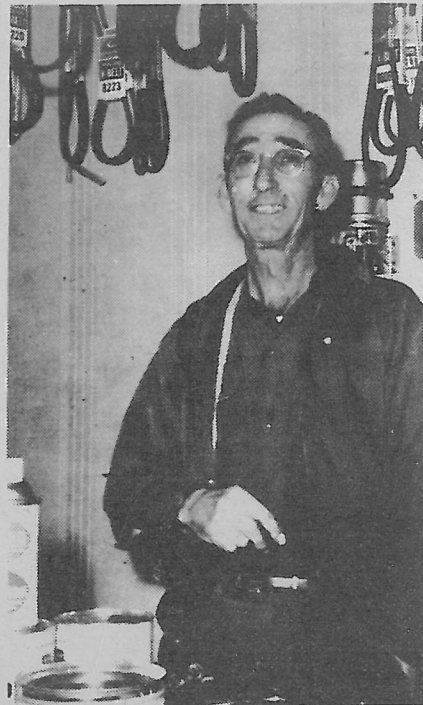

Army Chow Gripe OK

The age-old complaint of the GI about his chow carries some truth, it was disclosed at a postgraduate program of the American College of Cardiology meeting in La Jolla, with Dr. Wm. Dock, chief of medical services, Brooklyn Hospital in NY.

"This means" he declared, "it's a diet that may lead to heart trouble. Other armed services are in the same

boat. Being well fed is not always an advantage. Heart disease used to be a disease of the wealthy, but now that almost everyone can afford rich foods and animal fats, heart trouble is a feature of mass culture and an affluent society".

He scored the military diet of milk butter, eggs and fat beef, describing it as atherogenic, precursor of heart ailments.

Note- This applies to the general diet as well as the military, for heart and vascular troubles are on the increase along with cancer. Moral: eat more leans and greens, salads and fruits. 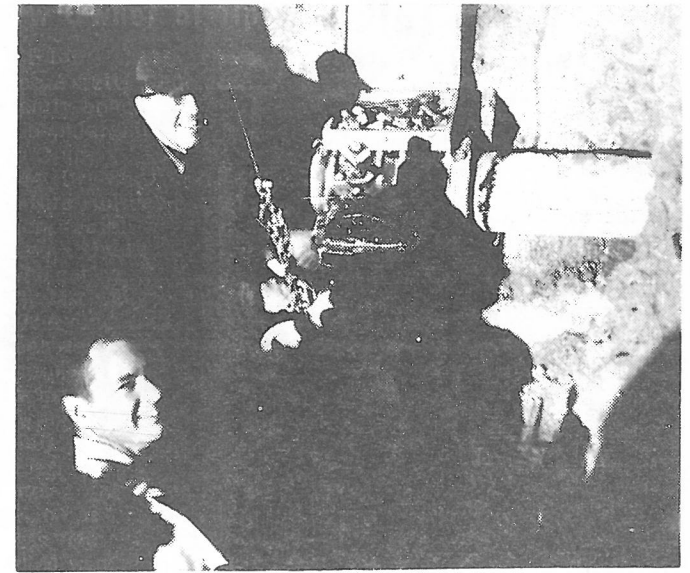
HERE IS THE first of new fire hydrants being installed around community by Rio SD MWD, in front of Bill Ingalls home, Victoria Dr. Bill was there as "sidewalk superintendent", says operation "was very interesting as I could not figure out how they could tap the 8" main, install the valve and not have to shut off the water".

He found out!

Here's how: First the saddle is bolted on, top of photo, then valve is bolted to it, and opened. Then the air drill is temporarily fastened to the valve, and the hole in main is cut. Water rushed into valve, then into the drill, when valve is shut and drill is unbolted. Final operation is fastening pipe, elbow, and finally at last the hydrant, above ground.

Lower man in photo is Jim Dell, operations, of Rio, with Glen Houk, of Lakeside District, which contracts partial installation. Helpers were Herb Barnett and Ray Menard.

Work on installing the other fire-



plugs will progress continuously till completed in several weeks. Insurance rates, it is believed, will be coming down shortly.

Ellen Hood came and got me

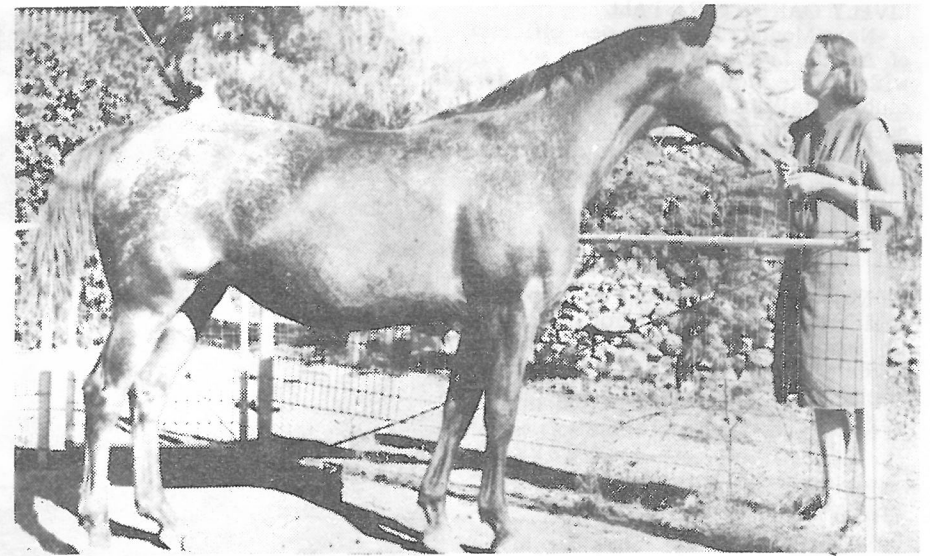


Mr. Magoo, favorite mount of Kenny Peters, son of Wilma Peters. She is 4-H Amigos Horse group instructor.

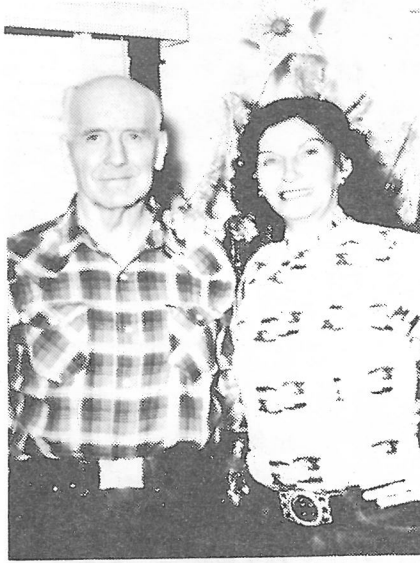
DOUBLE TALK

access road down to the plateau where we will put the ranch among the trees overlooking Peutz Valley and the ranges to the north".

Next step will be building a dam to make a lake where people can gather to picnic, go riding, fish and so forth. They plan on riding and hiking trails with recreation stops for camping, games and so on.

Dr. Merrill, a genial young medico, has owned this choice acreage for some time, has subscribed to the Sun to keep abreast of Alpine's progress, is now ready to carry forward the improvement which should take all of two years.

"We will drill a well, build the ranch house and have a caretaker there first, then proceed with the development", he added. "There are lots of folks who want such a place to go for recreation, riding and so on, and that's what we plan to do with this beautiful area".

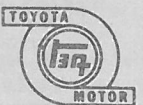
