KINDERGARTEN OVERFLOWS

Monday morning was a new day — a new school year for the children of Alpine and Harbison Canyon schools. And it was a new experience for many mothers who were watching their children go off to kindergarden with mixed emotions.

It also was a new venture in transportation for the area. They are leasing four buses and feel that this will be of greater benefit to the community.

SCHOOL BOARD

The kindergarten numbers some 74 children, in both schools, and the Board gave permission at the meeting held Monday for a part time teacher to be hired. This department will go on a double session.

The Board had as its speaker, Mr. Eugene Stevens, who discussed the sale of school bonds. No decision was

reached and the discussion will be continued at the next meeting.

The first day was on a full schedule. Some 18 teachers will guide the youth of this area in their studies. And there will be about 550 children who will take part in the activities.





"Perhaps the most difficult thing for me since returning to the United States is to adjust to our culture. " Carin Hinkle, recent visitor to Iran, went on to say that she had become so accustomed to the different culture while there for two months, that some things here at home seemed strange to her.

Carin is a senior at San Diego State College, and is majoring in social science. She feels that her trip will be of great help to her in her future work.
