## Save Another Life!

Sunday Alpine's Fire Department Volunteers are credited with saving the life of Pam Boardman, 5, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Boardman, 1318 Alpine Heights Road. She had been ill with the flu, had a high fever and was lying on the floor when she started to choke and turn blue. Mrs. Boardman called the Fire Department who rushed there with the resuscitator and administered oxygen till the ambulance arrived.

"The fast action of the volunteers probably saved her life" says Mrs. Boardman, "and we are so grateful to them". Pam was brought home from Heartland Hospital Wednesday feeling much better.

### Firemen Finish Course

Two local men, Mace J. Bratt, Tavern Road, and George C. Brant, Victoria Dr., have just completed the two day radiological meter operators course given by Civil Defense.

The monthly course is presented at the County Civil Defense Center, and instruction includes discussion of nuclear weapons, radioactive fallout, protection from the effects, how radiation affects living tissue and how it can be measured by instruments.

Each graduate is qualified for assignment to one of the Unified SD County Civil Defense Organization's 203 radiological monitoring stations.

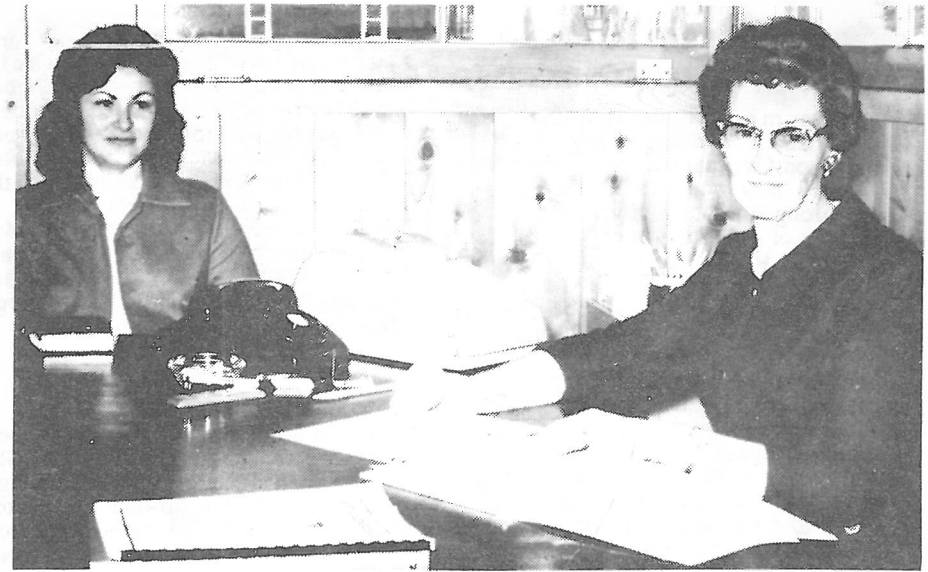

### CATERS LOSE DOG

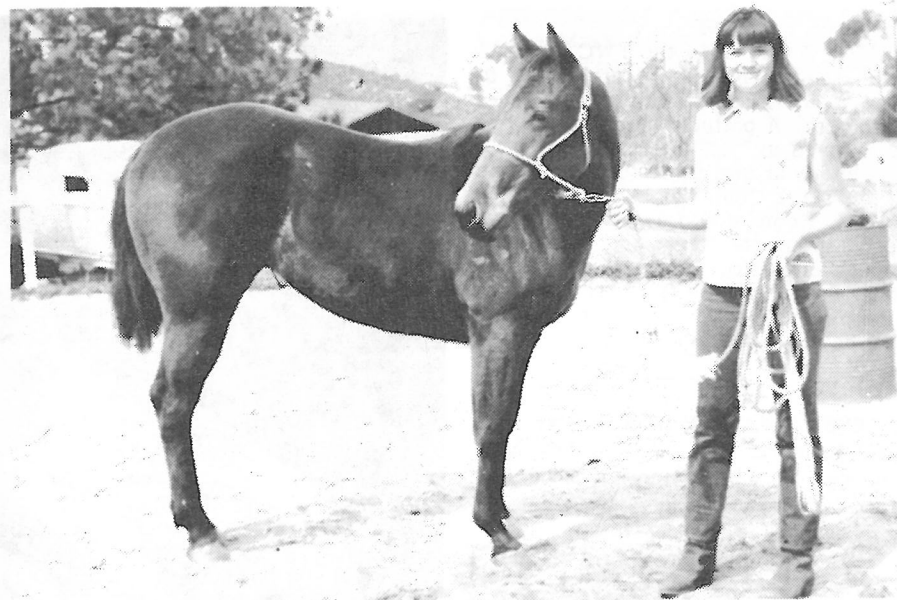

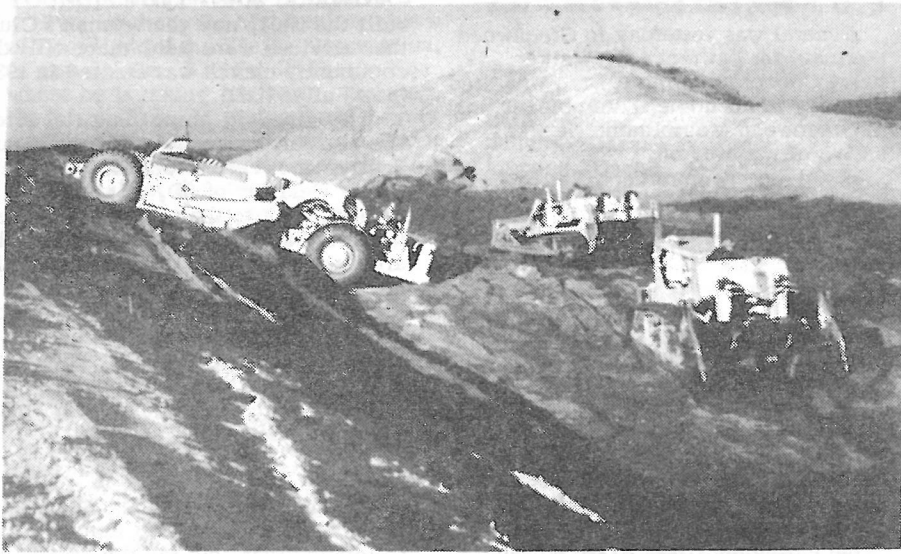
