EDITORIAL



Traffic Safety is Everybody's Business.

Last week's lead story was on six teenagers who barely escaped death in a wreck Saturday night when a young driver lost control, skidded on a curve, flipped, was totally wrecked.

Next morning, the LA-Sunday Examiner carried a valuable supplement from Ford Motors on "a positive view of good driving habits. It stressed the new operator, old or young, and driver education in the schools.

We appreciate this splendid piece, also our school, El Capitan, where our three daughters are becoming excellent operators under the experienced instruction of two fine former Alpiners and CHP officers, George Dowdy and Bud Homesley.

Introducing the supplement, Henry Ford, II said that safety in traffic is "not a job for one person, one com-

pany, or any single group. It must be a cooperative effort. Your cooperation, too, is essential as a citizen and as a driver. to support. nationwide uniform traffic regulations, signs, signals and markings; improved driver licensing; periodic vehicle inspection and better driver education for all new drivers."

We believe this should apply to old drivers and those with known heart ailments, also that repeating drunk drivers and lawbreakers should be deprived of the right to our highways.

States, schools, highway patrols and dealers are already doing a splendid job to improve conditions, but, as Amos E. Neyhart, who founded driver education, taught 20,000 instructors in 35 years, declares, "the only real 'youth problem' at the wheel is inexperience. that drivers trained. before taking the wheel have 50 to 60% fewer accidents and serious violations than untrained drivers."

He has six advice points; learn from an expert, don't hurry, drive seriously, practice all kinds of driving conditions and hazards, prepare carefully before attempting high speed and be a good motoring citizen, thoughtful, courteous, and considerate.

And lastly; "Squirrels" and show-offs as much as tell the world, "Look, I'm a baby. I haven't grown up yet". The expert driver proves he's expert by acting his age.

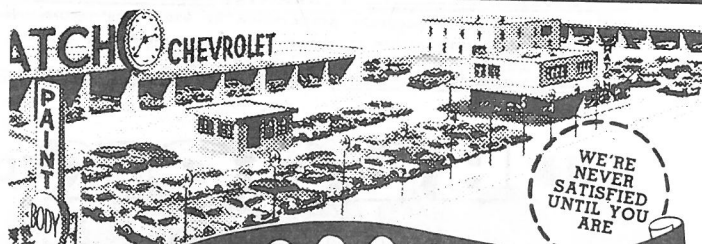

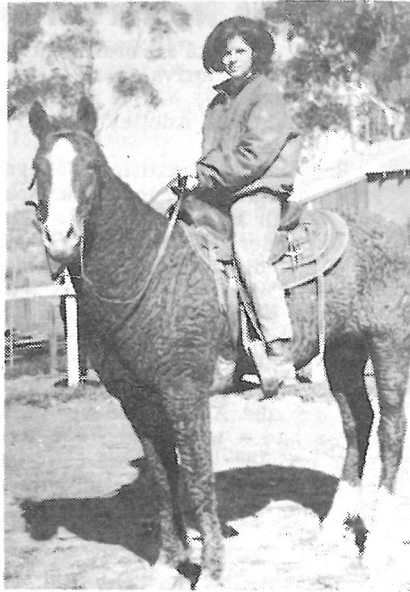

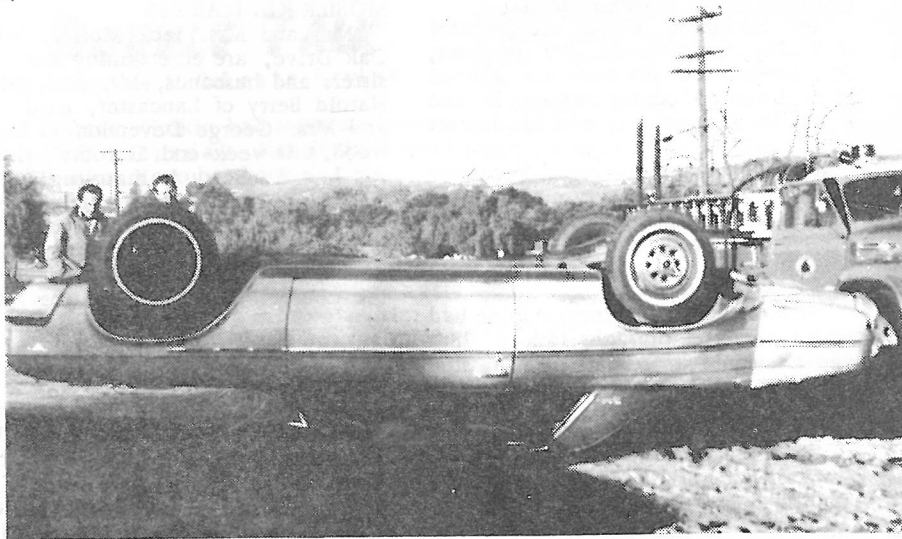
