ATOMIC SHOW WAS HERE

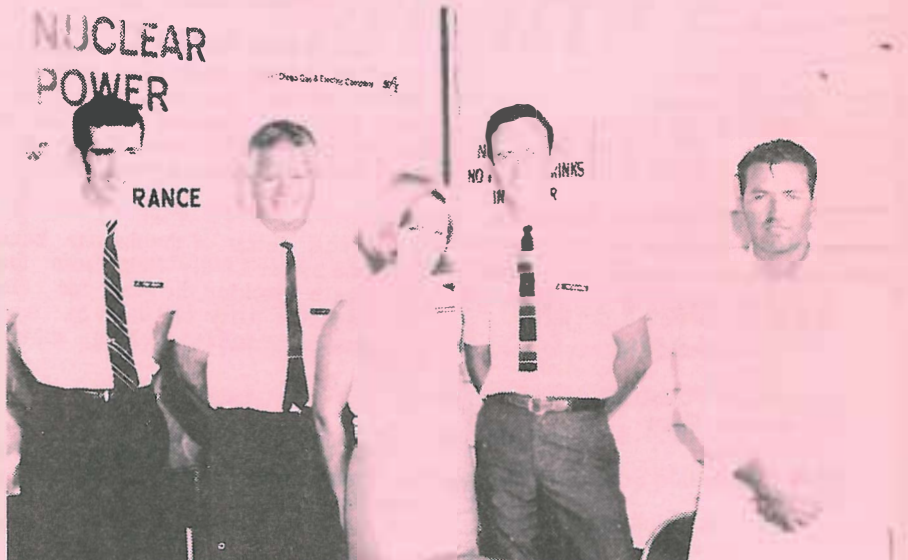

The Lively Oaks had a letter from Mr. & Mrs. Carl Strout telling them that he had undergone a successful operation and hopes for an early return to club activities.

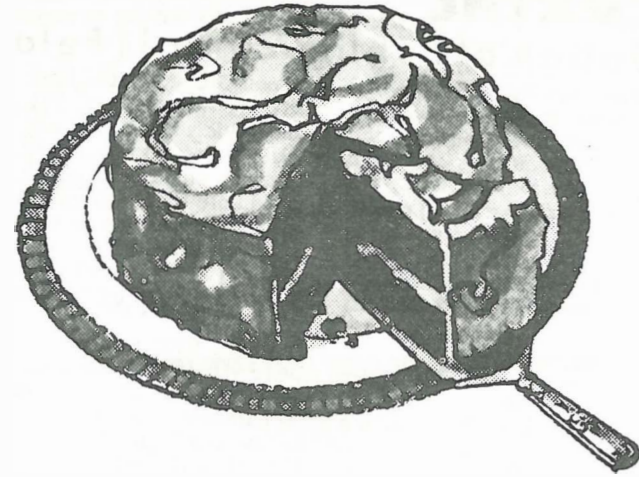

Fluoridation of Public Water is Felony!

Over 10 years ago San Diegans had 18 months of public water fluoridation. Then the electorate had it put on the ballot by referendum. Voters rejected it.

Now the county board of public health wants the SD City Council to restore it, and hopes that the water agencies will join in. But councilmen are on record as being opposed to this unless the electorate acts. Helix directors are opposed, also.

Supporters across the nation claim it builds strong teeth in the young, prevents bone degeneration in the aged. Opponents claim mainly they do not want drugs against their religious or health beliefs. Science has not proved that fluorine could not produce bad side-effects, as yet unknown.

Lemon Grove, in the June issue, calls it folly, quotes "Sec. 374 of the state code which states that any person who wilfully poisons any spring, well, or reservoir of water is guilty of a felony, punishable by confinement in a state prison for from one to 10 years.

"Sec. 182 makes any concert or persons (two or more) in reference to the commission of a felony, a conspiracy.

"Sec. 2703 sets out poisons: A-Deadly poisons: B-Cyanides and their preparations. C-Fluorides and their preparations, (soluble in water)" "Both in law and logic" Prevost writes, "any city council violates those two codes by participation in the foregoing. We find no exemptions to allow politicians or others to order poisoning of public water".

Recently a brewer that claims "It's the water", tried to capitalize on fluoride by adding it to his beer, but quickly found his big ad campaign stopped and himself in court. A large fine was assessed for putting a poisonous substance in the beer. The US Public Health Service has dubbed sodium fluoride a "mineral nutrient", when added to public water!

If you want to study this problem, get the startling book "A Struggle with Titans" by G. L. Waldbott, M.D. (Carlton Press, 84 Fifth Ave. NYC 11). It will open your eyes and vex you to think that big business and politicians have put over on the people of this country!-CI

POP WARNER GAMES TO START

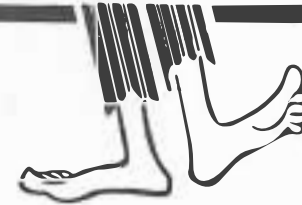

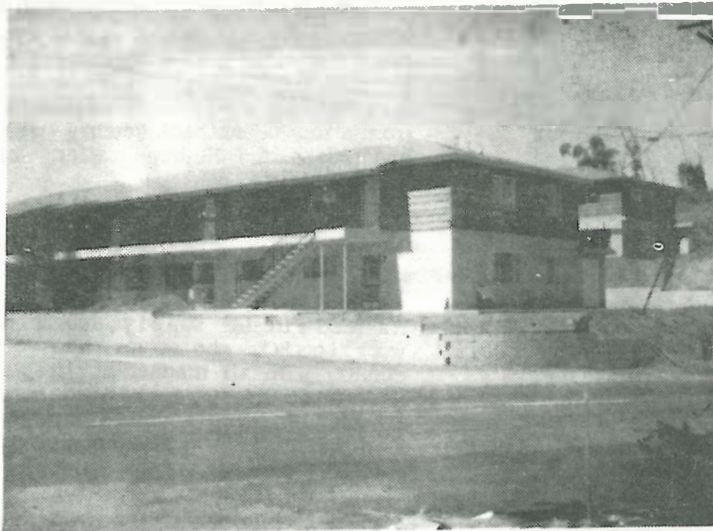
