other

pain relievers are merely mufflers put on the alarm bells of the system which warn of something wrong. If there is a fire we do not stop the siren-- we get busŷ putting out the fire! - CI





AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2207 (NEW SERIES) ESTAB-LISHING INTERIM ZONING REGULA-TIONS IN THE HULBURD GROVE AREA BY EXTENDING THE TIME SAID
