## Cigaretts Can Lead to Narcotic Tragedy!

It is heartening to lawmen and reporters who know the ravages of drugs on young people may be soon lessening with the widespread education against smoking.

It is but a step from the stimulation of a cigaret, to the drinking of liquor, then inhaling marijuana, which in many cases leads to heroin and other major drugs.

The NY health director reveals that upstate deaths from chronic respiratory disease doubled in only two decades, 1940-60. Ailments include emphysema, TB and lung cancer, now suffered by between 12 and 27 million Americans.

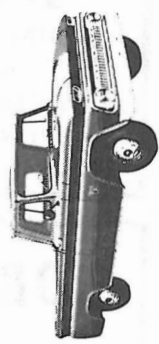

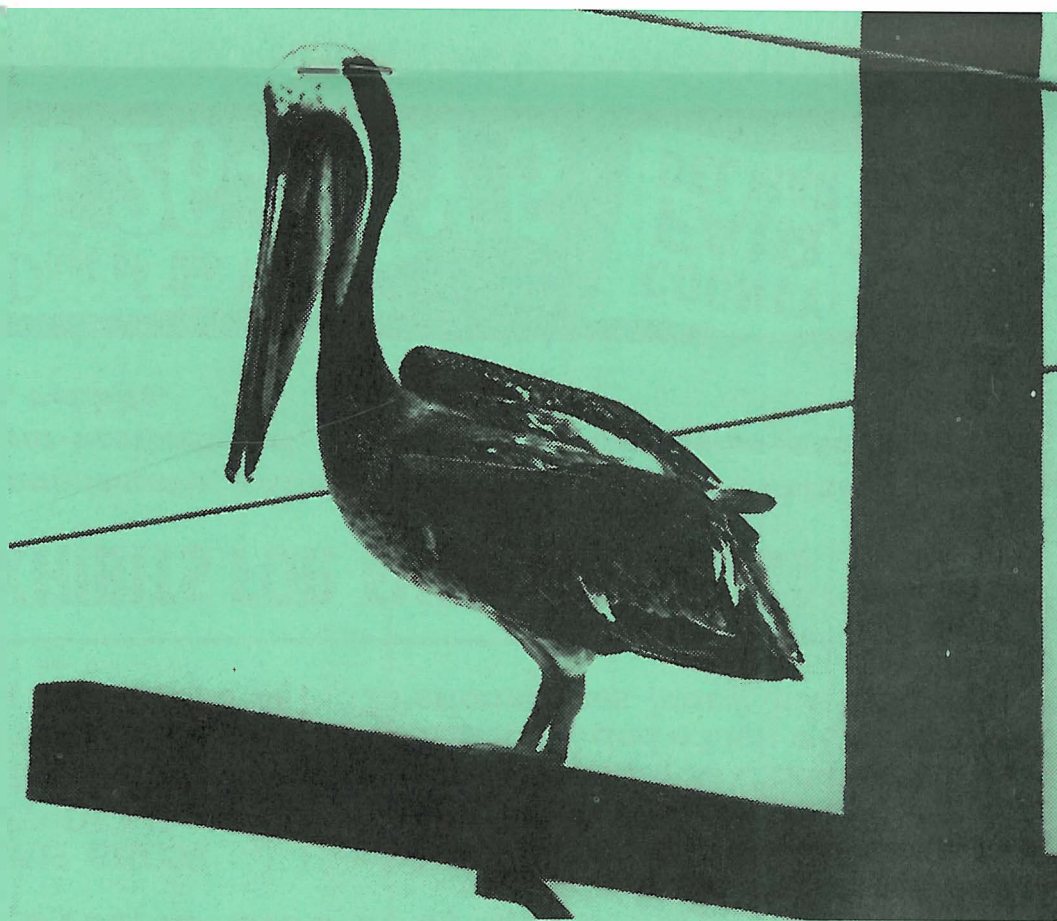

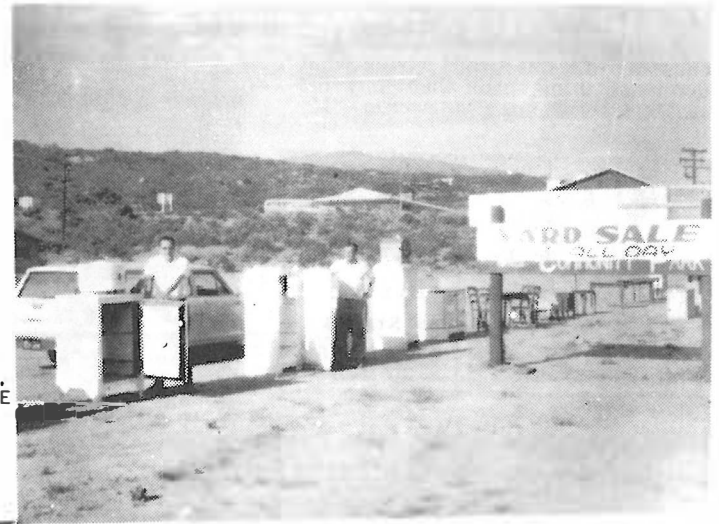
