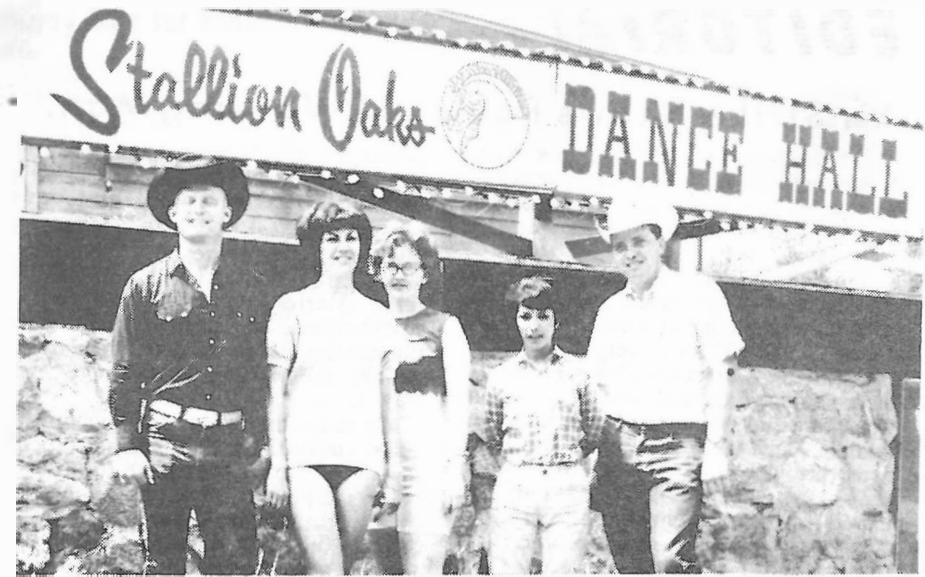
LOWER SEWER TAX HERE

A reduction of 1.3¢ from \$1.43 to \$1.34 has been made in the Alpine Sanitation District for this year the county announces. The operating budget is \$13,412, including a \$7,310 item for the sanitation plant here. Appropriations are \$1,942 higher than the 1965-66 figure, but due to a large fund balance and increased revenue, the decrease is obtained.

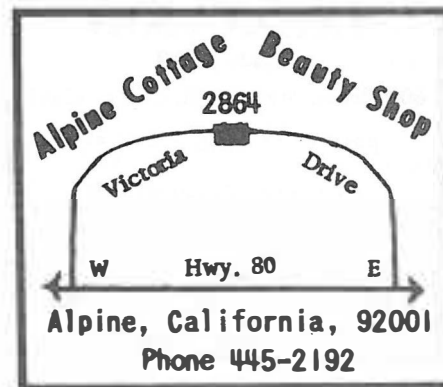
"We need some aides as there is a lot of work to launching this project", say the Sortinos, "we have uniforms for 30, but needed only 25 boys, so we are all set".

