OK FWY ROUTE EASTWARD

At a cost of \$2,800,000 more, but with a 20-year user savings of nearly $\$8\frac{1}{2}$ million, the highway commission adopted a new route for the freeway from 0.6 mile west of Japatul Valley Road. and 1.1 mile west of Laguna Jct.

This is part of the new 27.1 mile routing between Greenfield Dr. in EC. and Laguna Jct. It is 1.8 miles shorter, with better grades and more sunlight to prevent icing. Total cost is \$14- million.


