Lutz leases to Mobil

A 30-year lease for a choice corner of 130' on Hwy 80, with about the same on Tavern Road on the north side of 80, which leads to the interchange, was announced by the owner, Harold Lutz, who operates Lutz's Garage, adjacent at 1690 Hwy 80.

The deal was made with Gene Bolar, real estate representative of the Mobil Oil Co. "This will be the most beautiful Mobil station in all California" he claims. Negotiations have been pending for months in order to get the deal complete.

Lutherans win permit

**TALKS ON WAR TONIGHT**

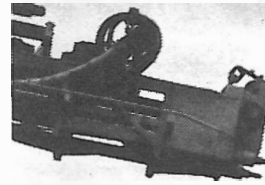

EDITORIAL

Transit tax would shrink take-home pay!

It has been said that Democracy is slowly killing itself. There is no doubt but that Americans, the taxpayers, are beginning to realize that this country is slowly losing its freedoms.

Now come tax prospectors in Sacramento-- also in the counties-- looking everywhere for new ways to tax the people. As you perhaps know, proposals have been introduced in the Legislature to levy added taxes primarily to finance mass transit, chiefly in the big cities. This is of interest to almost everyone as only a few do not own cars.

They are eyeing two proposals, both quite similar, which have aroused the Auto Club of Southern California, a watchdog for the motorist which has been helping car owners for 60 years. One idea is to add a 4% tax on gasoline. It would net over a million. The other calls for a 1¢ a gallon increase in the gas tax, amounting to around \$75 million. The club is making a mail

poll on the idea.

Proponents argue that transit would remove cars from the highways: that it would benefit motorists; that it would reduce smog; therefore drivers should pay for mass transit.

But engineering studies in La show that the proposed rail transit lines would carry less than 1½% of the daily trips. From the club's careful analysis it appears that it would yield almost no benefits to car owners, nor have much effect on smog, and that no special tax should be imposed on vehicle operation, which is already heavily taxed.

Presently we pay 11¢ per gallon tax, state and federal, which is more than 33% on the cheapest gas. It has been said that when taxes get to eating 25% of your money, there is grave danger ahead.

As some astute observers have already exclaimed, "Perhaps it is time for another Boston Tea Party! Just how far will the squeeze go till the people really get disturbed?" -CI

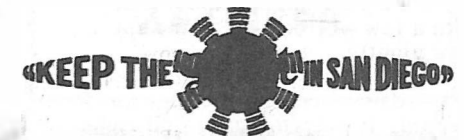

CARE OF THE BODY

BE KIND TO YOUR KIDNEYS
 Smoking affects the kidneys adversely in at least two ways. It tends to constrict small blood vessels and it reduces the functional efficiency of the lungs. Alcohol is another offender that irritates and destroys the kidney cells. The urine itself clearly indicates cell breakdown seen under a microscope in the form of particles and substances.