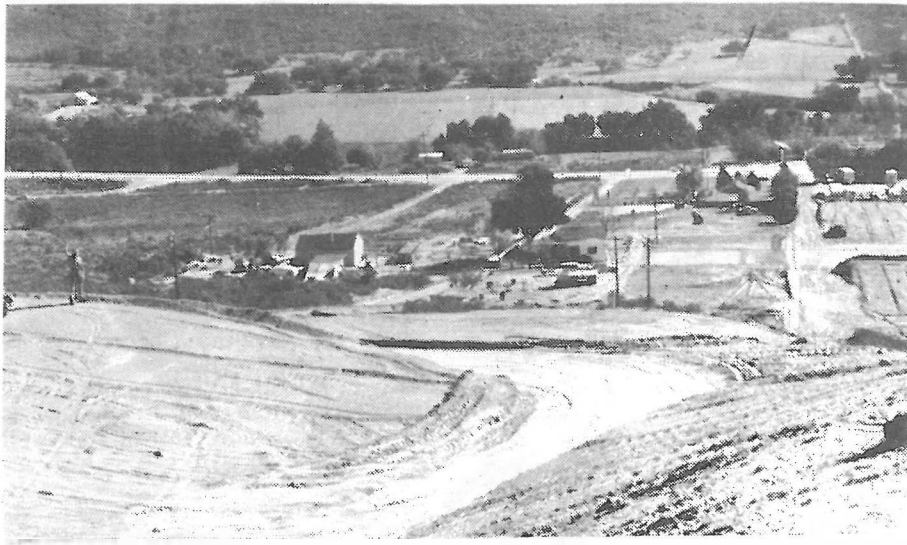

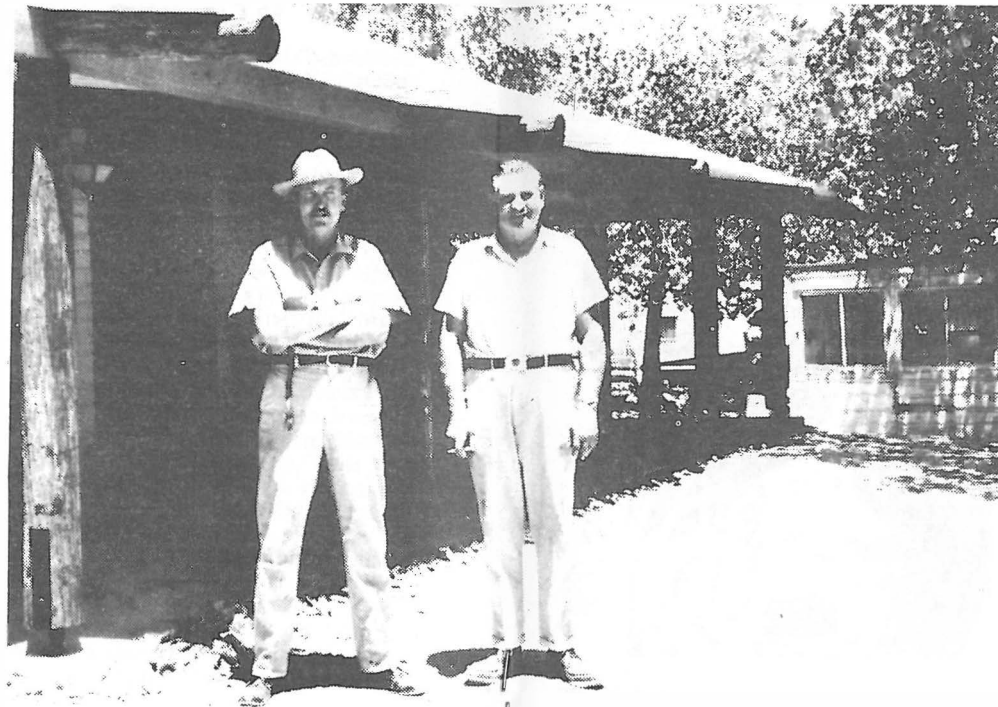

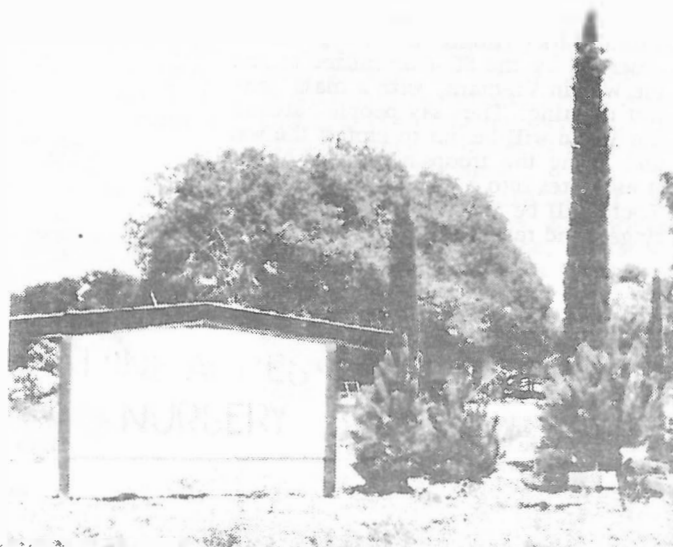

MEET TO END VIETNAM WAR

Tomorrow in the organ pavillion at Balboa Park (Hiroshima Day) will be observed by the SD Committee to End the War in Vietnam, with a mass protest meeting. They say people around the world will be out to protest the war and "bring the troops home now before it escalates into a nuclear holocaust." There will be prominent speakers, folk singers and readings.

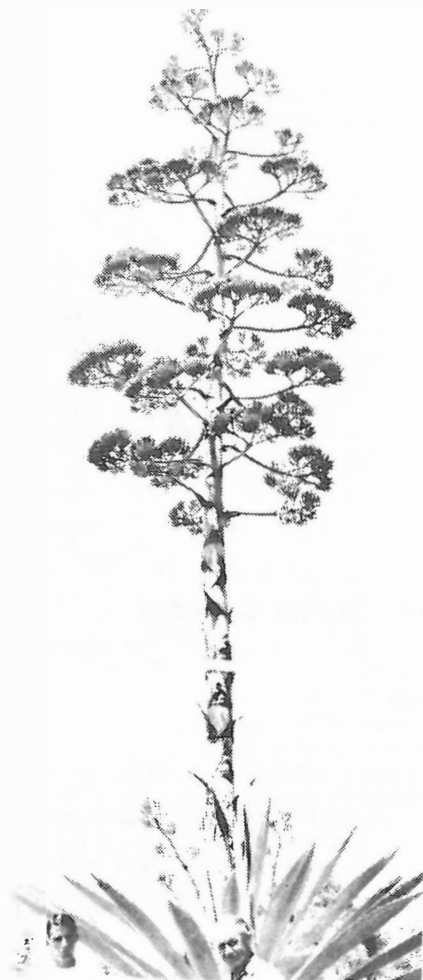

"The entire digestive track is acted on favorably by garlic. It tends to detoxify the entire organism, with special influence upon the heart, blood vessels and blood pressure, especially in the aged. 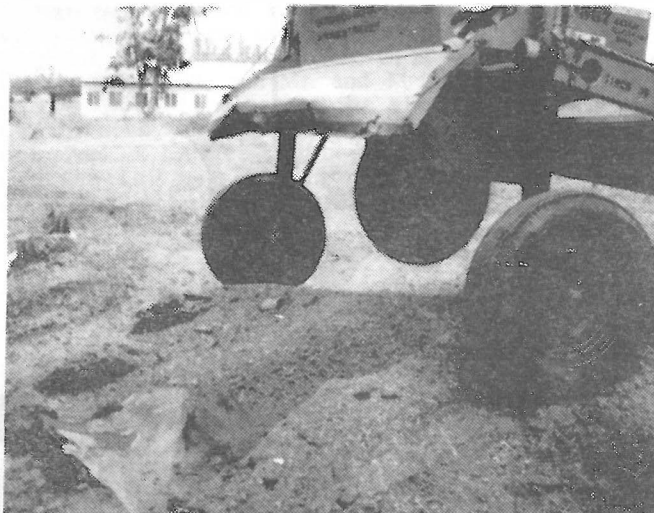
