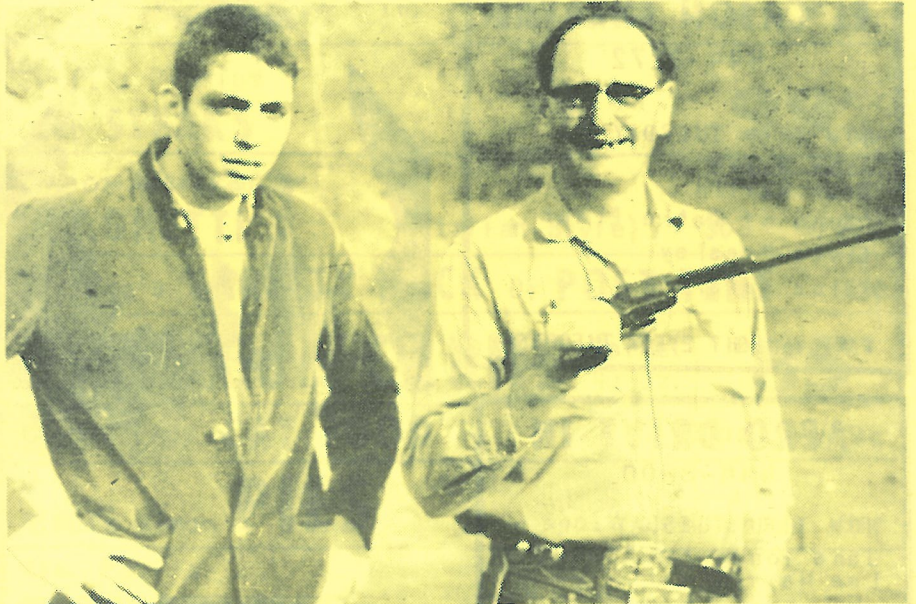
Escapes in War but Gets Shot Here!

Science Foresees A Vegetarian World!

This may sound fantastic, but in 1945 just before we dropped the bomb and stopped the war, fantastic was a feeble word to describe that awful weapon.

The other day Dr. Ulma Doyle Register, associate professor of biochemistry at Loma Linda University, told the La Mesa Woman's Club some fantastic ideas about our future living and eating habits.

He foresaw a population double in 40 years and in 700 years people will be standing shoulder to shoulder with 16 billions on the planet by 2050 when everyone will have to accept vegetarianism.

The speaker quoted Dr. James Bonner of California Institute of Technology who says that "by 2050 all food will go down the throats of hungry people who won't be able to afford the luxury of feeding pets or even zoo animals".

The doctor, a native Louisianan, has a master of science degree from Vanderbilt University and his doctorate from the University of Wisconsin. He said "every time the clock ticks, there's another hungry mouth to feed, and food production is lagging behind population increase."

He described how nutritionists are trying to solve the world food problems 90% of the Far East's teeming millions are undernourished-- by obtaining protein from leaves, algae and fish proteins, developing yeasts from wood and ammonia.

He forecasts less use of milk and meat, since 453 pounds of soy beans can be produced on an acre, compared with .37 pounds of pork, 62 pounds of milk and 220 pounds of potatoes.

"We may not like the taste of the diet we eat by 2050", Dr. Register stated, "but we'll be healthier for it".

He told of a recent 4-week study with mice, the relation of diet to the craving of alcohol. Group 1, with its poor American diet of sweet rolls, doughnuts and coffee, hamburgers, coke and pie for lunch; meat balls and spaghetti for dinner, followed by a midnight snack, hankered for alcohol three times as much as the other two groups on vegetarian foods!

Perhaps it might be enlightening, and profitable, to research on topic of vegetarianism; some of us will be around at the start of this way of live. -CI

Alpine's Lively Oaks Club joined the Chamber of Commerce en masse last week making a record for the Chamber.

