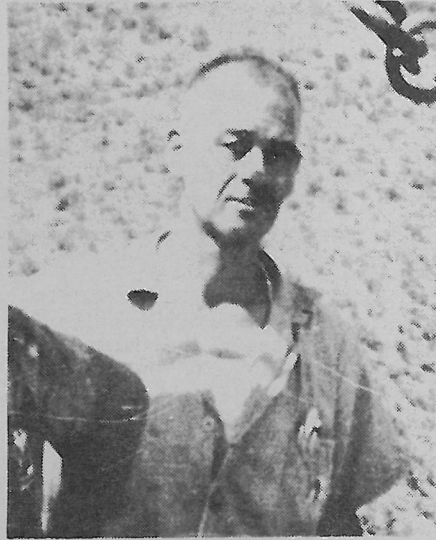

EDITORIAL

What Should We Name Hwy 80 Route?

This is almost a second part to the editorial in last issue on what is Alpine doing about the impending changes when the freeway, Interstate 8, is opened.

There is another angle to this important change; what should we call Old Hwy 80, which will become a major county road when Interstate 8

is open.

Envisioning this problem, the Sun several years ago got out a petition to change Hwy 80 to Alpine Blvd. from El Cajon to the Willows, when the freeway delegates it to a mere county road. But the majority scoffed at the idea, saying it was too far in the future.

If progress, street numbers, house numbers, zoning, water, sewage, parks and parking are all too far in the future for immediate contemplation, then how can a community meet the challenges of progress?

The aggressive new president of the chamber of commerce, Fred Rushing, has seen the light, formed a committee to come up with a name for Old 80, and said "The public is invited to the next meeting on Wednesday, April 20, when this important question will be discussed".

In the interest of Alpine publicity, there obviously could be no more appropriate name than Alpine Blvd., although it might not be in keeping with the exact meaning of boulevard, it could do a lot of good for Alpine, and that is what we desire. -CI
