



LOW TAXES

A small but interested audience was in attendance at the Town Council meeting Friday night in Fuller Hall when W. H. Thompson, chief, realty division, county assessor's office, gave an enlightening discourse on why valuation here is so high. President Ben Polak was in the chair. No business session was held as the entire evening was devoted to this most interesting subject.

Briefly Thompson pointed out, with explanations, that county spending makes taxes-- in short, if money was not needed for things, assessments could be lower-- so start at the spending source to lower taxes. "If you could do that" he said, "you've got your tax problem licked".

Note- Alpine taxes will be high for some gime due to paying off the water district, the rate being \$2.54, metro district, .31 and county water authority .21, plus the high county rate of \$2.38 which includes the big item for welfare, supporting people that should be working, and illegitimate children. -Ed.


Mrs. Vera Duggan bought a 12 year old mare for her five year old daughter DeeDee. They were looking for a nice gentle horse and we hope this works out for her.


NO BURNING SEASON IS HERE

Economy up Says Security

M. Ross Malletee, manager, Alpine Branch, Security First National Bank, feports that their research office shows Southland's economic activity advanced to an all-time high during July, breaking free of a 2-month decline.

Greatest strength was in department stores, he said, but bank debits eased slighty, and both realty and building continued to decline. Employment was up. Southland metropolitan unemployaveraged 4.6% of the local labor force in June while the national average was 4.0%, down 4.7% from a year ago.