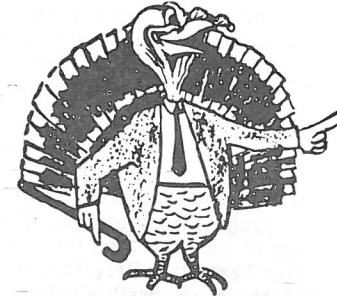

REAGAN SPEAKS TONIGHT

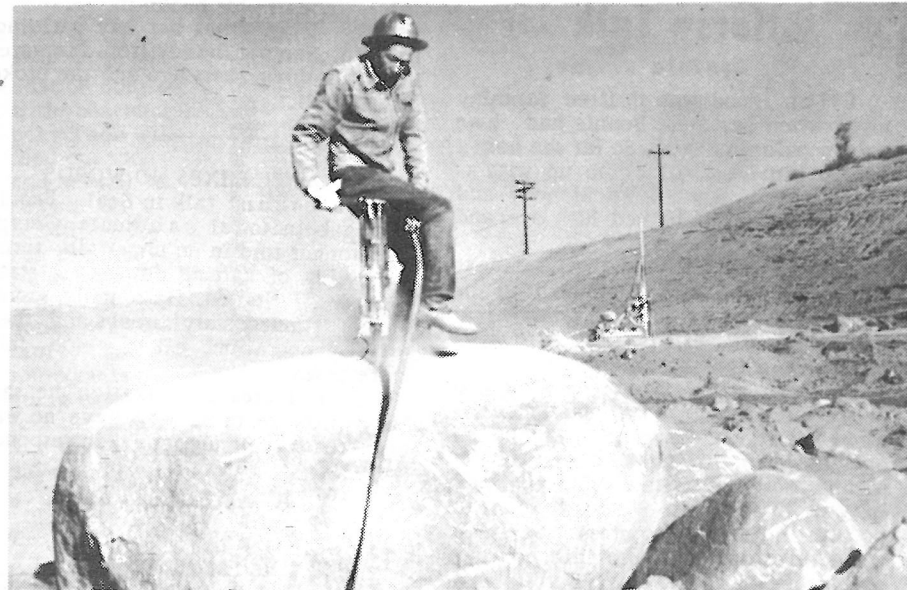

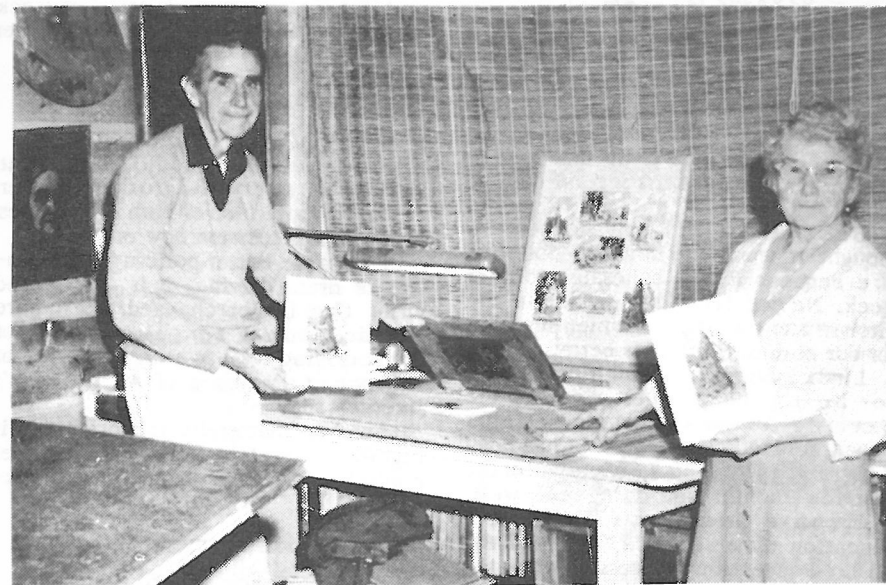

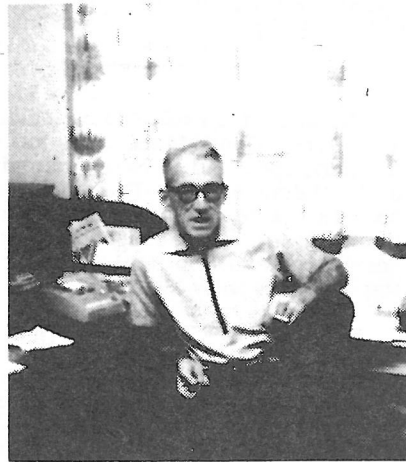

Their son Mike, recently here on leave, was their right hand man in the shop.

