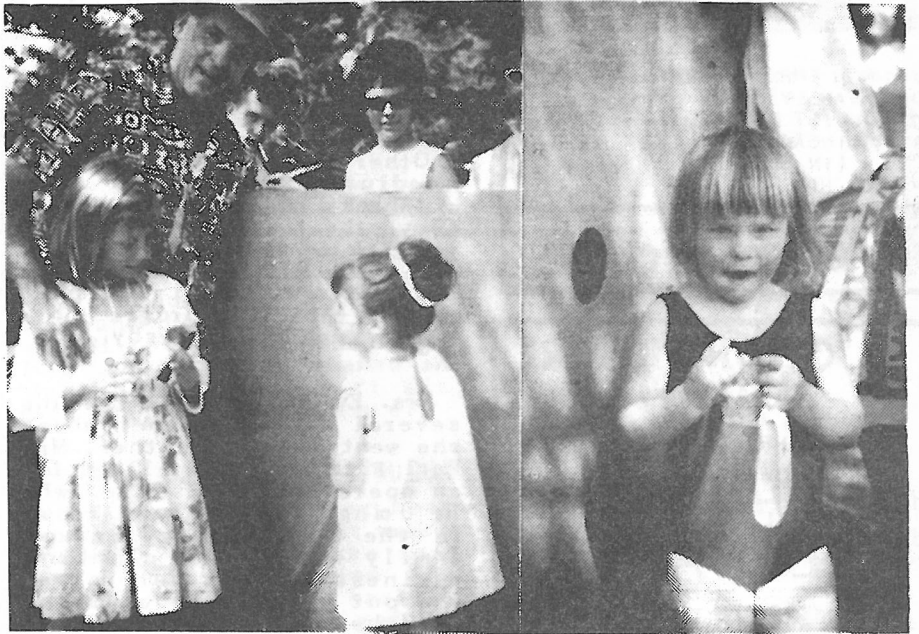

## A Lincolnana Find

What may be a valuable early reproduction of Lincoln's famed Gettysburg Address, was discovered in an old



family Bible of 1916, by Ray Lewis, 150 S. Anza in EC. The photo shows him with the Bible and the interesting document.

He showed it to Dave Villa, 2221 Tavern Road, when he went in to his place, 1425 N. Magnolia to leave a camper to be sold. Villa examined it, said "Why not take this up to the Alpine Sun, it might make a good yarn?"

So Lewis, a jolly retired service station owner who has lived in ec for 35 years, drove up with the yellowed document, a fac-simile of Lincoln's handwriting. The Sun consulted SD State's history professor, Dr. Wm. Hanchett, who verified the existence of such rare copies of the document, now in the Archives, Washington, D. C.

# Made World Scoop!

It's not often in his life a newsman earns a scoop-- covering a newsbreak exclusively. But when a scoop takes the dimensions of the first Trans-Pacific flight, and one newsman covering the landing holds open the line in the only phone booth on an Australian field-- the line that will relay the message through news channels to the world-- that scoop becomes the 'Biggest Story in a Lifetime'.

Such was the case 37 years ago Wednesday when Clarke Irvine Editor and publisher of the Sun, waited on a frosty morning near Brisbane as the Southern Cross, feared downed in a tropical storm, took a long glide to a perfect three-point landing, miraculously completing the last leg of the 7,036 mile flight across the Pacific.

'Besides pay for the story', chuckles Irvine, 'they sent me a \$50 bonus'.



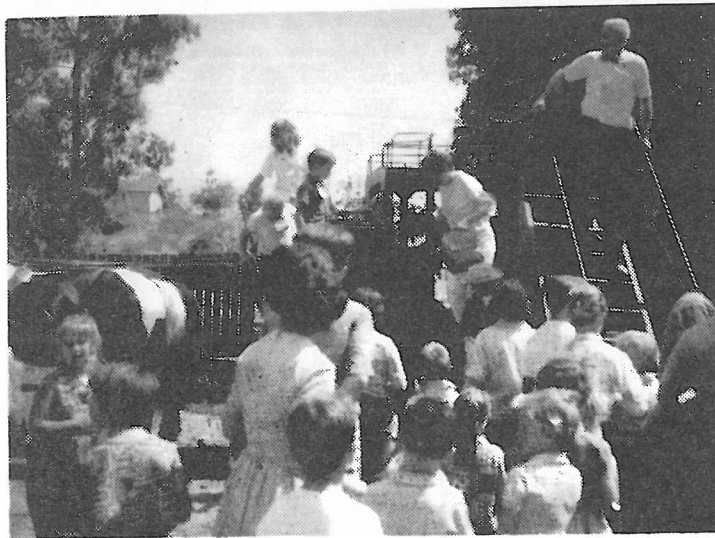
