## Chamber's Beautification Committee Busy.

Two spanking newly-painted litter cans have been placed in the downtown section in hopes that they will help remind motorists that state law gives each person the right to do something about careless travelers using local roads for dumping grounds-- you can make a "citizen's arrest" if you catch someone thus breaking the law.

Perhaps not all are aware of the state code against littering any road, highway or right-of-way. So, should you not care to accost the person dumping trash, and make the "arrest", you may call the sheriff or the CHP and give the car number and location, and

name or the litterer, if known.

The only catch is that you must appear as a witness against the violator. Otherwise officials will not act upon your complaint.

The chamber's beautification committee plans on adding three new litter cans shortly bearing the words "Travel Trash", placed around Alpine in those areas which have been favorite disposal spots for papers, bottles and cans which have contributed to keep the landscape "decorated" with small but unsightly trash piles.

We think this is a splendid idea but does it not seem that the wellbred person and those who have had careful home training, are not guilty of this boorish custom of tossing everything out the window as they pass through the lovely countryside.

Yes, let's keep America beautiful, and try to raise our people not to be "ugly" Americans by littering our fine highways! -CI

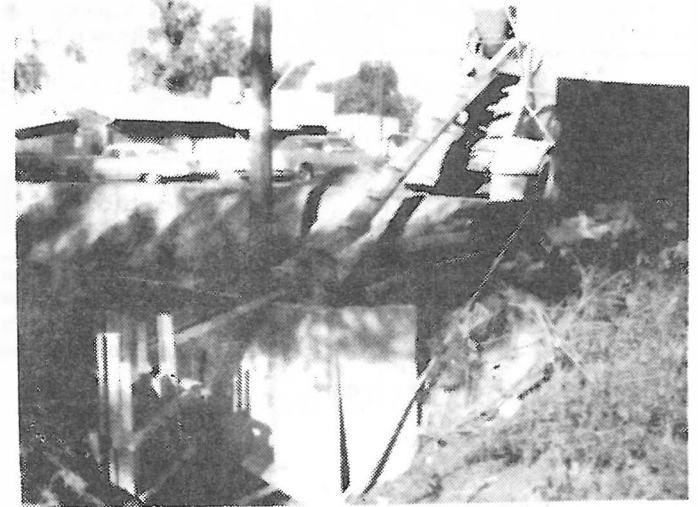

## BUILDING COSTLY FLOOD CONTROL HERE