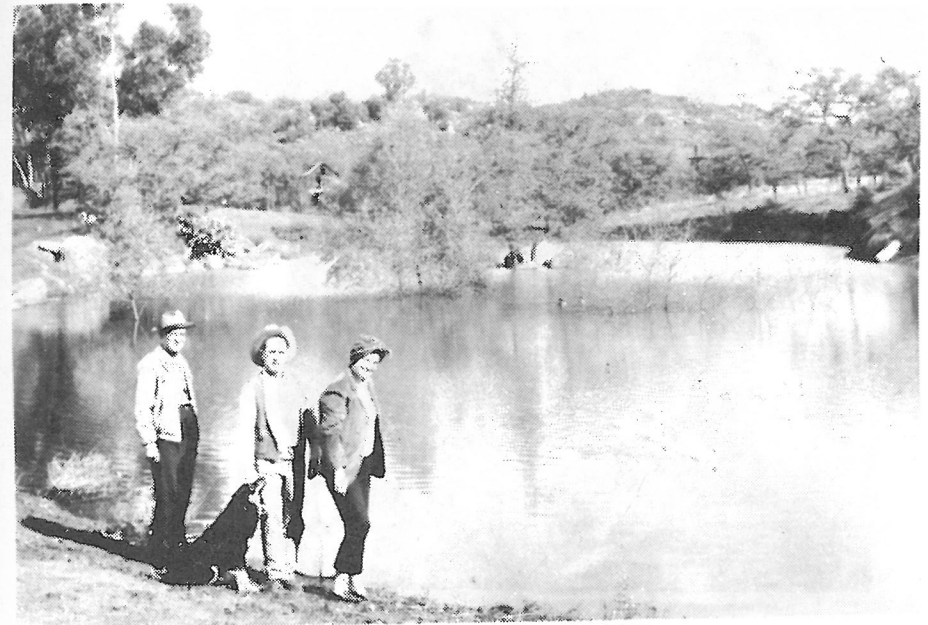

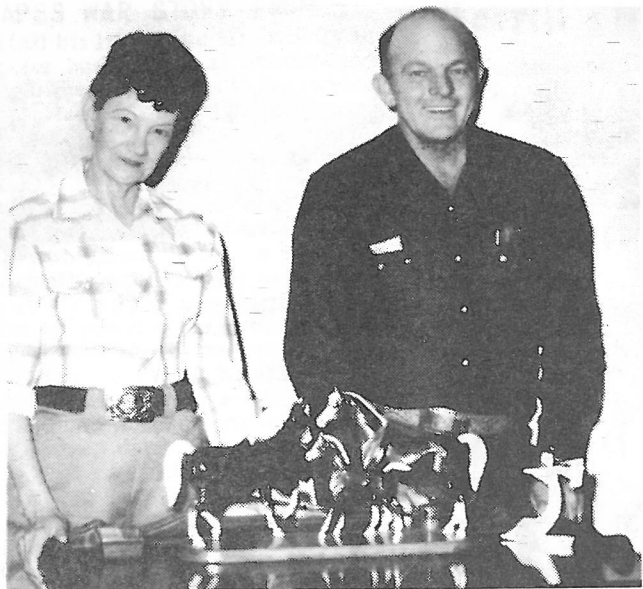

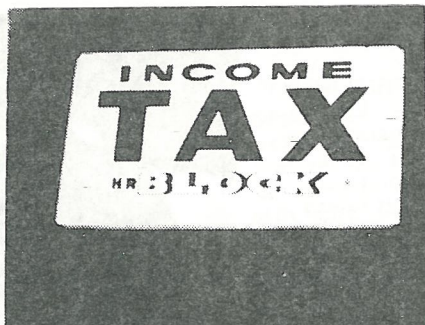
