EDITORIAL



Maybe We Should Scrutinize Sullins Case?

The recent acquittal of all five defendants in the longest criminal trial in the US district Court in Chicago, on federal charges of mail fraud, conspiracy and so on in connection with Krebiozen, a cancer drug, may point up the fact that the American people are inclined to use the remedial method of their own choice rather than orthodox medical means.

By the same token, the recent conviction in SD of Donald Sullins, Escondido, on a charge of manslaughter, which gave him a year in jail, a \$2,000 fine and five years probation, may be a parallel case. We visited him one recent Sunday at Viejas Honor Camp, met his mother, and friends.

The charge was based on his using

natural methods as suggested by his doctor instead of drugs and regular food. She was fasted, then returned to solid food. She had an enlarged heart. She died 10 days after the fast.

From all the evidence it is believed that Sullins, 42, a devoted son, a loving father, was grossly punished for using the means he chose, he had no motive to kill his child. The case had been closed for seven months, when someone reopened it, with the resulting unjust conviction and the ruin of his business and private life.

Presently the case is pending before the US Supreme Court and the many friends of this poor man hope that he will be acquitted of the preposterous charge that he let his child die. CI.

DOUBLE TALK

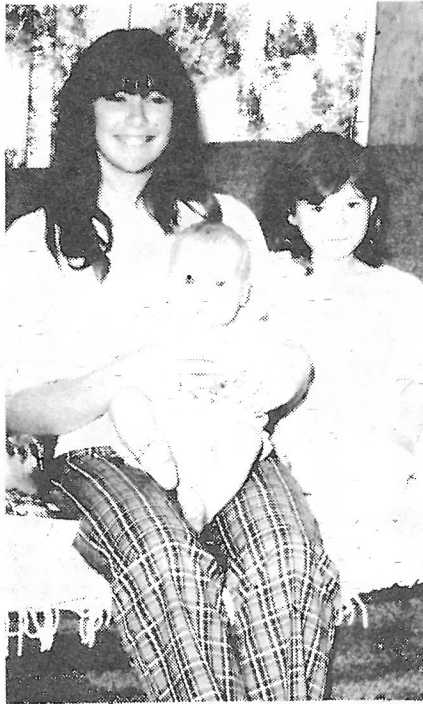

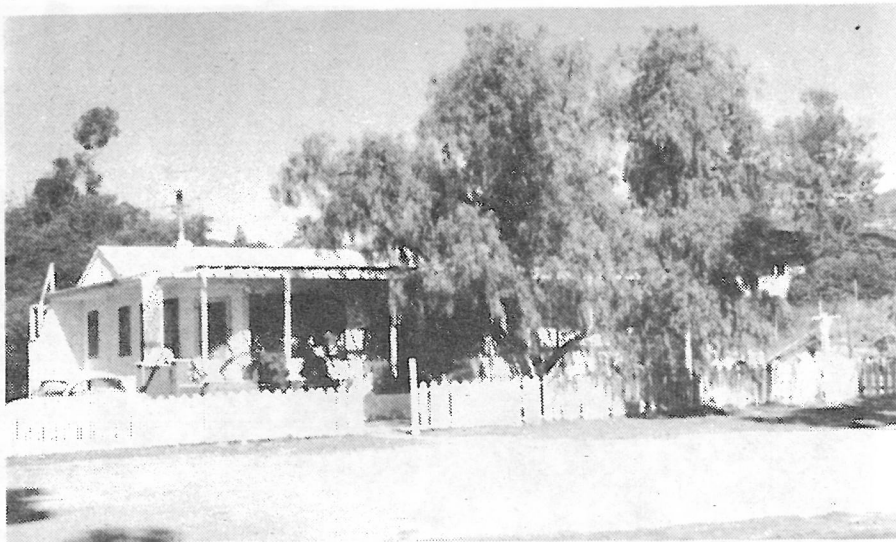

WEDELS WELCOME BOY

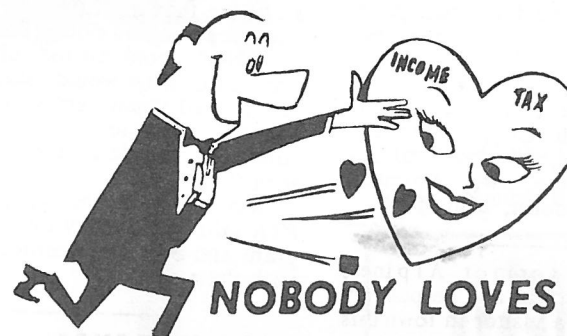

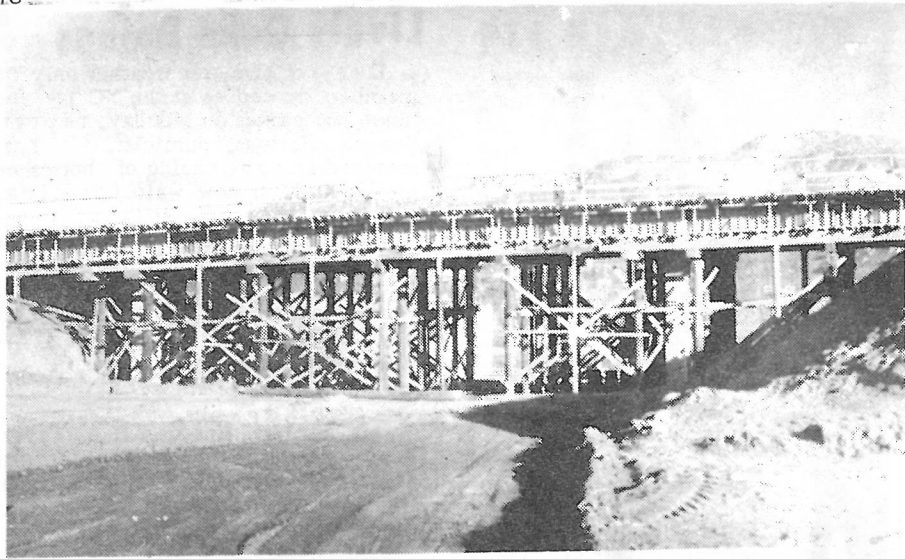

their children. Three later were born here in the old adobe home which the Conejo Indians helped to build from adobe mud and straw on the ranch.

In 1902 the dining room was started as they were known for their fine food and genial hospitality. As years went by each child played a part and carried on the popular resort.

In 1938 the dining room was closed to the public. It had gained the reputation far and wide as "The place of Good Eats", and real hospitality. In 1941 the cottages were remodeled for house-keeping. Today most have all been

moved, torn down or burned, under control of the fire department.

In 1950 the place was leased for seven years to Mr. and Mrs. Marcus Schaeffer, later sold to Kenneth Richey and wife of SD. The remaining nine cabins still stand, continue to be operated by the Richeys.

Members of the Walker family still live in the SD area; Ralph, of Ramona, who once drove the 4-horse stagecoach from Lakeside to Cuyamaca; Lucile, (now Mrs. M.J. Schwartz, of SD) Nean Jordan, of Alpine; Dorothy, (Mrs. A.J. Markley of SD and Alpine); Donald of Grossmont, a plumbing contractor and booster for Hwy 80, and Douglas, who today remains on the ranch where he has spent his life. F.B. Walker, jr., passed on last August in Santee.

Note- We are grateful to Dorothy for this data and the photo, and will always remember the many happy hours spent in the famed old dining room where we danced and visited among the folks who lived hereabouts, back in 1937 when we first came to this beautiful area.- CI
