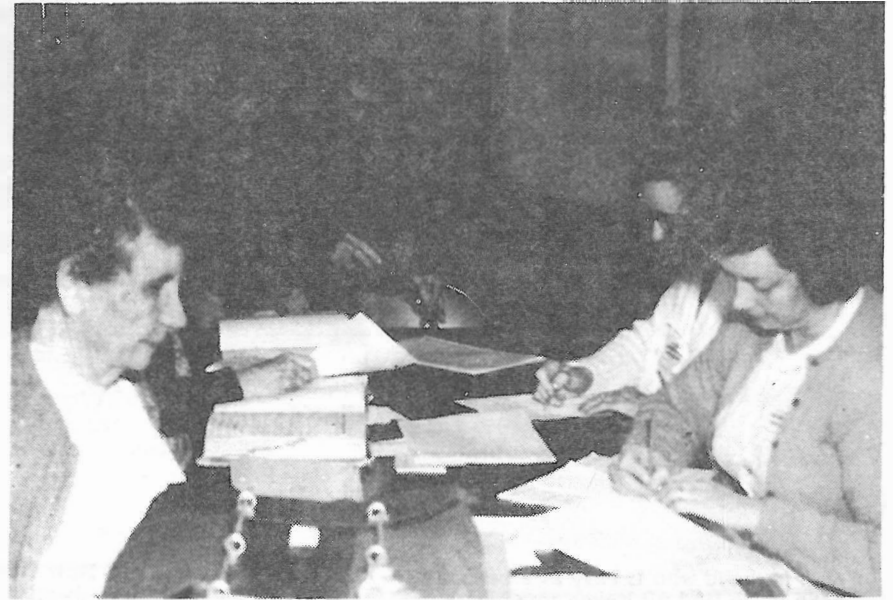

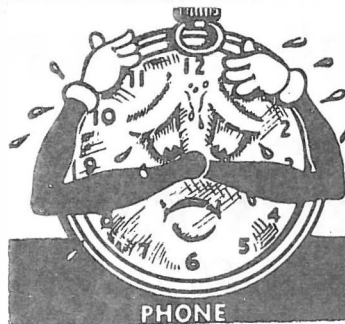

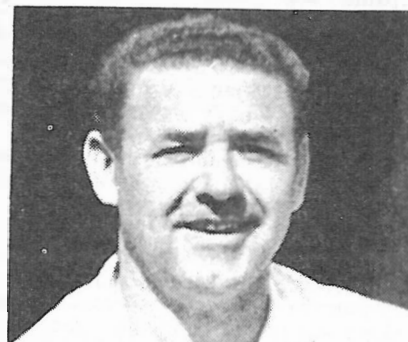
BARBER SHOP STORY From 1
