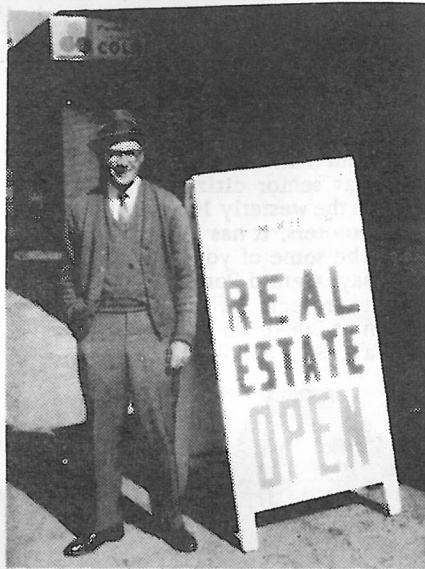

EDITORIAL

Recreation Can be Prime State Industry

Anything that helps California's economy aids Alpine's prosperity.

We have written many times about the wonderful advantages of San Diego's back country; its scenic grandeur of peaks, hills and valleys; its lakes and the Salton Sea; the rolling lower country where fine homes and ranches are being built and people are moving in with their families.

Industry in the cities is fine, but for the Mt. Empire, recreation is the main thing, more of which is coming, and Alpine will get its share if it goes after it.

Which brings up the idea of the state's recreation commission which today is meeting to pass upon a splendid idea of installing landing strips for



light aircraft at many parks and beaches.

So earlier this week we sent a letter to the commission, as did many private pilots:

As private pilots, we wish to urge favorable action on the proposal to install landing strips at our state parks and beaches, which we understand is coming up before the commission on Friday.

There is a dearth of places to go in this state, at least for private fliers. We have so many wonderful parks and beaches where small plane landing strips could be put in so we could go places for the day or week-end, or even longer, just like motorists may go today. Why not the flyer? Such fields would become self-sustaining in a short time and add to the health and pleasure of our citizens.

Any citizen would do well to pen a letter to the commission, or to any friend in the legislature, to urge more recreational facilities for this area.

Maybe this will help make California the great playground of the nation which it so richly deserves. -CI
