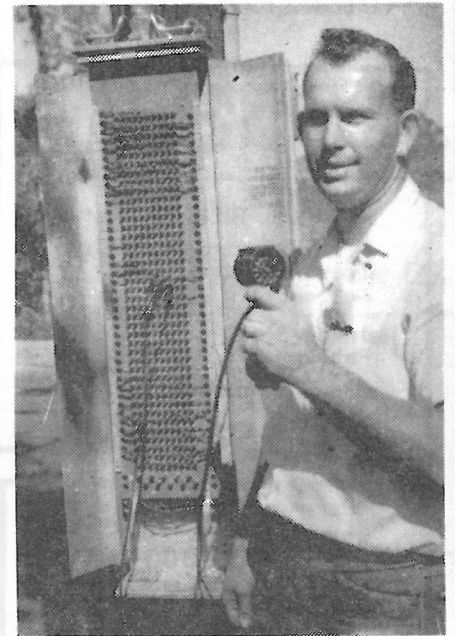
## Mallette Heads Kiwanis

## Will Freeway Help or Harm Community?

With C. W. McGrath, contractor, making the dirt fly on his 1.6 miles of freeway which brings it to Harbison Canyon Road, and the last section, to the Willows, due for early 1967 completion, just what will traffic by-passing the town mean?

This is the question the Sun put to several businessmen along Hwy 80 which will one day be merely a busi-

ness frontage road instead of a through route from SD east.

Records show that most towns, not hamlets, have been greatly benefitted by the freeway taking through traffic off their streets, allowing residents a better chance to shop locally, park their cars, and walk around the downtown area without trucks and speeders flashing by.

Jerry Harmer, owner of Florence's Market believes the freeway will give a spurt to local business and Alpine will fall into the category of towns that have been helped.

Bob Wilson, of the big Texaco Station says "Our volume has been up every year, and local people come here for fast, efficient service, so we do not fear the loss of some highway trade. Alpine itself has a great future."

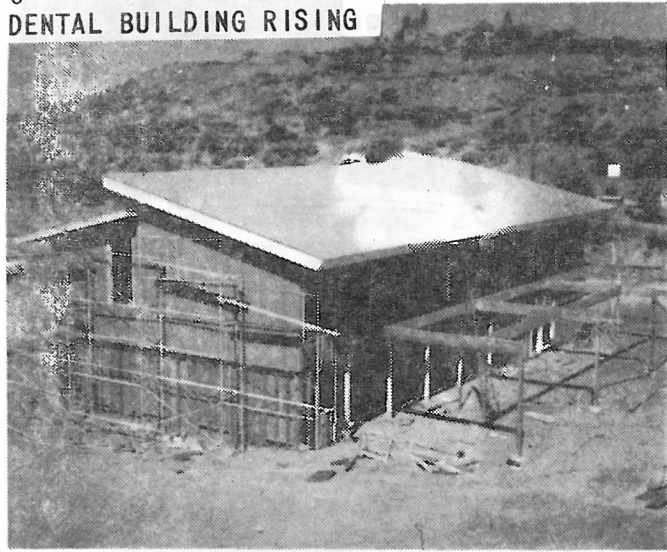

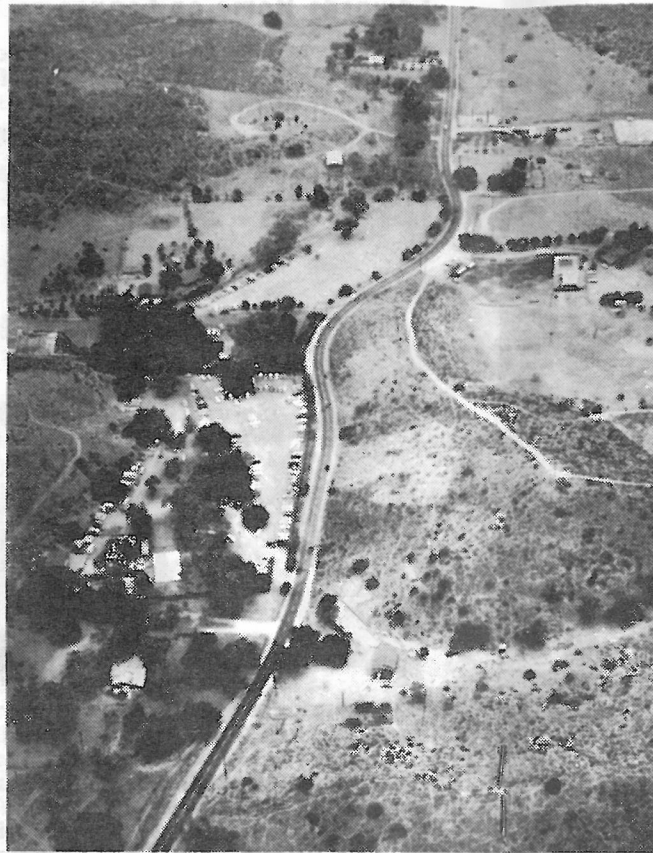

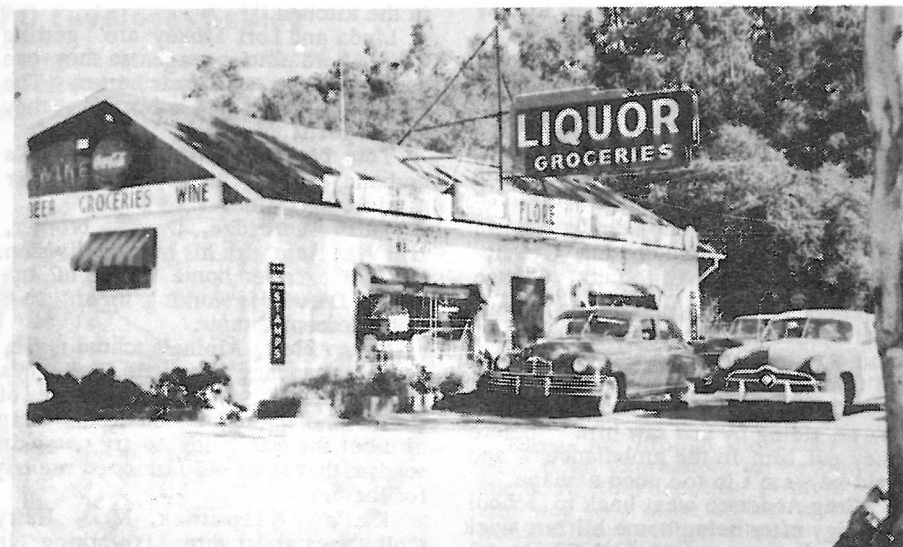
