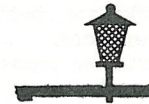

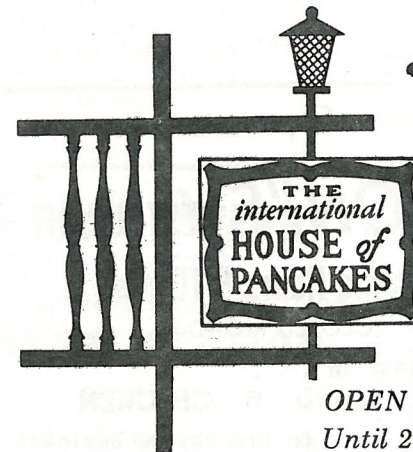

EDITORIAL

Here's Idea to Better Community



When outgoing president Jerry Funk of Alpine Chamber of Commerce ended his year last week he turned over to the new prexy, Fred Rushing, several good projects. One is a contest for ideas to improve Alpine. They offer \$100 in prizes and a \$25. bonus for the one chosen.

In one of the three age groups, over 55, we are submitting this idea-- not just to win a prize, hoping that people of this community will adopt the idea and work on it.

Inasmuch as Alpine has a nationally famous climate, is a community of ranches, homes and health institutions, why not have a campaign of personal letter writing to friends, relatives and others in distant places regarding the advantages of visiting or living here?

Write them also to bring their conventions to SD, which now has the facilities for big meetings. This will help Alpine. If it is done for a year, by the time the freeway is opened more folks will be turning off from both directions to visit famed little Alpine.

We also suggest, as part of this idea to promote the town, that the chamber raise money-- even from citizens not in business-- to advertise in national magazines and newspapers, radio and TV, stressing the climate, beauty and excellent living conditions.

San Diego has a fine tourist and convention bureau and would supply letter-writers with brochures on the county, and our own chamber has a nice leaflet, -CI

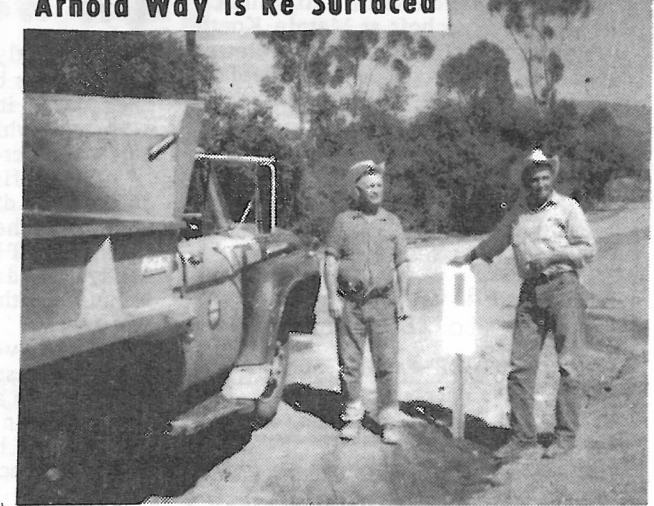
